Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

NEW PROJECTS

COCHRAN STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 14/15 PROJECT

• Starting Monday, April 16 Cochran Street will be closed from Sharp to Mallon Avenue. Boone Avenue will remain open.

This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster.

This is a \$3.4 million project funded with state funds.

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WAY/RIVERSIDE DRIVE PHASE 2B

 Work on this project will start Monday, April 16. Trent Avenue will be closed from Hamilton to Napa Street for approximately four months. Access to businesses and the Iron Bridge Campus will be maintained.

This project constructs a new road from Erie to Perry Street including a new roundabout at Trent Avenue and Perry Street.

The \$2.5 million dollar project is funded with local, state and federal funds.

WELLESLEY AVENUE FROM DIVISION TO NEVADA STREET

 Monday, April 16 the Street Department will start a grind and overlay project on Wellesley Avenue. The project will close Wellesley Avenue between Division and Nevada Street.

COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

ADAMS STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 24 PROJECT

Here's how this work affects **traffic and parking** in the area:

- Adams Street between First and Sprague Avenue is reduced to one lane.
- First Avenue is reduced to one lane eastbound in the furthest south lane.
- Sprague Avenue is closed to all westbound traffic from Jefferson to Cedar. Eastbound traffic is permitted on Sprague Ave from Adams to Jefferson (within the restricted area similar to Phase 1) for local residents and KHQ employees only.
- Eastbound Riverside will remain closed from Cedar to Jefferson Street

This project will construct a 2.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

The \$16.3 million project is funded with City Utility funds.

CEDAR STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 23 CONTROL FACILITY PROJECT

Cedar Street is closed south of Bridge Lane to Summit Pkwy.

This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. This project will construct a 38,000 gallon storage tank and a 13,000 gallon storage tank.

This is a \$1.5 million project.

I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

 Work continues on the East Riverside CSO tanks. Riverside Avenue remains closed between Lee Street Access to local businesses and residences should remain intact during this period.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.5 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

LIBERTY PARK, COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK 33-1

 Work continues with traffic impacts on 5th Avenue from Arthur to Perry and Denver and Celesta for work on the CSO tank. This work is to construct a 2 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank that is part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe will be closed to traffic.
 - Traffic on Lincoln Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main is directed southbound; drivers are required to go east or west at Main. Lincoln is the detour for traffic coming from the River Park Square garage and Spokane Falls through at least mid-2018.
 - Access to the Lincoln Street entrance to the River Park Square parking garage is open.

Crews continue to build the walls for the CSO tank. On the east end of the jobsite, near city hall, crews will intermittently stop traffic to allow concrete trucks in and out of the jobsite, as well as the west side of the jobsite on pour days. The next pour days are scheduled for Thursday, April 12, Wednesday, April 18 and Thursday, April 19.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

TJ MEENACH COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK, CSO I-03

 Construction on this CSO tank, located to the east of TJ Meenach Drive, below Northwest Boulevard, continues. Grace Avenue from Alberta to Cochran Street remains closed.

This project will construct a 1.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

This is an \$8 million project.

EVENTS

MARCH FOR SCIENCE

Saturday, April 14 from 12 to 3 p.m. the March for Science event will close the following streets;

- Spokane Falls Boulevard between Washington and Wall Street
- o Stevens Street between North River Drive and Riverside Avenue
- o Wall Street between Riverside Avenue and Spokane Falls Boulevard
- Riverside Avenue between Wall and Stevens Street

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- There will be rolling closures on Freya Street between Olive and Springfield Avenue until 4/13/18.
- There will be periodic closures of Ruby Street between Cora and Nora until 4/13/18.
- The northern lane of 2rd Avenue will be closed between Spokane and Sherman Street until 4/13/18.
- Portions of the sidewalk and parking lane will be closed on Empire Avenue from Division to Cincinnati Street until 4/13/18.
- The south side of Mallon Avenue between Lincoln and Post will remain closed until 4/16/18.
- There will be alternating lane closures on Haven Street between Heroy and Rich Avenue until 4/16/18.
- There will be a partial closure of 6th Avenue between Cannon and Elm Street from 4/16/18 to 4/18/18.
- The northwest corner of Main and Howard Street will be closed until 4/19/18.
- Washington Street will be reduced to one lane between Riverside and Main Avenue until 4/20/18.
- The center lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard will be closed near Howard Street until 4/20/18.
- There will be multiple closures along Post Street between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Main Avenue from 4/16/18 to 4/20/18.
- The eastern northbound lane and sidewalk of Lincoln Street will be closed between Broadway and Mallon until 4/27/18.
- The sidewalk and parking lane on Euclid Avenue from Stone to Altamont Street will be closed until 4/30/18.
- Portions of the sidewalk at Main Avenue and Post Street will be closed until 5/4/18.
- The two northern travel lanes of Main Avenue between Wall and Stevens Street will be closed until 5/11/18 during the hours of 7 a.m. 3 p.m.
- The alley west of Howard between Spokane Falls and Main will be closed for work on the M until 5/31/2018.

- The southside of Riverside Avenue will be closed between Lincoln and Post Street until 6/9/18.
- There will be obstruction at the northwest corner of 17th Ave and Mt Vernon until 12/13/18.
- The north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard at Post will be closed until 5/30/19.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

ADA CURB RAMPS

- The ADA curb ramp project will continue working in District 1 and start working in District 3. Next week, crews will be working in the following areas;
 - Heroy Avenue and Regal Street
 - o Hoffman Avenue and Regal Street
 - Wellesley Avenue and Regal Street
 - Maxwell Avenue and Cedar Street
 - o Wabash
 - o Samson
 - o **Everett**

UNIVERSITY DISTRICT PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

 Martin Luther King Jr. Way will be closed from Pine Street to Sherman Street for approximately four months starting Monday, April 16. Riverside Avenue between Sheridan and Grant Street remains closed to through traffic. Local access to businesses on this unimproved section of Riverside is being maintained by the contractor.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- North Bank: Fencing surrounds the Promenade of the North Bank, closing the Howard Street pedestrian bridges (including the blue bridge). Detour routes through the park take visitors either across the suspension bridges or the Washington Street Bridge. Parking Lot 2 will close for construction approximately April 30. The detour of the Centennial Trail will take visitors across Cataldo St. to travel between the Flour Mill and the Washington Street Bridge. Construction on the North Promenade is anticipated to be complete in fall 2018. An updated map is coming soon.
- Pavilion: Fencing is expanded around the Pavilion site. It is anticipated to be in place through summer 2019.
- Looff Carrousel: Avista will continue working in the center lane of Spokane Falls Blvd, possibly until mid-April. The north lane of Spokane Falls Blvd. is closed for site landscape work, lasting through the end of April. The sidewalk on the north side of Spokane Falls Blvd. between Stevens and Wall Street remains closed for Looff Carrousel construction,

and the site is fenced off. The project is scheduled to be completed spring 2018. Nearby, the South Howard St. Bridge - the pedestrian bridge north of the Rotary Fountain off Spokane Falls Blvd. at Howard – is completed but remains closed due to access routes until spring 2018.

STREET PROJECTS

MISSION AVENUE FROM DIVISION TO HAMILTON

 A project to improve the pavement on Mission Avenue between Division and Hamilton Street is underway. Work has switched to the eastbound lanes. The eastbound lanes have been closed, and eastbound traffic is detoured to Indiana Avenue. The westbound lanes have reopened.

This \$1.1 million project is paid for with federal and local dollars.

NORTH MONROE CORRIDOR PROJECT

- Work on this project has started!
 - Monroe Street is closed north of Montgomery to Chelan Avenue for construction. Monroe Street from Indiana Avenue/Northwest Boulevard to Montgomery Avenue remains OPEN!
 - Monroe Street is closed north of Euclid to Kiernan Avenue for construction.
 Monroe Street from Euclid to Grace Avenue remains OPEN!
 - o Both Cora and York Avenue are open to cross traffic!
 - Cora Avenue will be detoured to Alice Avenue on Monday, April 16.
 - York Avenue will be detoured to Grace Avenue on Monday, April 16 and Wednesday, April 18.

The Monroe project is approximately 16 blocks long and will be completed in four block segments. The segments not under construction will be open to local traffic. There will be two contractors working on this project each will be working on a four block segment so there will be a total of 8 blocks under construction at a time separated by 4 blocks open to traffic.

This project includes: new pavement, lane reconfiguration from five to three lanes, wider sidewalks, bump-outs, installation of High Performance Transit elements, upgraded street lighting, new pedestrian lighting and stormwater management.

Businesses are open, and signage will direct drivers to individual business locations. See www.monroeproject.com.

The \$6.5 million project is funded with federal, state and local funds.

STREET MAINTENANCE CURB RAMP PROJECT

 Crews are working on 17th Avenue between Perry Street and Cook Street. Drivers should expect traffic control in place and some delays.

STREET DEPARTMENT

Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

WATER DEPARTMENT

EUCLID AVENUE AND WELLINGTON PLACE

• The Water Department has closed the intersection of Euclid Avenue and Wellington Place to install a sewer main. The closure will last through Friday, April 13.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

DIVISION, BROWNE AND RUBY STREET RESURFACING

• WSDOT is resurfacing Division, Browne and Ruby Street from I-90 to Euclid Avenue. Starting Monday, April 16 crews will be working night hours between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.
