Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

ADAMS STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 24 PROJECT

Here's how this work affects traffic and parking in the area:

- Adams Street between 1st and Sprague Ave is reduced to one lane for KHQ access only.
- 1st Avenue from Walnut to Jefferson Street is closed. Local access only on 1st Ave is
 permitted east beyond Walnut for the specific businesses and residents located on 1st
 Ave between Walnut and Cedar. Local traffic may travel west on 1st Ave when leaving
 the area towards the Walnut detour route but will be forced to turn north on Walnut.
- For the safety of the construction crews as well as the public, thru traffic is not permitted through the intersection of 1st and Cedar but there will be pedestrian access.
- Sprague is closed to all westbound traffic from Jefferson to Cedar. Eastbound traffic is permitted on Sprague from Adams to Jefferson for local residents and KHQ employees.

This project will construct a 2.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

The \$16.3 million project is funded with City Utility funds.

COCHRAN STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 14/15 PROJECT

• Crews are working on A Street from Dean to Sinto Avenue.

This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster.

This is a \$3.4 million project funded with state funds.

I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

• Work continues on the East Riverside CSO tanks. Riverside Avenue remains closed between Lee Street and the alley between Lee and Crestline Street. Access to local businesses and residences should remain intact during this period.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.5 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

KENDALL YARDS COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 23 PROJECT AND CONTROL FACILITY

• Bridge Avenue is closed between Ash and Oak Street

This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. This project will construct a 38,000 gallon storage tank and a 13,000 gallon storage tank.

This is a \$1.5 million project.

LIBERTY PARK, COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK 33-1

- 5th Avenue remains closed between Perry and Arthur Street
- 3rd Avenue is reduced to one lane between Arthur and Liberty Park Place.

This work is to construct a 2 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank that is part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

PEACEFUL VALLEY COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 25 PROJECT

- Crews continue to work on CSO 25. The following streets are closed;
 - o Cedar Street from Main to Water Avenue
 - Water Avenue from Cedar to Ash Street
 - Main Avenue from Monroe to Cedar Street

This project will be completed in two phases. The project will result in new water, sanitary and storm sewer infrastructure. In addition, stormwater swales will be installed.

This project is funded with state funds.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe will be closed to traffic.
 - Traffic on Lincoln Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main is directed southbound; drivers are required to go east or west at Main. Lincoln is the detour for traffic coming from the River Park Square garage and Spokane Falls through at least mid-2018.
 - Access to the Lincoln Street entrance to the River Park Square parking garage is open.

Crews continue to build the walls for the CSO tank. On the east end of the jobsite, near city hall, crews will intermittently stop traffic to allow concrete trucks in and out of the jobsite, as well as the west side of the jobsite on pour days. The next wall pour days are scheduled for Friday, August 10 and Friday, August 17

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

TJ MEENACH COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK, CSO I-03

• Construction on this CSO tank, located to the east of TJ Meenach Drive, below Northwest Boulevard, continues. Grace Avenue from Alberta to Cochran Street is closed.

This project will construct a 1.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

This is an \$8 million project.

- The east lane of Washington between 2nd and Pacific and the south lane of Pacific between Washington and McClellan will be closed from 7/9/18 8/10/18.
- The right northbound lane of Division north of Magnesium and right southbound lane and sidewalk to Newport Hwy north of Country homes Blvd from 7/30/18-8/14/18.
- The south bound west lane of Stevens between 2nd and 3rd Avenue and the south lane of 3rd Avenue between Stevens and Pittsburg will be closed from 7/9/18 8/15/18.

- The right westbound lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard between Browne and Bernard will be closed from 8/13/18-8/17/18.

- The right southbound lane and sidewalk of Division Street will be closed at the corner of Wabash from 8/13/18-8/17/18.
- The northbound curb lane of Ash Street between 5-Mile Road and Cedar will be closed with flaggers from 8/8/18-8/21/18.
- Greene Street between Cleveland and Bridgeport and side streets: Bridgeport, Fairview and Cleveland will be closed from 7/24/18-9/1/18.
- The two eastbound lanes of Boone at Normandie will be closed from 8/6/18-9/3/18.
- The eastbound curb lane of Boone will be closed at Oak Street from 8/6/18-9/3/18.
- The two right side northbound lanes of Division/Fuby from North River Drive to Cataldo will be closed from 8/6/18-9/3/18.
- Alternating curb lanes of Francis will be closed between Elgin and G Street from 8/7/18 - 9/6/18.
- The eastbound lane of Mallon from Lincoln to Post will remain closed until 9/30/18.
- The sidewalks along the half block of 4th and Walnut will be closed from 7/16/18-10/12/18 for replacement.
- Full closures of Riverside Avenue between Grant and Sheridan and Sheridan between Sprauge and Riverside from 7/30/18-10/31/18.
- There will be obstruction at the northwest corner of 17th Ave and Mt Vernon until 12/13/18.
- The north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard at Post will be closed until 5/30/19.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

UNIVERSITY DISTRICT PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

• Martin Luther King Jr. Way is closed from Pine to Sherman Street. Riverside Avenue between Sheridan and Grant Street remains closed to through traffic. Local access to businesses on this unimproved section of Riverside is being maintained by the contractor.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- North Bank: Fencing surrounds the Promenade of the North Bank, closing the Howard Street pedestrian bridges (including the blue bridge). Detour routes through the park take visitors either across the suspension bridges or the Washington Street Bridge.
 Parking Lot 2 is now closed for construction. The detour of the Centennial Trail will take visitors across Cataldo St. to travel between the Flour Mill and the Washington Street Bridge. Construction on the North Promenade is anticipated to be complete in fall 2018. View an updated <u>map</u>.
- Pavilion: Fencing is expanded around the Pavilion site. It is anticipated to be in place through summer 2019.

- Post Street Reconfiguration: Post Street is now a two-way street in front of City Hall for one block. See the Street Projects section for more info. <u>A map is here along with</u> <u>additional information</u>.
- Looff Carrousel & South Gateway: The Howard Street South Bridge, <u>Carrousel</u>, and <u>SkyRide</u> are open. The former Fountain Café will be under construction this summer, to become the new Visitor Center run by Visit Spokane. Additional nearby restrooms can be found at both the Skate Ribbon and Carrousel.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

BRIDGE WORK

• Bridge crews are working on Maple Street Bridge repairs.

CRACK SEALING

• Maple from Northwest Boulevard to Francis

GRIND AND OVERLAY

• The Street Department is working on the Freya Street grind and overlay project between 13th and 29th Avenue. Drivers should expect lane closures and delays from 13th

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

UTILITY CUT CREWS

STREET PROJECTS

GREENE STREET AND ERMINA AVENUE SIGNALIZATION

• There are lane restrictions in place for both northbound and southbound Greene Street.

This project includes a new traffic signal, modifications to the Greene Street island and updates to the wheelchair ramps.

This is a \$650,000 project.

HIGH DRIVE, 29TH AVENUE TO 21ST AVENUE

• High Drive is closed from 29th Avenue to 21st Avenue.

Additional traffic control signage for the detour route has been added at Cedar Street and 14th Avenue aiding the general traveling public to utilize 14th Avenue as their detour.

This project will replace the old sewer line with a new 30" combined sewer in High Drive. Additional improvements include infiltration swales, drainage structures, landscaping and irrigation, curb, sidewalk and a pedestrian pathway.

This is a \$1.5 million project.

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WAY/RIVERSIDE DRIVE PHASE 2B

• Crews are constructing the new MLK extension from Erie to Perry Street.

This project constructs a new road from Erie to Perry Street including a new roundabout at Trent Avenue and Perry Street.

The \$2.5 million dollar project is funded with local, state and federal funds.

NORTH MONROE CORRIDOR PROJECT

Monroe South End (Murphy Brothers)

- The contractor is working on Monroe South Phase 2 (Montgomery to Indiana)! Monroe is closed to thru traffic between Indiana and Carlisle Avenue and the left turn lane from east bound Northwest Boulevard onto Monroe Street is closed off.
- Carlisle to Chelan is open to business traffic. All businesses within this project will need to use the Post Street detour route for access.

Monroe North End (Red Diamond)

• The contractor is working on Monroe North – Phase 2 (Euclid to Grace)! Monroe Street from Euclid to Chelan will be closed. All businesses within the new closure will need to use the Post Street detours for access.

The Monroe project is approximately 16 blocks long and will be completed in four block segments. **The segments not under construction will be open to local traffic.** There are two contractors working on this project each contractor is working on a four block segment so there will be a total of 8 blocks under construction at a time separated by 4 blocks open to traffic.

This project includes: new pavement, lane reconfiguration from five to three lanes, wider sidewalks, bump-outs, installation of High Performance Transit elements, upgraded street lighting, new pedestrian lighting and stormwater management.

Businesses are open, and signage will direct drivers to individual business locations. See <u>www.monroe project.com</u>.

The \$6.5 million project is funded with federal, state and local funds.

POST STREET TEMPORARY RECONFIGURATION

 Up to 16 construction trucks per hour will need to move south on Post Street for Riverfront Park redevelopment. Post Street is temporarily a two-way street for one block at City Hall, between Spokane Falls Boulevard and the Mobius Science Center to accommodate this construction traffic. RESIDENTIAL CHIP SEAL PROJECTS

• The contractor is still working on punch list items in all three locations.

RESIDENTIAL GRIND AND OVERLAY (SOUTH) PROJECTS

- Crews are working on two grind and overlay projects. The following roads will be closed to through traffic:
 - Division Street and Manito Boulevard, 33rd to 37th Avenue
 - o 5th Avenue, Freya to Havana Street
- Additional work includes:
 - o Sidewalk work has started on Arthur Street from 37th to 30th Avenue

SHARP AVENUE, PEARL STREET TO HAMILTON STREET

• Sharp Avenue is closed between Ruby Street and Hamilton Street.

Construction will include full roadway reconstruction with stormwater improvements. The design includes reducing lanes and adding bumpouts to provide narrower crossings for pedestrians, it also adds bike lanes and wider planted center medians. The water main along Sharp will also be replaced.

The \$2 million project is funded with state funds.

SUNSET BOULEVARD, ROYAL STREET TO LINDEKE STREET

• Sunset Boulevard traffic is reduced to one lane in each direction from Royal to Lindeke Street.

The City of Spokane will repave Sunset Blvd. between the intersections of Royal and Lindeke Street. This project will update the existing pavement surface by grinding the existing pavement down and overlaying it with new asphalt. The new surface will be striped with 3 vehicle lanes and 1 bicycle lane. There will be 2 travel lanes going uphill and one travel lane going downhill. A wide sidewalk with curb will be created along the north side of the roadway and a new bike lane will be installed on the south side of the roadway. Wheelchair ramps will be brought into ADA compliance and minor storm sewer upgrades and/or repairs will also be included in the project. Sunset Boulevard will remain open during construction.

This is a \$2.5 million project.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

DIVISION, BROWNE AND RUBY STREET RESURFACING

• WSDOT is resurfacing Division, Browne and Ruby Street from I-90 to Euclid Avenue. Drivers should be alert for possible daytime curb lane restrictions for ADA work. During evening and overnight hours (10 p.m. to 6 a.m.), drivers should expect multiple lane closures for paving and/or asphalt grinding.

I-90 – HAMILTON WESTBOUND ON-RAMP DECK REPAIR

• The Hamilton I-90 westbound on-ramp will remain closed until late October.

Travelers will have several options to access westbound I-90 during the closure, though some depend on vehicle height (see map):

- Vehicles under 14 feet tall can take the Second Avenue ramp down to Browne Street and access I-90 there
- Vehicles under 15 feet can briefly head east, exit at Altamont Street (exit 283 A) and then travel under the freeway and take the westbound ramp back onto the interstate
- Vehicles over 15 feet will need to head east to the Third Avenue/Freya Street interchange (Exit 283 B) and then cross over to Second Avenue and take the westbound ramp onto I-90.

TRENT AVENUE PAVING, PERRY STREET TO MISSION AVENUE

 WSDOT crews are working on a Trent Avenue grind and overlay project between Perry Street and Mission Avenue. The segment from Hamilton to Perry will be resurfaced as part of the <u>Spokane River Bridge Replacement project</u> which is currently slated to begin in 2019.
