COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

[ADAMS STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW \(CSO\) 24 PROJECT](#)

- Here's how this work affects **traffic and parking** in the area:
 - Adams Street between 1st and Sprague Ave is reduced to one lane for KHQ access only.
 - **1st Avenue from Walnut to Jefferson Street has reopened but is reduced to one lane**
 - Sprague is closed to all westbound traffic from Jefferson to Cedar. Eastbound traffic is permitted on Sprague from Adams to Jefferson for local residents and KHQ employees.
 - **Riverside Avenue will be return to westbound traffic only from Jefferson to Cedar Street on Sunday, October 13. Eastbound Riverside Avenue will be closed from Cedar to Jefferson Street.**

This project will construct a 2.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

The \$16.3 million project is funded with City Utility funds.

EAST CENTRAL STORMWAER IMPROVEMENTS

- Crews are working in the area of Riverside Avenue from Perry to Napa Street (drivers should expect road closures in the area)

This work involves the installation of storm structures, swales and separating the combination of sanitary and storm systems into swale drainage area.

I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

- Work continues on the East Riverside CSO tanks. Riverside Avenue remains closed between Lee Street and the alley between Lee and Crestline Street. Access to local businesses and residences should remain intact during this period.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.5 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the “It’s all about the River” program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

LIBERTY PARK, COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK 33-1

- **This project is substantially complete!**
- Third Avenue is reduced to one lane between Arthur and Liberty Park Place.

This work is to construct a 2 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank that is part of the “It’s all about the River” program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

PEACEFUL VALLEY COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 25 PROJECT

- Crews continue to work on CSO 25. The following streets are closed;
 - Main Avenue is closed 300’ east of Cedar Street; Main is only accessible via Monroe Street and is open to local traffic only.
 - Cedar Street is closed between Main and Wilson Avenue for a 42” sewer pipe installation.

The project will result in new water, sanitary and storm sewer infrastructure. In addition, stormwater swales will be installed.

This project is funded with state funds.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - **Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe is closed to traffic.**

- **Traffic on Lincoln Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main is directed southbound; drivers are required to go east or west at Main. Lincoln is the detour for traffic coming from the River Park Square garage and Spokane Falls.**
- Access to the Lincoln Street entrance to the River Park Square parking garage is open.

Crews continue to build the walls for the CSO tank. On the east end of the jobsite, near City Hall, crews will intermittently stop traffic to allow concrete trucks in and out of the site, as well as the west side of the site on pour days. **The next concrete pours are scheduled for Friday, October 12 and Wednesday, October 17.**

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

EVENTS

- **[Downtown Fall Festival](#) – Saturday, October 13**
Wall Street will be closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Main Avenue from 6 a.m. to midnight.
- **[Spokane Marathon](#) – Sunday, October 14**
All races start at Main Avenue and Washington Street. There are three start times 7 a.m., 8 a.m., and 9 a.m. You should expect runners on the following streets:
 - Main Avenue east of Washington Street to Monroe Street
 - Riverside Avenue from Monroe Street to Oak Street
 - Oak Street from Riverside Avenue to 1st Avenue
 - 1st Avenue from Oak Street to Hemlock Street
 - Hemlock Street from 1st Avenue to Pacific Avenue
 - Pacific Avenue from Hemlock Street to Coeur d'Alene Street
 - Coeur d'Alene Street from Pacific Avenue to Sunset Boulevard
 - Sunset Boulevard from Coeur d'Alene Street to Government Way
 - Government Way from Sunset Boulevard to Elliott Drive
 - Elliott Drive from Government Way to the Centennial Trail
 - Fort George Wright Drive from the Fort George Wright Drive Bridge to Elliott Drive
 - Elliott Drive behind Spokane Falls Community College
 - Fort George Wright Drive from Elliott to Randolph Road
 - Randolph Road from Fort George Wright Drive to Fremont Road
 - Fremont Road from Randolph Road to Wright Road
 - Wright Road from Fremont Road to the Military Cemetery Trailhead
 - Riverside State Park Drive from Wilber Street to 7 Mile Road
 - 7 Mile Road from Riverside State Park to Aubrey L White Parkway
 - Aubrey L White Parkway from 7 Mile Road to Downriver Drive

- Downriver Drive from Aubrey L White Parkway to Pettet Drive
- Pettet Drive from Downriver Drive to West Point Road
- West Point Road from Pettet Drive to Mission Avenue
- Mission Avenue/Summit Boulevard from West Point Road to Centennial Trail entrance south of Boone Avenue
- Lincoln Street from Bridge Avenue to Broadway Avenue
- Broadway Avenue from Lincoln Street to Post Street
- Post Street from Broadway Avenue to Mallon Avenue
- Mallon Avenue from Post Street to Howard Street
- Howard Street from Mallon Avenue to Cataldo Avenue
- Cataldo Avenue from Howard Street to Washington Street

It is anticipated the race will conclude around 2 p.m.

Peaceful Valley residents can access their neighborhood via Government Way; officers will be present to facilitate traffic. Drivers should expect delays. In addition, the CSO 25 contractor will clear Lower Main Avenue for resident access. Please use caution when entering and exiting Peaceful Valley via Lower Main, this is a one lane street.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The westbound curb lane of Mission Avenue will be closed between North Upriver Drive and Perry Street from 10/1/18-10/12/18.
- The parking lane, sidewalk, and bike lane on the east side of Howard between 1st and Sprague will be closed from 9/24 to 10/12.
- The sidewalks along the half block of 4th and Walnut will be closed from 7/16/18-10/12/18 for replacement.
- The west lane of Monroe Street between 3rd Avenue and Freeway Avenue will be closed from 10/11/18-10/15/18 for curb and gutter work.
- No through traffic from Thomas Mallen to Hayford on Geiger Blvd from 10/1/18-10/15/18 for county project
- Full closure of 29th Avenue between Cuba and Havana for a utility install from 10/15/18-10/19/18.
- The northern westbound lane of Sunset Highway will be closed between Russell and Deer Heights from 9/10/18-10/19/18 to place aerial pipe.
- The outside curb lanes of Indiana Avenue will be closed between Monroe and Post with flagging at the Lincoln intersection from 9/24/18-/10/23/18.
- Northbound traffic lane and sidewalk of Indian Trail Rd between Lowell Ave and Strong Rd closed from 10/2/18-10/26/18, traffic shifted to center lane for site excavation
- The right lane of eastbound Sunset Highway is closed between Windsor and Royal Street from 9/17/18-10/26/18.
- The eastbound curb lane of Trent Avenue between Greene and Desmet Street will be closed from 9/26/18-10/26/18.

- The sidewalk on the southwest corner of Riverside and Browne will be closed from 10/10/18-10/30/18.
- Full closures of Riverside Avenue between Grant and Sheridan and Sheridan between Sprague and Riverside from 7/30/18-10/31/18.
- Monroe Street will be reduced by two lanes at Riverside Avenue, starting on Monday, October 8 and continuing for four to six weeks. The west side slip lane onto Riverside from Monroe will be closed. Motorists can make a right turn (west) onto Riverside to the south of the median with the Monahan statue. The closure is needed to accommodate the repair of underground electrical infrastructure by Avista Utilities. Drivers should expect delays.
- Southbound curb lane of Holland between Colfax and Dakota closed for telecom work from 10/2/18-11/1/18.
- The two east lanes of Stevens Street will be closed at Main Avenue, there will be alternating lane closures from 10/1/18-11/30/18.
- An obstruction at the NW corner of 17th Ave and Mt Vernon is expected until 12/13/18.
- The north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard at Post will be closed until 5/30/19.
- The sidewalk on 5th Ave between Jefferson and Monroe and STA bus stop in that location closed from 10/2/18-11/2/19 for building construction.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

CENTENNIAL TRAIL MISSION AVENUE GAP PHASE I

- Mission Avenue has eastbound closure from Perry Street east to the Mission Street Bridge.
- A Centennial Trail detour will be in place to get pedestrian and bicyclist around the construction

This project will add upgraded sidewalks and traffic islands on Mission at Perry and upgrades to the Mission Pool parking lot. The parking lot improvements include a bus turn around, additional lighting and drain modifications.

This is a \$500,000 project.

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- Promenades: A new section of the Promenades is under construction– the East Promenade. It will run along the Clock Tower Meadow and Lilac Bowl, and is the future home of the Centennial Trail. [View a map](#) of the new section soon under construction (pink section). We appreciate the extra steps folks are taking to get through the park during construction.
- North Bank: Fencing surrounds the Promenade of the North Bank, closing the Howard Street pedestrian bridges (including the blue bridge). Detour routes through the park take visitors either across the suspension bridges or the Washington Street Bridge.

Parking Lot 2 is closed for construction. The detour of the Centennial Trail will take visitors across Cataldo St. to travel between the Flour Mill and the Washington Street Bridge. Construction on the North Promenade is anticipated to be complete in fall 2018.

- Pavilion: Fencing is expanded around the Pavilion site. It is anticipated to be in place through fall 2019.
- Post Street Reconfiguration: Post Street is now a two-way street in front of City Hall for one block. See the Street Projects section for more info. [A map is here along with additional information.](#) Increased truck traffic is anticipated over the next month on Post Street.
- Loeff Carrousel & South Gateway: The Howard Street South Bridge, [Carrousel](#), [Skate Ribbon](#) and [SkyRide](#) are open. The former Fountain Café is now the new Visitor Center run by Visit Spokane, open daily 10am – 7pm.

SPRAGUE/SHERMAN BRIDGE PLAZA

- There are lane restrictions at Sprague and Sherman for light pole base and conduit installations.

This project will improve the Sprague Avenue and Sherman Street intersection providing a transit hub to link the University District Bridge with Sprague Avenue. The project includes construction of a multiuse (bicycles, pedestrians and transit) facility between Sprague and Sherman, new signals and pedestrian lighting, landscaping.

This is a \$1.04 million project.

UNIVERSITY DISTRICT PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

- Martin Luther King Jr. Way is closed from Pine to Sherman Street. Riverside Avenue between Sheridan and Grant Street remains closed to through traffic. Local access to businesses on this unimproved section of Riverside is being maintained by the contractor.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

BRIDGE WORK

- Bridge crews are working throughout the city on various projects.

CRACK SEALING

- The Street Department is working at the following locations:
 - Sherman/South East Boulevard from 3rd to Perry Street

- 37th Avenue Grand Boulevard intersection

GRIND AND OVERLAY

- The Street Department will continue the second phase of the Cedar/Walnut from 9th to 14th Avenue grind and overlay project. Maple (going south) is closed from 4th to 14th, and Walnut (going north) will be closed from 14th to 4th. There are no east/west crossing at the intersection of Cedar and 14th. Detours are in place. We expect road construction on these streets (along with Cedar and High Drive) to be complete and the roads opened around the 3rd week of October.
- Crews will start working on a grind and overlay project on the Palouse Highway from Regal to Freya Street

POTHOLE CREWS

- City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

- Street Department crews are sweeping arterial streets in all three regions: Northwest, Northeast and South.

UTILITY CUT CREWS

- Crews will be working throughout the City repairing sewer and water lines.

STREET PROJECTS

FALLS AVENUE

- **This project is substantially complete!**

This project includes paving the gravel road, stormwater improvements, ADA ramps and curb replacement.

HIGH DRIVE, 29TH AVENUE TO 21ST AVENUE

- High Drive is closed from 29th Avenue to 21st Avenue.

This project will replace the old sewer line with a new 30" combined sewer in High Drive. Additional improvements include infiltration swales, drainage structures, landscaping and irrigation, curb, sidewalk and a pedestrian pathway.

This is a \$2.4 million project.

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WAY/RIVERSIDE DRIVE PHASE 2B

- Crews are constructing the new MLK extension from Erie to Perry Street.

This project constructs a new road from Erie to Perry Street including a new roundabout at Trent Avenue and Perry Street. The roundabout is open.

The \$2.5 million dollar project is funded with local, state and federal funds.

POST STREET TEMPORARY RECONFIGURATION

- Up to 16 construction trucks per hour will need to move south on Post Street for Riverfront Park redevelopment. Post is temporarily a two-way street for one block at City Hall, between Spokane Falls and the Mobius Science Center to accommodate this construction traffic. RESIDENTIAL GRIND AND OVERLAY (NORTH) PROJECTS

- Crews are working on residential grind and overlay projects. The following roads will be closed to through traffic:
 - Dalke Avenue from Monroe to Wall Street
 - Lincoln Street from Central to Francis Avenue
 - Post Street from Dalke to Francis Avenue
 - Addison Drive from Standard to Dakota Street
 - Dakota Street from Addison to Cozza Drive
 - Wedgewood Avenue from Standard to Dakota Street

- Mayfair Street from Queen to Rowan Avenue

RESIDENTIAL GRIND AND OVERLAY (SOUTH) PROJECTS

- Crews are working on residential grind and overlay projects. The following roads will be closed to through traffic:
 - Crescent Avenue from Nora Avenue to Lacey Street
 - Browne Street from 19th to 25th Avenue

SHARP AVENUE, PEARL STREET TO HAMILTON STREET

- Sharp Avenue is closed between Ruby Street and Hamilton Street.

Construction includes full roadway reconstruction with stormwater improvements. The design includes reducing lanes and adding bumpouts to provide narrower crossings for pedestrians, it also adds bike lanes and wider planted center medians. The water main along Sharp will also be replaced.

The \$2 million project is funded with state funds.

SUNSET BOULEVARD, ROYAL STREET TO LINDEKE STREET

- Sunset Boulevard traffic is reduced to one lane in each direction from Royal to Lindeke Street.

The project will repave Sunset Blvd. between Royal and Lindeke streets. The new surface will be striped with 3 vehicle lanes and 1 bicycle lane. There will be 2 travel lanes going uphill, and one travel lane going downhill. A wide sidewalk with curb will be created along the north side of the roadway and a new bike lane will be installed on the south side of the roadway. Wheelchair ramps will be brought into ADA compliance and minor storm sewer upgrades are included. Sunset Boulevard remains open during construction.

This is a \$2.5 million project.

OTHER CITY PROJECTS

RED BAND PARK RIVER ACCESS & PRIVACY SHELTER

- No traffic restrictions

This project includes the installation of a rafting boat rail launch system into the Spokane River, located at Red Band Park (the old Glover Field) in Peaceful Valley. The

project also includes the installation of a Privacy Shelter which will house Portable Bathroom Facilities.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

DIVISION STREET CRACK SEALING (EUCLID TO FRANCIS)

- Sunday, October 14 and Monday, October 15 between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. crews will be crack sealing southbound Division Street between Euclid and Francis Avenue.

I-90/EXPANSION JOINT REPAIR (MAPLE TO DIVISION)

- Monday, October 15 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. drivers should expect alternate closures of the Walnut and Monroe eastbound I-90 on ramps. Crews will be repairing expansion joints on the eastbound right lane between Maple and Division Street.
- Tuesday, October 16 and Wednesday, October 17 between the hours of 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. the westbound I-90 Jefferson on ramp will be closed. Crews will be repairing expansion joints on the westbound right lane between Division and Maple Street.

I-90 – HAMILTON WESTBOUND ON-RAMP DECK REPAIR

- The Hamilton I-90 westbound on-ramp will remain closed until late October.

Travelers will have several options to access westbound I-90 during the closure, though some depend on vehicle height ([see map](#)):

- Vehicles under 14 feet tall can take the Second Avenue ramp down to Browne Street and access I-90 there
- Vehicles under 15 feet can briefly head east, exit at Altamont Street (exit 283 A) and then travel under the freeway and take the westbound ramp back onto the interstate
- Vehicles over 15 feet will need to head east to the Third Avenue/Freya Street interchange (Exit 283 B) and then cross over to Second Avenue and take the westbound ramp onto I-90.

TRENT AVENUE PAVING, HAMILTON STREET TO MISSION AVENUE

- WSDOT crews are working on a Trent Avenue grind and overlay project between Hamilton Street and Mission Avenue. This project will have daytime work with lane closures for loops and utility adjustments and nighttime work for paving between hours 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.

US 2 GARDEN SPRINGS TO BROADWAY AVENUE – RAMP METER

- Monday – Saturday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., drivers should expect shoulder closures only. Boring under I-90 and setting poles will be done at night.

WATER DEPARTMENT

57TH AVENUE AND PALOUSE HIGHWAY WATER TRANSMISSION REPLACEMENT

The City Water Department is replacing a 30-inch water transmission main through the intersection of 57th & Palouse Highway. The intersection is expected to be closed through Thursday, October 25. The main was installed in 1958.
