Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

ADAMS STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 24 PROJECT

- The Adams Street CSO project is near completion! With the CSO facility and roadway work complete, the project will be suspended over the winter beginning on or around Friday, Dec. 14. Plaza and dog park surface improvement work will resume in early spring of 2019 with limited road restrictions and parking impacts.
- Here's how this work affects traffic and parking in the area:
 - One lane of westbound Sprague Avenue is open from Jefferson to Cedar. All lanes will be open by Friday, Dec. 21.
 - All on street parking has been restored, aside from isolated work areas.
 - A temporary three-way stop will be live and functioning on Friday, Dec. 14 at the intersection of Cedar Street and 1st Avenue.

This project will construct a 2.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

The \$16.3 million project is funded with City Utility funds.

EAST CENTRAL STORMWATER IMPROVEMENTS

• Crews are working in the area of Riverside Avenue from Perry to Napa Street (drivers should expect road closures in the area).

This work involves the installation of storm structures, swales and separating the combination of sanitary and storm systems into swale drainage area.

I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

• Work continues on the East Riverside CSO tanks. Riverside Avenue remains closed between Lee Street and the alley between Lee and Crestline Street. Access to local businesses and residences should remain intact during this period.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.5 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

LIBERTY PARK, COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK 33-1

- This project is substantially complete!
- Third Avenue is reduced to one lane between Arthur and Liberty Park Place.

This work is to construct a 2 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank that is part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

PEACEFUL VALLEY COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 25 PROJECT

• Main Avenue has reopened.

The project will result in new water, sanitary and storm sewer infrastructure. In addition, stormwater swales will be installed.

This project is funded with state funds.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe is closed to traffic.
 - Traffic on Lincoln Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main is directed southbound; drivers are required to go east or west at Main. Lincoln is the detour for traffic coming from the River Park Square garage and Spokane Falls.
 - Access to the Lincoln Street entrance to the River Park Square parking garage is open.

Crews continue to build the walls for the CSO tank. On the east end of the jobsite, near City Hall, crews will intermittently stop traffic to allow concrete trucks in and out of the site, as well as the west side of the site on pour days.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The southbound lane of Wall Street will be closed between 1st and 2nd Avenue from 12/13/18-12/14/18 for proofing conduit.
- West side curb lane of Monroe closed at intersection of 2nd Avenue and westbound lane of 2nd closed at intersection of Monroe from 12/6/18-12/14/18.
- The right northbound lane of Ruby between Cataldo and Boone will be closed from 12/3/18-/12/14/18.
- The northbound curb lane of Monroe Street will be closed from Sharp to Maxwell Avenue from 12/10/18-12/19/18.
- The south side travel line of 1st Avenue between Adams and Jefferson will be closed from 12/12/18-12/21/18 for pole replacement.
- The northwest corner of Sprague and Post and the curb lane of Sprague to Monroe will be closed from 12/17/18-12/21/18 for fiber work.
- The left northbound lane of Grand from Sumner to 9th Avenue will be closed from 12/10/18-12/21/18.
- The northbound curb lane of Division Street will be closed between Walton and Longfellow Avenue from 12/13/18-12/27/18.
- There will be a full closure of Helena between Empire and Garland from 12/17/18-12/31/18 for Avista work.
- The westbound lane of Sunset Boulevard closed between Rustle and Royal Street and between Lewis and Gove from 12/3/18-12/31/18.
- The westbound lane of Hwy 2 closed between Russell and Hayford roads from 12/2/18-12/31/18.
- The north side lane of 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue between Lacey and Regal; south side lane of hartson between Haven and Green will be closed from 12/10/18-1/9/19.
- The westbound curb lane of Francis between Oak and Buffalo Street will be closed from 12/13/18-1/11/19 for telecom work.
- The east travel lane of Magnesium between Dakota and Standard will have temporary closures with flaggers from 12/14/18-1/18/19 for boring conduit.
- The north and south curb lanes of Francis Avenue between Elm and Maple from 12/13/18-1/11/19 for telecom work.
- The north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard at Post will be closed until 5/30/19.

• The sidewalk on 5th Ave between Jefferson and Monroe and STA bus stop in that location closed from 10/2/18-11/2/19 for building construction.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- North Bank: The sidewalk along the corner southeast of Howard and Mallon by the Spokane Arena will be temporarily closed early winter. Fencing surrounds the Promenade of the North Bank, closing the Howard Street pedestrian bridges (including the blue bridge). Detour routes through the park take visitors either across the suspension bridges or the Washington Street Bridge. Construction on the North Promenade is anticipated to be complete by end of 2018, but the pathways may remain closed longer due to surrounding construction and the upcoming playground and amenities. <u>View a map</u>.
- Pavilion: Fencing is expanded around the Pavilion site. It is anticipated to be in place through fall 2019.
- Post Street Reconfiguration: Post Street is now a two-way street in front of City Hall for one block. See the Street Projects section for more info. <u>A map is here along with</u> <u>additional information</u>. Increased truck traffic is anticipated over the next month on Post Street.

SPRAGUE/SHERMAN BRIDGE PLAZA

• This project has been suspended until spring 2019.

This project will improve the Sprague Avenue and Sherman Street intersection providing a transit hub to link the University District Bridge with Sprague Avenue. The project includes construction of a multiuse (bicycles, pedestrians and transit) facility between Sprague and Sherman, new signals and pedestrian lighting, landscaping.

This is a \$1.04 million project.

UNIVERSITY DISTRICT PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

• Riverside Avenue between Sheridan and Grant Street remains closed to through traffic. Local access to businesses on this unimproved section of Riverside is being maintained by the contractor.

This is a \$9.5 million project.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

LEAF PICKUP

- The leaf pickup packer crew will be finishing work in Browne's Addition. Friday, Dec. 14, starting at 9 a.m. crews will be clearing leaves from the east-west streets.
- Fall leaf pickup continues; view the entire schedule on our website!

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

SNOW REMOVAL

• Citizens are asked to park on the odd side of the street in residential areas for the entire snow season, which runs from November 15 to March 15.

STREET SWEEPING

• Street Department crews are sweeping behind the <u>leaf crew</u>.

STREET PROJECTS

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WAY/RIVERSIDE DRIVE PHASE 2B

• Martin Luther King Jr. Way is open! MLK is open to traffic between Division Street and the new roundabout at Trent Avenue and Perry Street.

Crews will complete a top lift of asphalt and other work in the spring, this work will take about six to eight weeks. This project constructs a new road from Erie to Perry Street including a newly opened roundabout at Trent Avenue and Perry Street.

The \$2.5 million dollar project is funded with local, state and federal funds.

POST STREET TEMPORARY RECONFIGURATION

• Up to 16 construction trucks per hour will need to move south on Post Street for Riverfront Park redevelopment. Post is temporarily a two-way street for one block at City Hall, between Spokane Falls and the Mobius Science Center to accommodate this construction traffic. OTHER CITY PROJECTS

RED BAND PARK RIVER ACCESS & PRIVACY SHELTER

• No traffic restrictions

This project includes the installation of a rafting boat rail launch system into the Spokane River, located at Red Band Park (the old Glover Field) in Peaceful Valley. The project also includes the installation of a Privacy Shelter which will house Portable Bathroom Facilities.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS

I-90 – HAMILTON WESTBOUND ON-RAMP DECK REPAIR

- The I-90 westbound 2nd Avenue offramp to Hamilton is closed.
- One lane of the Hamilton Street I-90 westbound on-ramp has reopened!

Travelers will have several options to access westbound I-90 during the closure, though some depend on vehicle height (<u>see map</u>):

- Vehicles under 14 feet tall can take the Second Avenue ramp down to Browne Street and access I-90 there
- Vehicles under 15 feet can briefly head east, exit at Altamont Street (exit 283 A) and then travel under the freeway and take the westbound ramp back onto the interstate
- Vehicles over 15 feet will need to head east to the Third Avenue/Freya Street interchange (Exit 283 B) and then cross over to Second Avenue and take the westbound ramp onto I-90.
