Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

Riverside Avenue between Napa and Crestline Street remains closed.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.4 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - The Spokane Public Library parking garage will be closed from Monday, Feb. 25 to Friday, March 1.
 - Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe is closed to traffic.
 - Traffic on Lincoln Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main is directed southbound; drivers are required to go east or west at Main. Lincoln is the detour for traffic coming from the River Park Square garage and Spokane Falls.
 - Access to the Lincoln Street entrance to the River Park Square parking garage is open.

Crews will continue constructing the roof slab for the CSO tank. There is one remaining section to pour on the roof slab. Garco's tower crane is scheduled to be removed Monday, Feb. 25 through Friday, March 1. Flaggers will be on the east end of the jobsite to stop traffic as needed. Steel stairs are being installed in both stairways on the east

and west end of the tank and will be completed on Friday, Feb. 22. Mechanical and Electrical work has begun inside the tank. Crews will continue backfilling the tank as weather allows.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Double lane closure on Division Street and Ruby near Montgomery; two lanes will remain open at all times and switch as needed to pothole existing utilities. Cascade Cable will be working from 2/11/19-2/22/19 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- The two southbound lanes of Monroe Street will be closed south of the Monroe Street Bridge to Main Avenue. Avista will be working on a vault next to the island on Monday, Feb. 25 from 4 – 7 a.m.
- Flagging closures on Market between Garland and Hoffman from 1/25/19-2/25/19 form 9am-3pm.
- Closing an eastbound lane of North Foothill Drive/Euclid Avenue between Crestline and Regal Street from 2/22/19-2/26/19 for telecom work.
- Alberta will have flaggers between Rockwell and Longfellow from 2/12/19-2/26/19 from 9 a.m. 3 p.m. for Avista maintenance.
- Flagging closures on Perry Street between Jackson and Illinois from 1/28/19-2/27/19 from 9am-3pm for telecom work.
- The southbound curb lane of Monroe Street will be closed south of the Monroe Street Bridge to Riverside Avenue. The closure is from Wednesday, Feb. 6 to Thursday, Feb. 28. Avista will be working Monday Thursday and there will be no closures on Fridays. However, crews WILL be working Friday, Feb. 8.
- Southside curb lane of 2nd between Scott and Sherman closed from 1/28/19-2/28/19 from 9am-3pm for Avista gas work.
- The westbound curb lane of Boone Avenue from Stevens to Howard from 2/20/19-3/1/19 for CenturyLink to access manholes.
- Regal Street between Rockwell and Garland will have a partial northbound lane closure from 2/11/19-3/1/19 for aerial cable work.
- Southside curb lane of W Barnes closed between Pamela Street and Indian Trail Road from 2/1/19-3/1/19 from 9a.m. -3 p.m. for Quanta telecom work.
- Havana will be closed between Trent and Wisconsin and Wisconsin off of Havana from 2/6/19-3/1/19 from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. as Sefnco places cable.
- The right travel lane of northbound Division Street between Lincoln and Magnesium and eastbound lane of Lincoln between Dicion and Colton will be closed from 2/6/19-3/1/19 from 7 p.m. to 10 a.m. as Sefnco places cable.

- Flagging closures at the intersection of Hamilton and Jackson from 2/4/19-3/1/19 between 9am-3pm for telecom work.
- The east side curb lane of Maple Street and west side curb lane of Ash Street will be closed between Shannon Avenue and Northwest Boulevard; there will be flaggers onsite. This Quanta telecom work is from 2/11/19-3/8/19 between the hours of 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Northbound Crowley and southbound Sheridan between 5th and 7th Avenue and eastbound 5th Avenue between Cowley and Sheridan will be closed from 2/11/19-3/8/19 from 9 a.m. 3 p.m. for placing aerial cable.
- Northbound curb lane of Monroe Street between Heroy and Wellesley will be closed from 2/11/19-3/11/19 from 9 a.m. 3 p.m. for Dept. of Ecology work.
- The westbound curb land of Sunset Highway between Government Way and Rosamond Avenue from 2/13/19-3/12/19 from 9 a.m. 3 p.m. for Quanta telecom work.
- The northbound curb land of Freya will be closed between Sprague and Olive from 2/11/19-3/15/19, 9 a.m. 3p.m. for Sefnco fiber work.
- East bound traffic lane of Euclid between Regal and Haven closed form 2/11/19-3/15/19 for trenching cable.
- The north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard at Post will be closed until 5/30/19.
- The sidewalk on 5th Ave between Jefferson and Monroe and STA bus stop in that location closed from 10/2/18-11/2/19 for building construction.
- The curb lanes of 1st Avenue between Lincoln and Post (only one lane at a time) will be closed intermittently from 1/1/19-12/31/19 for steam plant remediation.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- South Bank: The short pathway between the orange bridge and the East Wooden Bridge
 will temporarily close again, to allow Promenade construction on the north end of the
 orange bridge. The closure is anticipated to last February May. A detour across the
 East Wooden Bridge will connect pedestrians and cyclists between the south bank and
 the clock tower pathway. The Rotary Fountain and Looff Carrousel areas are not
 impacted. View the map.
- North Bank: The sidewalk along the corner southeast of Howard and Mallon by the Spokane Arena will be temporarily closed early winter. Fencing surrounds the Promenade of the North Bank, closing the Howard Street pedestrian bridges (including the blue bridge). Detour routes through the park take visitors either across the suspension bridges or the Washington Street Bridge. Construction on the North Promenade is anticipated to be complete by end of 2018, but the pathways may remain closed longer due to surrounding construction and the upcoming playground and amenities.
- Pavilion: Fencing is expanded around the Pavilion site. It is anticipated to be in place through fall 2019.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

SNOW REMOVAL

• Citizens are asked to park on the odd side of the street in residential areas for the entire snow season, which runs from November 15 to March 15.

OTHER CITY PROJECTS

RED BAND PARK RIVER ACCESS & PRIVACY SHELTER

No traffic restrictions

This project includes the installation of a rafting boat rail launch system into the Spokane River, located at Red Band Park (the old Glover Field) in Peaceful Valley. The project also includes the installation of a Privacy Shelter which will house Portable Bathroom Facilities.
