# COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

# ADAMS STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 24 PROJECT

- The Adams Street CSO project is near completion! The following streets are closed:
  - The northern most lane of Sprague Avenue between Adams and Cedar Street.
  - Adams Street between Sprague and Riverside Avenue is closed to through traffic. Local Access is provided for Q6.

This project will construct a 2.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

## The \$16.3 million project is funded with City Utility funds.

## EAST CENTRAL STORMWATER IMPROVEMENTS

- The following streets are closed:
  - o Crestline Street and Pacific Avenue intersection
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Crestline Street closed between 1st and Pacific Avenue

## Detour routes are in place, please use them.

This work involves the installation of storm structures, a swale and associated storm sewer pipe. This work will separate combined sanitary and storm system flows and divert stormwater to the new swale area.

## The \$1.75 million project is funded with local and state funds.

## I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

• Riverside Avenue between Napa and Crestline Street remains closed.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.4 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

## SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
  - $\circ$  Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe is closed to traffic.
  - Traffic on Lincoln Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main is directed southbound; drivers are required to go east or west at Main. Lincoln is the detour for traffic coming from the River Park Square garage and Spokane Falls.

Crews are forming retaining walls around both sides of the CSO Tank. Mechanical and Electrical work continues inside the tank. Crews will continue backfilling the tank.

The left hand turn lane on southbound Monroe Street at Main Avenue is closed for new drainage and sidewalk work.

From Monday, April 22 at 9 a.m. until Tuesday, April 23 at 3 p.m. there will be a left hand lane closure of northbound Lincoln/Monroe Street starting at Main Avenue.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

# **NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS**

- The south 50% of Sharp Avenue will be closed between Wall and Monroe Street from 3/18/19-4/19/19 for aerial work.
- The left northbound lane of Division Street from 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue to Spokane Falls Boulevard will be closed from 4/11/19-4/19/19 along with the curb lane of W Riverside Avenue.

- The right northbound lane of Division Street between the Senator Sam C. Guess Memorial Bridge and North River Drive from 4/15/19-4/19/19 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. for optical fiber pull by CenturyLink.
- The southbound lanes of Grand Street between 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> will be closed from 4/15/19-4/19/19 for crane work at the water tower by Spokane Crane.
- The left lane of Walnut Street between 5<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and the right lane of 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue from Ash to Walnut Street will be closed for Avista work from 4/8/19-4/22/19.
- The right lane of Maple Street between Wabash and Queen Avenue will be closed from 4/18/19-4/22/19 for a water tap be Poul Construction.
- Stevens Street and Main Avenue will have alternating lane closures, two lanes of each street at a time from 3/25/19-4/25/19 for Potelco utility work.
- Montgomery will be closed between Ruby and Division from 4/10/19-4/25/19.
- The northbound curb lane of Nevada will be closed between Horner Avenue and Northpoint Access Lane from 4/15/19-4/26/19 between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. for pole replacement and small cell equipment installation by Avista.
- The right lane of Thor Street between 5<sup>th</sup> and Hartson Avenue will be closed from 4/15/19-4/26/19 between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. for pole replacement and wireless equipment installation by Avista.
- 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue eastbound will be closed between Freya and Achilles Street from 4/23/19-4/26/19 for underground storm line work by Zetin Contractors.
- The northbound curb lane of Grand Boulevard between 13<sup>th</sup> and Rockwood will be closed from 3/28/19-4/26/19 for Sefnco aerial fiber work.
- The westbound curb lane of Francis Avenue between Elgin and Belt closed from 3/28/19-4/26/19 for Quanta telecom work.
- The right eastbound curb lane of Francis will be closed from Myrtle to Havana from 4/15/19-4/26/19.
- Main Avenue will have lane closures from Wall Street to east of Stevens Street. Due to this Potelco work the Stevens left turn lane will be closed. This work is scheduled for 3/25/19-4/30/19 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., there will be no Friday work.
- The northbound lane of Wall Street will be closed at 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue from 4/15/19-5/3/19.
- The right hand turn lane and sidewalk from Washington Street onto 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue will be closed from 3/14/19 5/3/19 for Avista vault work.
- The northbound curb lane on Nevada Street will be closed at Heroy Avenue from 4/15/19-5/3/19 for optical fiber placement by CenturyLink.
- The southbound curb lane on Ray Street will be closed between 17<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> from 4/10/19-5/9/19.
- Southbound lane of Ray Street between 16<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue will be closed with complete road shutdowns occasionally from 4/10/19-5/9/19 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for aerial cable work by Quanta.
- The intersection of Perry Street and Southwest Boulevard will close occasionally for Quanta work from 4/10/19-5/9/19.
- The northbound curb lane of Freya Street between Main and Olive Street will be closed from 4/10/19-5/10/19 for Sefnco work.

- Northbound Crestline will be closed from Devoe Avenue to Lincoln Road from 4/15/19-5/10/19 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for installation of aerial cable by Quanta Telecom.
- Half of Freya Street between 45<sup>th</sup> and 44<sup>th</sup> will be closed from 4/15/19-5/10/19 between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. for Avista gas work.
- The east lane of Crestline will be closed between Brooklyn and Weile from 4/15/19-5/10/19.
- The eastbound inside lane of Mission Avenue will be closed at Cincinnati Street from 4/22/19-5/21/19 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for aerial cable installation by Quanta.
- The north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard at Post will be closed until 5/30/19.
- The sidewalk on the south side of 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue between Madison and Jefferson will remain closed until 6/11/19 for building façade work.
- The sidewalk on 5th Ave between Jefferson and Monroe and STA bus stop in that location closed from 10/2/18-11/2/19 for building construction.
- The curb lanes of 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue between Lincoln and Post (only one lane at a time) will be closed intermittently from 1/1/19-12/31/19 for steam plant remediation.

# **PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS**

## **RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION**

- South Bank: The short pathway between the orange bridge and the East Wooden Bridge
  will temporarily close again, to allow Promenade construction on the north end of the
  orange bridge. The closure is anticipated to last February May. A detour across the
  East Wooden Bridge will connect pedestrians and cyclists between the south bank and
  the clock tower pathway. The Rotary Fountain and Looff Carrousel areas are not
  impacted. <u>View the map</u>.
- North Bank: The sidewalk along the corner southeast of Howard and Mallon by the Spokane Arena will be temporarily closed early winter. Fencing surrounds the Promenade of the North Bank, closing the Howard Street pedestrian bridges (including the blue bridge). Detour routes through the park take visitors either across the suspension bridges or the Washington Street Bridge. Construction on the North Promenade is anticipated to open for Bloomsday in early May, between the North Bank up to the Blue Bridge.
- Pavilion: Fencing is expanded around the Pavilion site. It is anticipated to be in place through fall 2019.

# **SPRAGUE/SHERMAN BRIDGE PLAZA**

• The intersection of Sprague Avenue and Sherman Street is closed. Traffic is detoured to 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue via Grant and Hatch Street.

Improve the Sprague Avenue and Sherman Street intersection providing a transit hub to link the University District Bridge with Sprague Avenue. This project includes

construction of a multiuse (bicycles, pedestrians and transit) facility between Sprague and Sherman, new signals and pedestrian lighting, landscaping.

## This is a \$745,000 project.

# **STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS**

## ARTERIAL CRACK SEALING

- Thurston Avenue, Crestline to Perry Street
- Perry Street, Thurston to 43<sup>rd</sup> Avenue

## **GRIND AND OVERLAY**

The Street Department will start the Freya Street grind and overlay project between 37<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue on Monday, April 22. The intersection of 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Freya Street will be closed Monday and Tuesday from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Once this intersection is complete the crew will make their way south.

## POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

## STREET GRADING

- Crews are grinding the following alleys:
  - o 2700 & 3000 E. Diamond/Everett
  - 3000 E. Everett/Sanson
  - 2900-3100 E. Olympic/Wabash
  - o 1600 S. Grand/Tacoma
  - o 2400-2600 S. Grand/Latawah
  - o 2600 S. Grand/Hatch
  - o 2900, 3100, 3200 & 3800 E. 35th/36th

## **STREET SWEEPING**

- In preparation for Bloomsday crews are sweeping along the course! There are no parking signs at the following locations:
  - Riverside Avenue from Monroe Street to Government Way
  - o Lindeke Street from Summit Boulevard to Broadway Avenue
  - o Broadway Avenue from Lindeke to Monroe Street
- All sweeping crews are focused on the arterials, cleaning the winter sand on the sidewalks and islands. When that is complete we will start the residential routes.

## UTILITY CUT CREW

• Working throughout the city repairing sewer and water repairs.

# STREET PROJECTS

## 2<sup>ND</sup> & 3<sup>RD</sup> AVENUE STORMWATER PIPING

- The following streets are closed:
  - 3rd Avenue eastbound traffic will be restricted to one lane only through the Arthur Street intersection.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue will be restricted to one lane from Perry Street through the intersection of Arthur Street.
  - $\circ$  Arthur Street from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue will be closed.

This project will install new storm water piping on 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue from the Hamilton Street overpass to Perry Street and 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue from Hatch to Arthur Street.

## This is a \$1.7 million project.

## 2013 DOWNTOWN PEDESTRIAN IMPORVEMENTS

- Work on this project has resumed. Closures include:
  - Lane closures in the vicinity of Stevens Street and Sprague Avenue
  - Washington Street west parking lane closed in the vicinity of Sprague Avenue
  - First Avenue north parking lane closed in the vicinity of Stevens Street
  - Post Street east parking lane closed in the vicinity of Sprague Avenue
- Parking is not available along the southside of First Ave. between Monroe and Lincoln
- Parking is not available along the northside of First Ave. just east of the intersection of First Ave. and Stevens St.
- Parking is not available along the westside of Washington St. just north of the intersection of Sprague Ave. and Washington St.

Construct pedestrian improvements in the Downtown Spokane Core. Includes, in selected areas, structural sidewalk repair/replacement (vaults, non-vault related replacements/repairs, sidewalk removal/replacement, etc.), minor sidewalk repair, street tree infill, replacement of hazardous street tree grates, installation of bike racks, planters and garbage cans.

## The \$1.4 million project is funded with federal funds.

# **EUCLID AVENUE WATER AND SEWER FROM MARKET TO RALPH STREET**

• The following streets are closed:

- Euclid Avenue will be closed to eastbound traffic between Market and Freya Street.
- Ralph Street will be closed from Euclid to Courtland Avenue.

Project work includes relocating and encasing water and sewer mains in beneath BNSF the railroad tracks Euclid Ave. between Market St. and Ralph St. It also includes installation of new water main in Market Street between Euclid Ave. and Bridgeport Ave. and in Ralph Street from Euclid Ave. to Courtland Ave. Work will also impact Market Street North of Cleveland to Euclid. Utility construction on this project is associated with WSDOT's North South Corridor improvements.

## This is a \$2.4 million project.

## MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WAY/RIVERSIDE DRIVE PHASE 2B

• Martin Luther King Jr. Way from Trent Avenue to Sherman Street is closed.

This project constructs a new road from Erie to Perry Street including a new roundabout at Trent Avenue and Perry Street.

The \$2.5 million project is funded with local, state and federal funds.

## **RED BAND PARK RIVER ACCESS & PRIVACY SHELTER**

• No traffic restrictions

This project includes the installation of a rafting boat rail launch system into the Spokane River, located at Red Band Park (the old Glover Field) in Peaceful Valley. The project also includes the installation of a Privacy Shelter which will house Portable Bathroom Facilities.

## **SPRAGUE AVENUE GRIND & OVERLAY**

• A grind and overlay project has closed the south half of Sprague Avenue from Scott to Helena Street. The north half is open for two-way traffic.

## SUNSET BOULEVARD, ROYAL TO LINDEKE STREET

• Sunset Boulevard is reduced to one lane in each direction from F to Royal Street.

The City of Spokane will repave Sunset Blvd. between the intersections of Royal and Lindeke Street. This project will update the existing pavement surface by grinding the existing pavement down and overlaying it with new asphalt. The new surface will be striped with 3 vehicle lanes and 1 bicycle lane. There will be 2 travel lanes going uphill and one travel lane going downhill. A wide sidewalk with curb will be created along the north side of the roadway and a new bike lane will be installed on the south side of the roadway. Wheelchair ramps will be brought into ADA compliance and minor storm sewer upgrades and/or repairs will also be included in the project. Sunset Boulevard will remain open during construction.

This is a \$2.5 million project.

# WATER DEPARTMENT WORK

# HAMILTON STREET AND TRENT AVENUE

The Water Department is replacing a water main at the intersection of Hamilton Street and Trent Avenue.

- Hamilton Street traffic is reduced to one lane in each direction from Trent to Springfield Avenue.
- The intersection of Hamilton Street and Springfield will be completely closed to traffic on Monday, April 22 and Tuesday, April 23. Business access will be maintained via Columbus Street.
