20 MPH PARK ZONES

- 20 MPH seasonal speed limit signs have been installed at the following playgrounds:
 - o A.M. Cannon Park
 - o Audubon Park
 - o Chief Gary Park
 - o Comstock Park
 - Hays Park
 - o Lincoln Park
 - o Mission Park
 - o Shadle Park

The school year has ended which means more kids are at our local parks, pools and libraries. Drivers should slow down around parks, parks with splash pads, parks with pools, and libraries as speed limits are reduced for the summer. The Street Department has installed 20 MPH signs at eight select locations throughout the city.

COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

- Street closures include:
 - Riverside Avenue between Napa and Crestline Street remains closed.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.4 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

PEACEFUL VALLEY COMBINED SEWER OVERFUL (CSO) 25 PROJECT

- Crews are performing repairs at multiple intersections in the following order:
 - Clarke Avenue and Cedar Street
 - Main Avenue and Cedar Street

Each closure will have traffic control; please follow the detours and/or listen to the flaggers.

The project will result in new water, sanitary and storm sewer infrastructure. In addition, stormwater swales will be installed.

This project is funded with state funds.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - Lincoln Street between Main Avenue and Spokane Falls Boulevard is closed to traffic as crews construct the flow control chamber. Pedestrian access will remain open on the east side of Lincoln Street.
 - Drivers can still access the River Park Square parking garage via Lincoln Street.
 - There is no pedestrian access on Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe Street.
 - The right hand lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard between Post and Monroe Street has intermittent lane closures from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m. These intermittent closures will last through Thursday, June 27.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

Hoopfest is June 29 and 30. Closures for this event start Friday, June 28, 7 p.m. and last thorough Sunday, June 30, 10 p.m. The following streets will be closed:

Cars must be moved from these streets by 7 p.m. on Friday, June 28 or they will be towed. Monroe, Lincoln, Bernard, Browne and Division Street will be open throughout downtown Spokane.

Parking: The River Park Square parking garage will be accessible via Lincoln Street. Howard Street will be open from First to Main Avenue for those parking at the Parkade.

Alternative Transportation: The STA Plaza will be closed to bus traffic; the <u>alternative loading</u> <u>zones</u> are on Howard Street between 1st and 4th Avenue and 2nd and 3rd Avenue between Wall and Stevens Street. STA is also running two <u>Hoop Loops</u>: Riverside Loop and Jefferson Loop. These shuttles will run every 10 minutes. Lime scooters and bicycles will not be permitted within the event boundaries.

Check- in: Hoopfest check-in is at the Bennett Block. Drivers should expect increased traffic on Thursday, June 27, 3 -7 p.m. and Friday, June 28, 11 a.m. – 7 p.m.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The southbound lane of Freya Street between 18th and 21st will be closed from 5/22/19-6/21/19 for Sefnco Communications work.
- The southbound lane of Colton Street between Dalke and Frances Avenue will be closed from 6/3/19-6/21/19 for MGM Grand work.
- Washington Street will have lane closures between 3rd and 2nd Avenue from 6/10/19-6/21/19 for Quanta Work.

- The westbound lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard will be closed from Pine to Division Street between 6/26/19-6/27/19 for Trenchless Sewer Rehab work.

- The south travel lane of 3rd Avenue between Lincoln and Howard Street will be closed from 6/3/19-7/3/19 for Avista work.
- The northbound inside lane of Indian Trail Road between Weile and Excell will be closed from 6/3/19-7/8/19 for CenturyLink work.
- The westbound travel lane of 44th Avenue will be closed between Regal Street and Sheri Court from 6/10/19-7/9/19 for Quanta work.
- Full closure of 4th and 5th Avenue from Wall to Stevens Street from 6/20/19-7/13/19 for Garco Construction.
- The northbound curb lane of Nevada Avenue will be closed between Cozza Drive and Sharpsburg Avenue from 6/17/19-7/19/19 for Sefnco Communications.
- The sidewalk on 5th Ave between Jefferson and Monroe and STA bus stop in that location closed from 10/2/18-11/2/19 for building construction.
- The curb lanes of 1st Avenue between Lincoln and Post (only one lane at a time) will be closed intermittently from 1/1/19-12/31/19 for steam plant remediation.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

2013 DOWNTOWN PEDESTRIAN IMPORVEMENTS

• This project is substantially complete!

Construct pedestrian improvements in the Downtown Spokane Core. Includes, in selected areas, structural sidewalk repair/replacement (vaults, non-vault related replacements/repairs, sidewalk removal/replacement, etc.), minor sidewalk repair, street tree infill, replacement of hazardous street tree grates, and installation of bike racks, planters and garbage cans.

The \$1.4 million project is funded with federal funds.

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- Central Promenade: The Central Promenade is open, beginning the evening of Friday, June 21! Just in time for Hoopfest. The Central Promenade will allow pedestrians and cyclists to travel directly north/south through the park again, connecting the blue and orange bridges. Thank you for your patience taking extra steps around redevelopment.
- North Bank: The North Suspension bridge is closed for renovation/maintenance, and the new North Promenade is now open featuring an Expo butterfly! Work on the North Bank playground is underway, with site preparation taking place this summer. The playground is anticipated to open late summer 2020.
- Pavilion: The Pavilion will open this fall, as a multi-use event space featuring shade elements, river views from a 40' elevated platform, and nearly 600 light blades to create the community's lantern.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

CRACK SEALING

- Cluster Et Al south of 37th Avenue
- Maple/Ash Street from Boone Avenue to Northwest Boulevard

GRIND AND OVERLAY

<u>Regal Street, 29th to 39th Avenue</u>
Work continues on this project with periodic lane closures. Southeast Boulevard will be closed at times with a detour.

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET GRADING

- Crews are grinding the following alleys:

STREET SWEEPING

- All sweeping crews are finishing the arterials and starting residential sweeping.
 - Northwest: Rt. 3, Monroe to Ash, Wellesley to Francis
 - Northeast: Rt. 31, Crestline to Division, Francis to Newport Highway
 - South: Rt. 47, 14th to 29th Avenue, Oak to Grand Blvd

UTILITY CUT CREW

• Working throughout the city repairing sewer and water repairs.

STREET PROJECTS

2ND & 3RD AVENUE STORMWATER PIPING

- The following streets are closed:
 - 3rd Avenue eastbound traffic will be restricted to one lane only through the Arthur Street intersection.
 - 2nd Avenue will be restricted to one lane from Perry Street through the intersection of Arthur Street.
 - \circ Arthur Street from 3rd to 2nd Avenue will be closed.

This project will install new storm water piping on 2nd Avenue from the Hamilton Street overpass to Perry Street and 3rd Avenue from Hatch to Arthur Street.

This is a \$1.7 million project.

CENTRAL AVENUE WELL #2 REHABILITATION

• Normandie Street is closed between Central and Dalke Avenue.

This project will upgrade and modernize the station with a new building housing and a single pump and motor.

This is a \$995,000 project funded with federal funds.

EUCLID AVENUE WATER AND SEWER FROM MARKET TO RALPH STREET

• Euclid Avenue is closed to traffic between Ralph and Market Street. Please follow the traffic restrictions.

Project work includes relocating and encasing water and sewer mains in beneath BNSF the railroad tracks Euclid Ave. between Market St. and Ralph St. It also includes installation of new water main in Market Street between Euclid Ave. and Bridgeport Ave. and in Ralph Street from Euclid Ave. to Courtland Ave. Work will also impact

Market Street North of Cleveland to Euclid. Utility construction on this project is associated with WSDOT's North South Corridor improvements.

This is a \$2.4 million project.

FIVE MILE ROAD FROM LINCOLN TO STRONG ROAD

• Five Mile Road is closed between Lincoln and Strong Road. Cars are not permitted; please use the detour route in place, which utilizes Johannsen Road and Cedar Street.

This project will include full depth pavement restoration on Five Mile Road, from Lincoln to Strong. The project includes the installation of ADA ramps at intersections and crosswalks, replacement of an 18" steel water main (from Lincoln to Strong), stormwater improvements (swales and trees), installation of pedestrian illumination at Five Mile and Strong Road, and the installation of a roundabout at the intersection of Five Mile and Strong Road.

This is a \$2.7 million project.

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WAY/RIVERSIDE DRIVE PHASE 2B

• Martin Luther King Jr. Way is open. Punch list items remain.

This project constructs a new road from Erie to Perry Street including a new roundabout at Trent Avenue and Perry Street.

The \$2.5 million project is funded with local, state and federal funds.

NEIGHBORHOOD TRAFFIC CALMING (CYCLE 6)

• Crews are working near Shadle High School at Longfellow Avenue and Oak Street. There are no closures but drivers should expect delays.

This project includes construction of traffic calming improvements at various locations.

The \$698,000 project is funded with local funds.

RESIDENTIAL CHIP SEAL

- Crews are chip sealing in three residential locations:
 - <u>Stonewall/Dakota</u> Crews will be working in the area bound by Lincoln Road to Vicksburg Avenue and Nevada Street to Antietam Drive.

- Joseph/Elm Crews will be working in the area bound by Central to Rowan Avenue and Ash to Belt Street.
- Fiske Crews will be working in the area bound by Ray to Regal Street and 33rd to 36th Avenue.

SPOKANE STREET PRESERVATION NORTH

- <u>Sprague Avenue, Scott to Helena Street</u> Sprague Avenue is open; punch list items remain.
- <u>Maple/Ash Street, Rowan Avenue to Country Holmes Boulevard</u> There are lane closures on Maple/Ash Street between Francis Avenue and Cedar Street.

SPRAGUE AVENUE REBUILD PHASE 2

• Sprague Avenue is closed between Scott and Grant Street. 1st Avenue is serving as the detour route; business access is open!

This project includes water, sewer, and stormwater utilities, new sidewalk, and roadway reconstruction. There will also be utility work in Grant Street and Riverside Avenue from Sprague Avenue to the University Bridge landing.

This is a \$3.1 million project.

SUNSET BOULEVARD, ROYAL TO LINDEKE STREET

• Sunset Boulevard is open to traffic.

The City of Spokane will repave Sunset Blvd. between the intersections of Royal and Lindeke Street. This project will update the existing pavement surface by grinding the existing pavement down and overlaying it with new asphalt. The new surface will be striped with 3 vehicle lanes and 1 bicycle lane. There will be 2 travel lanes going uphill and one travel lane going downhill. A wide sidewalk with curb will be created along the north side of the roadway and a new bike lane will be installed on the south side of the roadway. Wheelchair ramps will be brought into ADA compliance and minor storm sewer upgrades and/or repairs will also be included in the project. Sunset Boulevard will remain open during construction.

This is a \$2.5 million project.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

I-90 HAMILTON WESTBOUND ON-RAMP DECK REPAIR

• The I-90 westbound on-ramp is closed.

US 195 – THORPE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

• Single lane closures Mondays through Fridays. Northbound lane closures between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. and southbound lane closures to happen between 6 a.m. and 3 p.m.

US 2 - HAYFORD ROAD TO DEER HEIGHTS ROAD - MEDIAN CHANNELIZATION

- The center two-way left turn lane is closed is closed from Deer Heights to Hayford Road.
- Drivers should also expect lane closures during the hours of 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.
