CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

[33RD AVENUE FROM BERNARD TO DIVISION STREET](#)

- This project is substantially complete!

This project includes pavement reconstruction and a grind and overlay. The project will replace a sewer main, water distribution main and water transmission main.

This is a \$1.3 million project funded with local funds.

[CENTRAL AVENUE WELL #2 REHABILITATION](#)

- Normandie Street will be closed between Central and Dalke Avenue from Friday, Oct. 18 to Wednesday, Oct. 23.

This project will upgrade and modernize the station with a new building housing and a single pump and motor.

This is a \$995,000 project funded with federal funds.

[CLARKE AVENUE SEWER LIFT STATION](#)

- There are no traffic impacts but residents near the sewer lift station at Clarke Avenue and Bennett Avenue should anticipate noise from the pumps needed during the repair work. The pumps will run 24 hours a day for about 3 weeks.

This project will refurbish the Clarke Avenue Sewer Lift Station.

DEER HEIGHTS ROUNDABOUT

- Traffic revisions are in place on U.S. 2 near Deer Heights Road.
 - Eastbound traffic is scheduled to be shifted into the permanent alignment the week of Monday, Oct. 21.
 - Westbound traffic is anticipated to be shifted into the permanent alignment the week of Monday, Nov. 4.

This project includes construction of a roundabout at U.S. 2 and Deer Heights Road.

This is a \$1.5 million project funded with local and developer funds.

DRISCOLL SIDEWALK FROM WELLESLEY AVE. TO BISMARCK PL.

- Lane widths will be reduced on Driscoll Blvd. from Wellesley to Bismark during construction of the project.

The project includes installation of approximately 2,700 feet of sidewalks and 12 ADA ramps.

This is a \$375,000 project funded with Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) and Transportation Benefit District (TBD) funds.

ERIE STORMWATER FACILITY FROM FRONT AVENUE TO TRENT AVENUE

- Erie Street is closed from Trent Avenue to Denver Street.

The project includes construction of a new stormwater facility including bio-infiltration swales and related drainage structures.

This is a \$2.1 million project funded with local and Washington State Department of Ecology funds.

FIVE MILE ROAD FROM LINCOLN TO STRONG ROAD

- Five Mile Road is closed between Lincoln and Strong Road. Paving is anticipated the week of Monday, Oct. 21.

This project will include full depth pavement restoration on Five Mile Road, from Lincoln to Strong. The project includes the installation of ADA ramps at intersections and crosswalks, replacement of an 18" steel water main (from Lincoln to Strong), stormwater improvements (swales and trees), installation of pedestrian illumination at Five Mile and Strong Road, and the installation of a roundabout at the intersection of Five Mile and Strong Road.

This is a \$2.7 million project.

MAPLE STREET GATEWAY AND 4TH AVENUE LIVING WALL

- The parking lane along 4th Avenue between Wall and Lincoln Street is closed to accommodate a lane shift for this project.
- The Maple Street left turn lane at 5th Avenue will be periodically closed.

This project includes landscaping improvements adjacent to the I-90 viaduct.

The \$375,000 project is funded with local funds.

NEIGHBORHOOD TRAFFIC CALMING PROJECTS

- There will be some traffic impacts at the following locations:
 - Manito Boulevard and 25th Avenue
 - 18th Avenue and Bernard Street
 - 43rd Avenue at Conklin, Arthur and Ivory StreetThis location includes the installation of traffic circles.

This project includes installation of sidewalks, driveways, wheelchair ramps drainage structures, and storm sewer.

The \$1 million project is funded with local funds.

RESIDENTIAL GRIND & OVERLAY

- Crews are working at Lindeke Street from Driscoll to Northwest Boulevard completing patching, pre-leveling and crack sealing.

This project includes grind and overlay and ADA ramp reconstruction where necessary.

This is a \$1.3 million project funded with local funds.

RIVER INFILTRATION REDUCTION – CIPP REHABILITATION

This project will repair several wastewater main line and lateral service pipes by installing pipe linings and repairing side service to mainline connections. A Cure In Place Pipe lining system will be used to repair existing pipes and connections. In general, project limits include the area south of Mission Ave., east of the Spokane River, west of Helena St. and north of Cataldo Ave. These improvements will reduce the amount of groundwater infiltration into the municipal wastewater system.

This is a \$744,900 project funded with Washington State department of Ecology funds.

SPOTTED ROAD TO ALLMAN ROAD SEWER REPLACEMENT

- Work continues on this project.

This project will replace a deteriorated 12-inch sewer pipe with a new 15-inch pipe in the same location.

This is a \$619,000 project.

SPRAGUE AVENUE REBUILD PHASE 2

- Sprague Avenue is closed between Scott and Grant Street. 1st Avenue is serving as the detour route; business access is open!

This project includes water, sewer, and stormwater utilities, new sidewalk, and roadway reconstruction. There will also be utility work in Grant Street and Riverside Avenue from Sprague Avenue to the University Bridge landing.

This is a \$3.1 million project.

COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

I-07C & CSO 34-1 CONTROL FACILITIES

- Crestline Street between Riverside and Sprague Avenue will be closed until Friday, Oct. 18, to accommodate the sewer bypass pumping required to activate the new CSO tank.

I-07c work is to construct a 200,000 gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank and CSO 34-1 work is to construct a 1.4 million gallon CSO tank. These projects are part of the “It’s all about the River” program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

I-07c is a \$2.8 million project and CSO 34-1 is a \$13 million project.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - Lincoln Street between Main Avenue and Spokane Falls Boulevard is closed to traffic as crews construct the flow control chamber.
 - Thursday, Oct. 17, 6 a.m. to 4 p.m., the right lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard will be closed between Post and Monroe Street for light pole installation.
 - **Friday, Oct. 25 the right lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard between Post and Monroe Street will be closed for the [Cleaner River Faster Celebration](#).**

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The east shoulder of Indian Trail Road between Strong Road and Lowell Avenue will be closed from 9/3/19-10/18/19 for Sefnco work. Indian Trail will have flaggers when a full closure is needed.
- The southbound lane of Howard between Spokane Falls and Main will be closed from 10/14/19-10/18/19 for M & L Construction work.
- The west curb lane of Monroe Street will be closed between 1st and 2nd Avenue on 10/19/19 for A1 Tree Service work.
- The southbound curb lane of Division Street between Cozza and Cascade Way from 10/9/19-10/23/19 for Avista work.
- The west curb lane of Monroe Street will be closed between 2nd and 5th Avenue from 10/15/19-10/23/19 for CenturyLink work.
- Both east and west outside curbside travel lanes of Indian Trail will be closed (at separate times) between Weile and Excell from 10/17/19-10/23/19 for Bouten work.
- The south curb lane of Sprague will be closed between Adams and Cedar Street from 10/21/19-10/24/19 for Avista work.
- The west curb lane of Monroe Street between Boone Avenue and Summit Pkwy will be closed from 10/14/19-10/25/19 for Bacon Concrete work.
- The east curb travel lane of Monroe between Sinto and Maxwell, as well as the west curb travel lane of Monroe between Maxwell and Augusta will be closed from 10/14/19-10/25/19 for Bacon Concrete work.
- Eastbound Broadway Avenue between Cedar and Adams Street will be shifted into the median lane between 9/27/19-10/27/19 for Avista work.
- The north curb lane of 2nd Avenue between Monroe and Stevens will be closed from 10/14/19-10/28/19 for Quanta work.
- The west curb lane of Monroe Street between 3rd and 4th will be closed from 10/14/19-10/28/19 for Quanta work.
- The north curb lane of 3rd Avenue between Sherman and Hatch from 10/15/19-10/28/19 for Avista work.
- The southbound lane of Cedar between 14th and 17th Avenue will be shifted over into the median from 10/16/19-10/29/19 for Avista work.
- The east curb lane of Stevens will be closed between 1st and 4th Avenue and the west curb lane of Washington Street between 3rd and 6th Avenue will be closed from 10/16/19-10/30/19 for Quanta work.
- Holland between Dakota and Nevada will be closed 1 lane at a time from 10/9/19-11/1/19 for Quanta work.

- The west and east curb lane of Monroe between Sharp and Gardner will be closed from 10/14/19-11/01/19 for Bacon Concrete work.
- The sidewalk on 5th Ave between Jefferson and Monroe and STA bus stop in that location closed from 10/2/18-11/2/19 for building construction.
- The westbound curb lane of Francis Avenue between Pittsburg and Perry Street will be closed from 10/7/19-11/4/19 for CenturyLink work.
- The curb lanes of 1st Avenue between Lincoln and Post (only one lane at a time) will be closed intermittently from 1/1/19-12/31/19 for steam plant remediation.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

MANITO PARK MIRROR POND

- The next phase of work on the Manito Pond Mirror Pond master plan gets underway soon. [Read details here](#). Thank you for your patience during renovations while we create a healthier pond!

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- [Pavilion](#): The Pavilion is open as of Friday, Sept. 6. Thank you for your patience during construction!
- [North Bank](#): The North Suspension bridge is closed for renovation/maintenance. Work on the North Bank playground is underway with site preparation. The playground is anticipated to open fall 2020.

SOUTH GORGE TRAIL PHASE 1

- Project continues with base lift asphalt being placed and trail work.

This project includes construction of a 10-foot pedestrian trail, pavement and water main reconstruction of Clarke Avenue, and stormwater mitigation at various locations.

This is a \$3.5 million project.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

ALTAMONT STREET UNDERPASS CLOSURE

- The Altamont Street railroad underpass near Main Avenue in East Spokane is closed after being struck by a semi-truck. The railroad bridge sustained significant damage and will remain closed until Union Pacific can make the needed repairs.

GRIND AND OVERLAY

- **Hamilton Street, Trent to Desmet Avenue**
Work continues on this project. Drivers should expect delays and consider an alternative route.

POTHOLE CREWS

- City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STORM CLEANUP

- City crews are continuing tree removal efforts.
- The City of Spokane will provide free disposal of trees and tree limbs that came down during the storm at the Waste to Energy Facility, 2900 S. Geiger Blvd., through Saturday, Oct. 19. Free disposal is available for City of Spokane residents only, not commercial landscaping and yard care businesses.

STREET SWEEPING

- All sweeping crews are finishing the arterials and starting residential sweeping.
 - Northwest: Rt. 6, Francis to Wellesley, Ash to A St.
 - Northeast: Rt. 24, Mission to Empire, Ruby to Perry.
 - South: Rt. 43, 29th to 53rd, Perry to Regal.

UTILITY CUT CREW

- Working throughout the city repairing sewer and water repairs.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

US 395 – NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR – BNSF 2ND RAILROAD REALIGNMENT

- **Westbound Euclid Avenue is closed to traffic between Freya and Wellesley Avenue. Detours are in place.**
- The following streets are permanently closed:
 - Bridgeport, Cleveland and Fairview Avenue between Ralph and Market Street
 - Grace, Marietta, and Jackson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street
- Drivers will have east/west access on Upriver, Carlisle and Euclid Avenue.
