Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

ERIE STORMWATER FACILITY FROM FRONT AVENUE TO TRENT AVENUE

• Erie Street from Trent Avenue to Denver Street is open!

The project includes construction of a new stormwater facility including bio-infiltration swales and related drainage structures.

This is a \$2.1 million project funded with local and Washington State Department of Ecology funds.

FIVE MILE ROAD FROM LINCOLN TO STRONG ROAD

• Five Mile Road between Lincoln and Strong Road will reopen Wednesday, Nov. 26.

This project will include full depth pavement restoration on Five Mile Road, from Lincoln to Strong. The project includes the installation of ADA ramps at intersections and crosswalks, replacement of an 18" steel water main (from Lincoln to Strong), stormwater improvements (swales and trees), installation of pedestrian illumination at Five Mile and Strong Road, and the installation of a roundabout at the intersection of Five Mile and Strong Road.

This is a \$2.7 million project.

SPRAGUE AVENUE REBUILD PHASE 2

• Sprague Avenue is closed between Scott and Grant Street. 1st Avenue is serving as the detour route; businesses are open!

This project includes water, sewer, and stormwater utilities, new sidewalk, and roadway reconstruction. There will also be utility work in Grant Street and Riverside Avenue from Sprague Avenue to the University Bridge landing.

This is a \$3.1 million project.

COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) CONSTRUCTION

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction proceeds on the 2.2 million-gallon CSO tank by the Downtown Library.
 - Lincoln Street between Main Avenue and Spokane Falls Boulevard is closed to traffic as crews construct the flow control chamber. One temporary southbound lane will open for the winter on Friday, Dec. 13.
 - The left lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard between Post and Monroe Street will be closed from Monday, Dec 2 to Friday, Dec. 6.
 - Crews continue to work in the plaza on Spokane Falls Boulevard. The plaza will be closed for the winter to protect it from damage from ice melt.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Both curbside travel lanes in each direction of Mission between Greene and Trent will be closed from 11/25/19 to 11/29/19 for T Lariviere Work.
- Wall Street between Sprague and 1st Avenue is closed, as well as the north curbside lane of 1st Avenue between Wall and Post Street until 12/10/19 (7 p.m. – 6 a.m. work hours) for Zero dB Communications work.
- Monroe between Mallon and College will be reduced to one lane in each direction from 11/25/19 to 12/2/19 between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. for Premier West Construction work.
- The northbound land of Barnes west of Rustle Road will be closed and traffic will be flagged in both directions from 11/18/19 to 12/3/19 for Avista work.
- The northbound lane of Hatch between Hangman Valley Road and Highland Park Drive will be closed to traffic will be flagged in both directions from 11/20/19 to 12/5/19 for Avista work.
- Rich Avenue between Market and Rebecca Street will be closed 12/3/19 to 12/6/19 for Halme Construction work; Freya Street will be open and have flaggers in place.
- The southbound lane of Hatch between Torrino and Blackwood will be closed and traffic will be flagged in both directions from 11/21/19 to 12/6/19 for Avista work.

- Erie between Martin Luther King Jr. Way and Trent will be flagged in both directions from 11/25/19 to 12/10/19 for Avista work.
- Trent between Springfield and Ralph will be briefly flagged in both directions from 11/26/19 to 12/11/19 for Avista work.
- Wall Street between 2nd Avenue and the Steam Plant Alley and the right lane of 2nd Avenue between Howard and Lincoln Street will be closed from 12/4/19 to 12/12/19 between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- The east curbside lane of Nevada Street between Holland and Jay will be closed from 11/18/19 to 12/13/19 for Quanta work.
- The east curbside lane of Maple Street between Nora and Knox will be closed from 11/25/19 to 12/13/19 for Sefnco Communications work.
- The westbound curb lane of Euclid Avenue will be closed between Ferrall and Market Street from 12/2/19 to 12/16/19 between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. for Terra Technologies LLC work.
- The curb lanes of 1st Avenue between Lincoln and Post (only one lane at a time) will be closed intermittently from 1/1/19 to 12/31/19 for steam plant remediation.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

MANITO PARK MIRROR POND

• The next phase of work on the Manito Pond Mirror Pond master plan gets underway soon. <u>Read details here</u>. Thank you for your patience during renovations while we create a healthier pond!

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- <u>North Bank</u>: The North Suspension bridge is closed for renovation. Work on the North Bank playground is underway with site preparation. The playground is anticipated to open spring 2021.
- West Havermale: An inclusive playground funded by Providence Health Care is anticipated to open fall 2020, along with a renovated Theme Stream from Expo '74 and enhanced connectivity to the Centennial Trail.

SOUTH GORGE TRAIL PHASE 1

• Work continues on this project; there are no traffic impacts.

This project includes construction of a 10-foot pedestrian trail, pavement and water main reconstruction of Clarke Avenue, and stormwater mitigation at various locations.

This is a \$3.5 million project.

LEAF PICKUP

POTHOLE CREWS

• Citizens are asked to park on the odd side of the street in residential areas for snow season, which runs from November 15 to March 15.
