CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

CENTRAL AVENUE WELL #2 REHABILITATION

Normandie Street between Central and Dalke Avenue will remain closed until Friday, Feb. 21.

This project will upgrade and modernize the station with a new building housing and a single pump and motor.

This is a \$995,000 project funded with federal funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The northbound lane of Driscoll Blvd just south of Wellesley will be closed between 2/10/2020 to 2/21/2020 for Avista to replace a damaged pole.
- The northbound curb lane of Monroe is closed between Kiernan and Garland from 2/10/2020 to 2/21/2020 for Quanta work.
- The southbound lane of Bernard between 29th and 31st is closed from 2/10/2020 to 2/21/2020 for Avista work, two way traffic will be maintained.
- **Westbound Mission Ave between Upriver Dr and Perry St will be closed from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on 2/25/2020 for an emergency BNSF repair. A detour will be in place at Greene St.**
- **The north travel lane of 3rd Ave. between Pine and Cowley St. is closed until 2/26/2020 for CenturyLink work.**
- The southbound lane of Lincoln between 20th and 21st will be closed and traffic will be flagged from 2/17/2020 to 2/28/2020 for Avista work.
- **Rockwood Blvd between Upper Terrace Rd and Garfield St will be flagged in both directions until 2/28/2020 for Avista work.**

- Grandview Ave between Garden Springs Rd and 18th Ave will be closed from 2/24/2020 to 2/28/2020 for Eco Excavating work.
- The Perry St and Indiana Ave intersection will have lane shifts from 2/24/2020 to 2/28/2020 for CenturyLink work.
- The south curbside lane and parking spots on Sprague Ave between Lincoln and Wall St will be closed from 2/24/2020 to 2/28/2020 for CenturyLink work.
- The northbound lane of Bernard St between 19th and 17th Ave will be closed and traffic will be flagged in both directions from 2/24/2020 to 2/28/2020 for Sefnco work.
- The northbound curb lane of Hamilton St is closed between Spokane Falls Blvd and Springfield Ave until 3/3/2020 for Quanta work.
- The east curbside lane of Maple St between 4th and 6th Ave is closed until 3/3/2020 for Quanta work.
- The north travel lane of Main Ave between Division and Pine St is closed until 3/4/20 for Quanta work.
- Northbound Howard will have a lane shift between Cataldo and Boone and Cataldo is completely closed between Howard and Washington from 2/10/2020 to 3/6/2020 for Quanta work.
- The southbound curb lane of Northwest Boulevard between Buckeye and Grace is closed from 2/10/2020 to 3/9/2020 for Sounders Cable work.
- The westbound curb lane of Francis Ave between Indian Trail Rd and A St is closed until 3/13/2020 for Quanta work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Boone Ave between Howard and Normandie St will be closed from 2/24/2020 to 3/24/2020 for Avista work.

PEDESTRIAN AND BIKEWAYS

MANITO PARK MIRROR POND

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- **North Bank:** Work on the North Bank [playground, wheels park, parking lot, and basketball court](#) is underway. The playground is anticipated to open spring 2021. Some pathways are impacted, along with the closure of Parking lot 1 off Washington Street and North River Drive during construction. [View a map](#).
- **West Havermale:** An [inclusive playground](#) funded by Providence Health Care is anticipated to open fall 2020, along with a renovated Theme Stream from Expo '74 and enhanced connectivity to the Centennial Trail. STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

POTHOLE CREWS

- City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

SNOW REMOVAL

- Citizens are asked to park on the odd side of the street in residential areas for snow season, which runs from November 15 to March 15.

US 395 – NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR (NSC) – BNSF 2ND RAILROAD REALIGNMENT

- The three-year Wellesley Avenue closure between Market and Freya Street is in place.
- The following streets are permanently closed:
 - Bridgeport, Cleveland and Fairview Avenue between Ralph and Market Street
 - Grace, Marietta, and Jackson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street
- Drivers have east/west access on Francis, Upriver, Carlisle, and Euclid Avenue.
