CITY OF SPOKANE OBSTRUCTION NOTICE

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June 26 – July 3, 2020

- Some construction projects have been suspended during the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order and others are on different schedules. Please be prepared for changes in street obstructions.

Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

37TH AVENUE SIDEWALK, MANITO BOULEVARD TO LATAWAH STREET

• This project is substantially complete; crews are working on punch list items.

This project will construct a six-foot sidewalk on south side of 37th Avenue, to include ADA curb ramps and storm drain modifications as required.

This is a \$430,000 project funded with local and state funds.

CINCINNATI GREENWAY SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARAD TO EUCLID AVENUE

• Work on this project is wrapping up; crews will be paving the intersection of North Foothills Drive and Cincinnati Street. Drivers should expect lane closures. They are also working on sidewalk pours.

This project will add greenway elements to Cincinnati Street.

This is a \$567,428 project.

FIVE MILE ROAD FROM LINCOLN TO STRONG ROAD

Crews are working on swales.

This project included full depth pavement restoration on Five Mile Road, from Lincoln to Strong.

This is a \$2.7 million project.

HAMILTON STREET CORRIDOR SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

- Construction on a project to improve safety along the Hamilton Street Corridor from Desmet Avenue to North Foothills Drive starts Monday, June 29.
- The following streets will be closed for two weeks:
 - Mission Avenue, Hamilton to Columbus Street
 - Desmet Avenue, Cincinnati to Columbus Street
- Hamilton Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction at the Mission and Desmet Avenue intersections.
- Additional Hamilton lane closures may occur for night work, 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

The project is designed to make safety and traffic flow improvements at six intersections, including the addition of dedicated left turn pockets and signals.

This is a \$3.3 million project funded with local and federal funds.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed.
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed and half of the adjacent parking lot.
- Parking is limited on Post Street, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south
 of the bridge is closed.
- The bridge will open in 2022. See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

ROWAN WATER & SEWER FORCE MAIN FROM HAVEN STREET TO MYRTLE STREET

- There is a water leak at the intersection of Haven Street and Rowan Avenue. Starting Monday, June 29, there will be a single lane closure for Haven, at which may turn into a full closure, it depends where the leak is.
- The two week closure planned at the intersection of Rowan Avenue and Market Street has been postponed.
- Rowan Avenue between Haven and Market Street remains closed as crews work on sanitary sewer installations.

This project will relocate city utilities associated with construction of the North South Corridor.

This is a \$3.5 million project funded with state funds.

SPOKANE ARTERIAL CURB RAMPS - NORTH

- Crews are doing removals at the following locations
 - Nevada Street, Sharpsburg to Vicksburg Avenue
 - Hamilton Street, Springfield to Cataldo Avenue
- Next week, crews will be in these locations pouring new ramps.

This project will update curb ramps for ADA compliance on streets where the Street Department is doing grind and overlay projects.

This is a \$1.1 million project funded with local funds.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Punch list work on top of the plaza has started.
- Lincoln Street is closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Main Avenue. This closure will be in place until September 2020.
- Crews will continue preparing for a bypass on the project and installing permanent drainage near the loading dock of the Spokane Public Library the week of Monday, June 29. The CSO 26 bypass is scheduled to begin on Monday, July 6.

This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank includes a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

This is a \$20 million project funded with City Utility funds.

STREET PRESERVATION - NORTH

• Mission Avenue between Greene Street and Trent Avenue will open by the end of June. Trent Avenue will serve as the detour route.

The grind and overlay project will also update curb ramps for ADA compliance. This is a federally funded project and is separate from our regular grind and overlay projects.

This is a \$1.4 million project funded with federal funds.

EVENTS

 - The following streets will be closed:
 - o Summit Parkway between Cedar Street and Jefferson Lane
 - Adams Lane north of Summit Parkway

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Regal Street between 44th Avenue and Palouse Highway will have night work and flaggers in place from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. until 6/26/2020.
- Belt Street between Everett and Sanson Avenue will be temporarily closed and flagged when needed from 5/28/2020 to 6/28/2020 for Avista work.
- The east curb lane of Nevada Street, as well as the inside travel lane of Francis at the intersection of Nevada and Francis will be closed from 6/23/2020 to 6/28/2020 for M&L Construction work.
- The west curb lane of Washington Street between Second and First Avenue will be closed from 6/22/2020 to 6/29/2020 for CenturyLink work.
- Avista will be working on Riverside Avenue between Howard and Stevens Street.
 - The eastbound curb lane will be closed on 6/29/2020 and 6/30/2020.
 - The westbound curb lane will be closed on 7/1/2020 and 7/2/2020.
 - The eastbound and westbound center lanes will be closed for night work from 6/29/2020 to 7/1/2020.
- The south curbside lane of Eight Avenue between Bernard and Washington Street will be closed on 6/12/2020 to 7/10/2020 for Avista work.
- Both curb lanes of Havana Street between Mission and Boone Avenue will be closed from 6/23/2020 to 7/23/2020 for Quanta work.
- The northbound curb lane of Nevada Street between Holland Avenue and Newport Highway will be closed from 6/29/2020 to 7/29/2020 for Avista work.

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- North Bank: Work on the North Bank playground, wheels park, parking lot, and basketball court is underway. The playground is anticipated to open spring 2021. Some pathways are impacted, along with the closure of Parking lot 1 off Washington Street and North River Drive during construction. Until early July, the sidewalk along the west side of Washington Street is detoured to the east side, between Upriver Drive and the tunnel at the Pavilion. View a map.
- West Havermale: An <u>inclusive playground</u> funded by Providence Health Care is anticipated to open fall 2020, along with a renovated Theme Stream from Expo '74 and enhanced connectivity to the Centennial Trail. Parking lot 6 in this area is closed during

construction of the Post St. Bridge, but a few spaces will re-open for access to the playground this fall. View a map.

SPOKANE TRANSIT AUTHORITY'S CITY LINE

- Avista Work
 - Riverside Avenue between Post and Wall Street will be closed for eight weeks starting Monday, July 6 for Avista vault work in preparation for the <u>City Line</u>. The street will be open to bus and pedestrian traffic.

ALLEY CREW

• Crews will be working in the northeast sections of the city.

CRACK SEALING

- Arterial Crack Sealing
 - Rockwood Boulevard, Cowley to Southeast Boulevard.
- Residential Crack Sealing
 - Hartley, Royal to Lyons.
 - Joseph/Washington et al.

GRIND AND OVERLAY

- Crews will be fog sealing the center turn lanes on the following streets:
 - Northwest Boulevard, Monroe to Maple Street.
 - o Indiana Avenue, Division to Monroe Street.
 - Hamilton Street, Trent to Desmet Avenue.
 - Nevada Street, Sharpsburg Avenue to Magnesium Road.
 - o 29th Avenue, Freya to Havana Street (parking strips)
 - o Cowley Street, Fourth to Seventh Avenue
 - Hamilton Street, Desmet to Indiana Avenue (after grind and overlay)
 - o Regal Street, 29th to 33rd Avenue
 - Regal Street, 39th to 46th Avenue (after grind and overlay)
 - Maple/Ash Street, Garland to Longfellow Avenue

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1.**Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

- All sweeping crews are finishing the arterials and starting residential sweeping.
 - Northwest: Rt. 13, Winston Ct. to NW Blvd., Assembly to NW Blvd. Rt. 14, Wellesley to Francis, Assembly to Driscoll Blvd.
 - o Northeast: Rt. 30, Francis to Wellesley, Nevada to Division.
 - o South: Rt. 43, 9th to 53rd, Perry to Regal.

UTILITY CREW

Crews will be working throughout the city on water and sewer repairs.

ADDITIONAL WORK

• Bridge crews will be working on various sections of the Maple Street Bridge as well as other projects.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

I-90 – SPRAGUE AVENUE INTERCHANGE TO ARAGONNE ROAD INTERCHANGE

- Work hours will be 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday Thursday. Drivers should expect delays.
- The Freya Street eastbound I-90 on-ramp is closed drivers will be detoured to the Custer on-ramp.

<u>I-90 – US 2 GARDEN SPRINGS TO BROADWAY AVE – RAMP METERS</u>

- Five new ramp meters will be constructed. Eastbound I-90 ramp meter locations:
 - Walnut St.
 - Monroe St.
 - Division St.
 - Hamilton St.
 - US 195 constructed and will be operational spring 2019

Westbound I-90 on ramps include Division (Browne) St. only.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC BNSF 2ND RAILROAD REALIGNMENT

- The three-year Wellesley Avenue closure between Market and Freya Street began Nov. 21, 2019.
- The following streets are permanently closed:
 - o Bridgeport, Cleveland and Fairview Avenue between Ralph and Market Street
 - o Grace, Marietta, and Jackson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street
- Drivers have east/west access on Francis, Upriver, Carlisle, and Euclid Avenue.

SR 290 – SPOKANE RIVER EAST TRENT BRIDGE

• Trent Avenue is closed between Hamilton Street and North Iron Court. <u>Detours</u> for large trucks, light vehicles and pedestrians will be in place.
