Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

37TH AVENUE SIDEWALK, MANITO BOULEVARD TO LATAWAH STREET

• This project is substantially complete; crews are working on punch list items.

This project will construct a six-foot sidewalk on south side of 37th Avenue, to include ADA curb ramps and storm drain modifications as required.

This is a \$430,000 project funded with local and state funds.

CINCINNATI GREENWAY SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARAD TO EUCLID AVENUE

• This project is substantially complete; crews are working on punch list items.

This project will add greenway elements to Cincinnati Street.

This is a \$567,428 project.

FIVE MILE ROAD FROM LINCOLN TO STRONG ROAD

• Crews are working on swales.

This project included full depth pavement restoration on Five Mile Road, from Lincoln to Strong.

This is a \$2.7 million project.

HAMILTON STREET CORRIDOR SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

- Hamilton Street is reduced to one lane in each direction.
- No left turns onto Mission Avenue. This closure will last through the month of August.

• Additional Hamilton lane closures may occur for night work, 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

The project is designed to make safety and traffic flow improvements at six intersections, including the addition of dedicated left turn pockets and signals.

This is a \$3.3 million project funded with local and federal funds.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed.
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed and half of the adjacent parking lot.
- Parking is limited on Post Street, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south of the bridge is closed.
- The bridge will open in 2022. See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

RESIDENTIAL GRIND & OVERLAY

• Crews are working on Longfellow Avenue from Post to Division Street and Queen Avenue from Perry to Standard Street. Traffic is restricted to local traffic only.

This project will repave the following residential city streets Queen Avenue (Standard to Perry), Longfellow Avenue (Post Street to Division), Scott Street (43rd to Thurston), and Garfield Street (43rd to Thurston).

This is a \$1.1 million project.

ROWAN WATER & SEWER FORCE MAIN FROM HAVEN STREET TO MYRTLE STREET

• Rowan Avenue is closed between Myrtle and Julia Street, crews are moving west toward Freya Street.

This project will relocate city utilities associated with construction of the North South Corridor.

This is a \$3.5 million project funded with state funds.

SPOKANE ARTERIAL CURB RAMPS – NORTH

• Crews are finishing work at Northwest Boulevard, Walnut and Monroe Street.

This project will update curb ramps for ADA compliance on streets where the Street Department is doing grind and overlay projects.

This is a \$1.1 million project funded with local funds.

SPOKANE ARTERIAL CURB RAMPS – SOUTH

- Crews will work in the following intersection
 - o 29th Avenue and Rebecca Street
 - 29th Avenue and Myrtle Street
 - 29th Avenue and Havana Street
 - Freya Street and 31st Avenue
 - Freya Street and 32nd Avenue
 - Freya Street and 33rd Avenue

This project will update curb ramps for ADA compliance on streets where the Street Department is doing grind and overlay projects.

This is a \$1.1 million project funded with local funds.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Punch list work on top of the plaza continues.
- Lincoln Street is closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Main Avenue. This closure will be in place until September 2020. Crews will be backfilling the Flow Control Chamber starting Tuesday, Aug. 11.
- The south curb lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard will be closed from Post to Monroe Street on Monday, Aug. 17, as crews demobilize a crane.

This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank includes a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

This is a \$20 million project funded with City Utility funds.

EVENTS

- <u>Kendall Yards Night Market</u> Wednesdays The following streets will be closed:
 - Summit Parkway between Cedar Street and Jefferson Lane
 - Adams Lane north of Summit Parkway

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The east curb lane of Browne Street between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Riverside Avenue will be closed from 7/27/2020 to 8/7/2020 for Quanta work.
- The median/turn lane of Francis Avenue between Jefferson and Buffalo Street will be closed from 7/29/2020 to 8/7/2020 for CenturyLink work.
- The northbound curb lane of Grand Boulevard between 29th and 31st Street will be closed from 08/03/2020 to 08/07/2020 for Track Utilities work.
- The southbound curb lane of Freya Street between 45th and 47th Avenue will be closed from 8/4/20 to 8/7/20 for Eller Corp work.
- Rockwood Boulevard between Grand Boulevard and Cowley Street will be flagged both directions when needed on 08/11/2020 for Bluebird Tree Care work.
- The westbound curb lane of Francis Avenue between A Street and Indian Trail Road will be closed on 08/11/2020 for Deer Park Paving work.
- The west curb lane of Washington Street between Second and Sprague Avenue, as well as the west curb lane of Division between Pacific and Main Avenue, will be closed from 8/5/20 to 8/12/20 for Quanta work.
- The south curb lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard between Sherman Street and Riverpoint Boulevard will be closed from 8/5/20 to 8/12/20 for Quanta work.
- The east curb lane of Division Street between Sharp and Cataldo Avenue will be closed from 8/5/20 to 8/12/20 for Quanta work.
- The east curbside lane of Division Street between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Boone Street will be closed from 8/6/20 to 8/12/20 for Quanta work.
- Wall Street will be closed between First Avenue and the railroad viaduct from 8/10/20 to 9/4/20 for Avista Utilities work. The alley, driveway, and Wells Fargo parking garage will remain open. The east sidewalk will be closed.

PARKS

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- North Bank: Work on the North Bank playground, wheels park, parking lot, and basketball court is underway. The trail immediately north of the river, between the Washington Street Bridge and the Howard Street Promenade, is closed to accommodate construction.
- West Havermale: An <u>inclusive playground</u> funded by Providence Health Care is anticipated to open fall 2020, along with a renovated Theme Stream from Expo '74 and enhanced connectivity to the Centennial Trail. Parking lot 6 in this area is closed during construction of the Post St. Bridge, but a few spaces will re-open for access to the playground this fall. <u>View a map</u>.

SPOKANE TRANSIT AUTHORITY

- <u>Riverside Avenue Work</u>
 - Riverside Avenue between Post and Wall Street is closed for STA work on the future High Performance Transit stop and Avista work. The street will be open to bus and pedestrian traffic only. <u>Temporary passenger boarding zones</u> have been implemented.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

ALLEY CREW

• Crews will be working in the multiple sections of the city.

CRACK SEALING

- Arterial Crack Sealing
 - Indiana Avenue from Belt to Maple Street.
- Residential Crack Sealing
 - First Avenue, Helena to Altamont Street.
 - Regal Street, Rowan to Francis Avenue.

GRIND AND OVERLAY

• Work continues on Wall Street from Garland to Wellesley Avenue. The work will cause backups and delays, so motorists are asked to detour to Monroe or Division streets during the two-week project.

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

- All sweeping crews are finishing the arterials and starting residential sweeping.
 - Northwest: Rt. 20, NW Blvd to Riverview and Columbia Circle to TJ Meenach.
 - Northeast: Rt.37, Fancher Way to Freya Way and Second to Rutter Parkway.
 - South: Rt. 43, 29th to 53rd and Perry to Regal. Rt. 44, Grand Blvd. to Perry and 29th Ave to Hwy 195.

UTILITY CREW

• Crews will be working throughout the city on water and sewer repairs.

ADDITIONAL WORK

• Bridge crews will be working on various sections of the Maple Street Bridge and Freya Bridge joints, as well as other projects.

WATER DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

<u>14th Avenue, Bernard to Wall Street</u>
14th Avenue between Bernard and Wall Street will be closed on Tuesday, Aug. 11, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Traffic will be detoured onto 15th Avenue.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

I-90 – SPRAGUE AVENUE INTERCHANGE TO ARAGONNE ROAD INTERCHANGE

- Crews are working Sunday Thursday, 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.; drivers should expect delays.
- The Freya Street eastbound I-90 on-ramp is closed drivers will be detoured to the Custer on-ramp.
- Expect delays during the overnight hours with completion in early October 2020.

I-90 – US 2 GARDEN SPRINGS TO BROADWAY AVE – RAMP METERS

- Five new ramp meters will be constructed. Eastbound I-90 ramp meter locations:
 - o Walnut Street
 - o Monroe Street
 - Division Street
 - o Hamilton Street

Westbound I-90 on ramps include Division (Browne) Street only.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC BNSF 2ND RAILROAD REALIGNMENT

- Wellesley Avenue is closed between Market and Freya Street.
- The following streets are permanently closed:
 - Bridgeport, Cleveland and Fairview Avenue between Ralph and Market Street
 - Grace, Marietta, and Jackson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street
- Drivers have east/west access on Francis, Upriver, Carlisle, and Euclid Avenue.

SR 290 – SPOKANE RIVER EAST TRENT BRIDGE

• Trent Avenue is closed between Hamilton Street and North Iron Court. <u>Detours</u> for large trucks, light vehicles and pedestrians will be in place.
