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Nov. 20 – 27, 2020

- Some construction projects have been suspended during the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order and others are on different schedules. Please be prepared for changes in street obstructions.

Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

GEIGER BOULEVARD PHASE 2 FROM SODA TO GROVE ROAD

- Electric Avenue is closed between Geiger Boulevard and Thomas Mallon Road through Friday, Oct. 20. A detour will be in place.
- Soda Road is closed between Geiger Boulevard and Electric Avenue.
- Geiger Boulevard is closed between Electric Avenue and Spring Road.

This project will install a water and sewer main.

This is a \$1 million project.

HAMILTON STREET CORRIDOR SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

- Hamilton Street is reduced to one lane in each direction
- Work at the Sharp Avenue and Illinois Avenue intersections will wrap up around Thanksgiving.
- Work on the final two intersections, North Foothills Drive and Indiana Avenue, will be completed in the spring.

The project is designed to make safety and traffic flow improvements at six intersections, including the addition of dedicated left turn pockets and signals.

This is a \$3.3 million project funded with local and federal funds.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR - CLEVELAND, GREENE, GRACE, JACKSON, RALPH

Work continues on Ralph Street between Carlisle and Cleveland Avenue.

This project will relocate city utilities associated with construction of the North South Corridor.

This is a \$5.6 million project funded with local funds.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed.
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed and half of the adjacent parking lot.
- Parking is limited on Post Street, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south of the bridge is closed.
- The bridge will open in 2022. See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

SOUTH GORGE TRAIL PHASE 2

- Water Avenue is closed west of Ash Street.
- Crews are working near the intersection Main Avenue and Elm Street with little impact to the public.

This project will construct a 10-foot wide pedestrian and bike trail, water main and pavement reconstruction of Clarke Ave, and storm water mitigation at various locations.

This is a \$4 million project funded with local and state funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The south curb lane of Sprague Avenue between Madison and Monroe Street will be closed from 10/26/20 to 11/25/20 for Cameron-Reilly work.
- Pine Street between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Martin Luther King Jr Way has lane closures from 11/11/20 to 11/25/20 for Quanta work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Holland Avenue between Newport Highway and Nevada Street, as well as the eastbound curb lane of Magnesium Road between Colton and Nevada Street will be closed from 11/19/20 to 11/25/20 for Quanta work.

- Crews will be working at the Nevada Street and Hawthorne Road, one lane of traffic will remain open in each direction from 10/26/20 to 11/26/20 for Sefnco work.
- Freya Street between Bridgeport and Rich Avenue will be flagged from 10/27/20 to 11/26/20 for Quanta work.
- The west curb lane of Newport Highway between Hawthorne Road and Holland Avenue will be closed on 10/20/20 to 11/30/20 for NNAC Inc. work.
- The northbound curb lane of Freya Street between Olive and Main Avenue will be closed from 11/16/20 to 12/1/20 for Avista work.
- Grand Boulevard between 29th and 34th Avenue will be flagged with lane closures from 11/2/20 to 12/2/20 for Sefnco work.
- The eastbound curb lane of 29th Avenue will be closed between Regal and Fiske Street from 11/2/20 to 12/2/20 for Avista work.
- The northbound curb lane of Nevada Street between Sitka and Sharpsburg Avenue will be closed from 11/4/29 to 12/3/20 for Quanta work.
- The southbound curb lane of Hamilton Street between North Foothills Drive and Carlisle Avenue will be closed from 11/23/20 to 12/8/20 for Avista work.
- The two east lanes of Lincoln Street between Second and Main Avenue will be closed from 10/5/20 to 04/05/21 for Avista work.

SPOKANE PUBLIC LIBRARY

DOWNTOWN LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION

- Lincoln Street is closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Main Avenue until March 2022.
- The sidewalks adjacent to the downtown library on Main Avenue, Monroe Street, and Spokane Falls Boulevard are closed until March 2021.

SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- North Bank: Work on the North Bank playground, wheels park, parking lot, and basketball court is underway. The trail immediately north of the river, between the Washington Street Bridge and the Howard Street Promenade, is closed to accommodate construction.
- <u>West Havermale</u>: The <u>Providence Playscape</u>, an inclusive playground funded by Providence Health Care is now open! A restored Theme Stream from Expo '74 is also complete. Additional work continues in the area, including a maintenance yard, final pathway improvements, and installation of the StepWell art piece, slated for mid-2021.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

ALLEY CREW

• Alley crew is working on unimproved streets throughout the city.

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

All sweeping crews are working on arterial routes.

ADDITIONAL WORK

 Bridge Crews will be working on various sections of the Maple St. Bridge, and Freya Way, as well as other projects.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC BNSF 2ND RAILROAD REALIGNMENT

- Wellesley Avenue is closed between Market and Freya Street.
- The following streets are permanently closed:
 - o Bridgeport, Cleveland and Fairview Avenue between Ralph and Market Street
 - Grace, Marietta, and Jackson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street
- Drivers have east/west access on Francis, Upriver, Carlisle, and Euclid Avenue.

SR 290 – SPOKANE RIVER EAST TRENT BRIDGE

• Trent Avenue is closed between Hamilton Street and North Iron Court. <u>Detours</u> for large trucks, light vehicles and pedestrians will be in place.
