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April 9 - 16, 2021

- Some construction projects have been suspended due to the pandemic and others are on different schedules. Please be prepared for changes in street obstructions.

Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

GEIGER BOULEVARD PHASE 2 FROM SODA TO GROVE ROAD

 Geiger Boulevard from Flightline Boulevard to just west of Soda Road is closed with a detour in place.

The project includes water and sewer main installation.

This is a \$1 million project.

HAMILTON STREET CORRIDOR SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

- Crews are working at the intersections of Indiana Avenue and North Foothills Drive. There are no left turns onto Indiana Avenue or North Foothills Drive.
- Hamilton is reduced to one lane in each direction between Augusta Avenue and just north of North Foothills Drive.
- Southbound Hamilton Street is closed until Monday, April 12. Traffic is detoured at North Foothills Drive to Division Street and routed back to Hamilton at Mission Avenue. Motorists should anticipate delays.

The project is designed to make safety and traffic flow improvements at six intersections, including the addition of dedicated left turn pockets and signals.

This is a \$3.3 million project funded with local and federal funds.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR – CLEVELAND, GREENE, GRACE, JACKSON, RALPH

- The following streets are closed
 - o Ralph Street is closed from Cleveland to Grace Avenue
 - Cleveland Avenue is closed from Market to Regal Street
 - Regal Street is closed from Cleveland to Illinois Avenue

Please follow all traffic control signs and detours.

This project will relocate city utilities associated with construction of the North South Corridor.

This is a \$5.6 million project funded with local funds.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed.
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed and half of the adjacent parking lot.
- Parking is limited on Post Street, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south of the bridge is closed.
- The bridge will open in 2022. See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

SOUTH GORGE TRAIL PHASE 2

- Clarke Avenue is closed from Spruce to Elm Street.
- Landscaping work is taking place in the vicinity of Sandifur Bridge parking area.

Please follow all traffic control signs and detours.

This project will construct a 10-foot wide pedestrian and bike trail, water main and pavement reconstruction of Clarke Ave, and stormwater mitigation at various locations.

This is a \$4 million project funded with local and state funds.

STREET MAINTENANCE CURB RAMPS

 Crews are working on curb ramps in conjunction with the Hamilton Street Corridor project. This work does not have any additional closures.

This project consists of installing curb ramps on streets where the Street Department has or will be doing grind and overlay work.

This is a \$500,000 project funded with local funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Both curb lanes of Nevada Street between Cozza Drive and Beacon Avenue will be closed and traffic flagged from 3/15/21 4/9/21 for Sefnco work.
- The southbound curb lane of Havana Street between Boone and Broadway Avenue and both curbside lanes of Broadway Avenue between Havana and Freya Street will be closed from 4/5/21 to 4/9/21 for Track Utilities work.
- Partial road closure on Tenth Avenue between Myrtle and Florida Street from 4/5/21 to 4/9/21 for gravel resurfacing.
- The eastbound curb lane of North Foothills Drive between Nevada and Crestline Street will be closed from 3/29/21 to 4/15/21 for M&L Construction work.
- The northbound curb lane of Indian Trail Road between Woodside and Weile Avenue will be closed from 4/5/21 to 4/16/21 for Quanta work.
- The southbound curb lane of Havana Street between 43rd and 42nd Avenue will be closed and traffic flagged from 4/5/21 to 4/16/21 for Sefnco work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Riverside Avenue between Division and Bernard Street will be closed on from 3/22/21 to 4/20/21 for Palouse Power work.
- The north curb lane of Sunset Boulevard will be closed between Government Way and Rustle Street from 3/29/21 to 4/29/21 for Sefnco Work. Flaggers will be on site.
- Central Avenue will be flagged between Lidgerwood and Division Street from 3/29/21 to 4/29/21 for Sefnco work.
- The west curb lane and shoulder of Highway 2 between Hawthorne Road and Holland Avenue will be closed from 3/1/21 to 4/30/21 for NNAC work.
- The north curb lane of First Avenue between Jefferson and Monroe Street will be closed from 3/22/21 to 4/30/21 for Cameron-Reilly work.
- The northbound curb lane of Jefferson Street between Second and Fourth Avenue will be closed from 3/29/21 to 4/30/21 for Sefnco work.
- The northbound curb lane of Division Street between Francis and Lyons Avenue will be closed from 4/8/21 to 4/30/21 for Sefnco work.
- Assembly Road will be completely closed between Windsor Road and 29th Avenue from 4/12/21 to 4/30/21 for MJM Grand work.
- The southbound curb lane of Regal Street between 39th and Thurston Avenue will be closed, and the southbound curb lane of Regal Street will be shifted into the median between 45th and 47th Avenue from 4/26/21 to 4/30/21 for Sefnco work.
- The intersection of Crestline Street and 33rd Avenue is closed from 3/15/21 to 5/7/21 for the <u>Garden District PUD</u> project.
- Both curbside lanes of Five Mile Road between Austin Road and Belt Street will be closed, as well as the south curbside lane shifted into oncoming center lane at a separate time from 4/30/21 to 5/7/21 for Sefnco work.
- Dean Avenue will be closed completely between Howard and Washington Street from 5/3/21 to 5/21/21 for Lydig Construction work.
- The northbound curb lane of Five Mile Drive between Stratton Avenue and Cascade Way/Lincoln Road will be closed from 5/3/21 to 6/2/21 for Quanta work.

Street closure on Granite Street at Upriver Drive starting 4/5/21 for the <u>Riverview</u>
 Granite Street project. This will eventually be a complete street vacation of Granite Street.

SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION

RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- North Bank: Work on the North Bank playground, wheels park, parking lot, and basketball court continues, with plans for completion in spring 2021.
- West Havermale: The <u>Providence Playscape</u>, an inclusive playground funded by Providence Health Care is now open! A restored Theme Stream from Expo '74 is also complete. Additional work continues in the area, including a maintenance yard, final pathway improvements, and installation of the StepWell art piece, slated for mid-2021.

SPOKANE PUBLIC LIBRARY

DOWNTOWN LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION

- Lincoln Street is closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Main Avenue until March 2022.
- The sidewalks adjacent to the downtown library on Main Avenue, Monroe Street, and Spokane Falls Boulevard are closed.

SPOKANE TRANSIT AUTHORITY

CITY LINE CONSTRUCTION

- The following streets are closed to accommodate utility work for STA's City Line. These closures will end in mid-April to accommodate utility work and begin City Line construction. Construction signage and detours are in place.
 - Maple Street between First and Pacific Avenue
 - Pacific Avenue between Oak and Maple Street
- The two southern lanes of Sprague Avenue between Monroe and Madison Street are closed for utility work until late-April to accommodate utility and roadway work in preparation for a City Line station. Construction signage and detours are in place.
- The two northern lanes of First Avenue between Monroe and Madison Street are closed until late-April to accommodate utility and roadway work in preparation for a City Line station. Construction signage and detours are in place.
- The two southern lanes of Main Avenue between Wall and Howard Street are closed until early-May to accommodate utility and roadway work in preparation for a City Line station. Construction signage and detours are in place.
- Full road closure at Pacific Avenue and Hemlock Street starting Thursday, April 15, to accommodate utility and roadway work in preparation for a City Line station.
 Construction signage and detours will be in place.
- Full road closure at Pacific Avenue and Oak Street starting Thursday, April 22, to accommodate utility and roadway work in preparation for a City Line station. Construction signage and detours will be in place.

DIVISION STREET

• One southbound lane of Division Street is closed between Hawthorne Road and Holland Avenue until Friday, April 30 to accommodate sidewalk installation.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

ALLEY CREW

• Alley crews are working Monday in alleys between Central and Dalke, Calispel and Whitehouse. Tuesday they are scheduled to work south in the alley between Manito and Tekoa, 30-33rd Avenue. Wednesday and Thursday the crews are scheduled to be working in in alleys of Nebraska/Rowan, Joseph/Nebraska, and Columbia/Joseph.

CRACK SEALING

- Arterial Crack Sealing
 - o G Street, Northwest Boulevard to Wellesley Avenue.
 - Cowley Street, Fourth to Seventh Avenue.
- Residential Crack Sealing
 - Jefferson/18th Avenue et al.

GRIND AND OVERLAY

• Crews are working on a grind and overlay project on Fourth Avenue/Freeway Avenue between Walnut and Monroe Street. Drivers should expect lane closures and delays.

POTHOLE CREWS

• City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

 Sweeping crews are working on islands and centers in the northwest and south arterial routes. Please watch out for slow moving vehicles working on the cleaning of islands and sidewalks. Give us room to broom!

ADDITIONAL WORK

Bridge crews are working on various bridges to clear drains.

WATER DEPARTMENT

- Sprague Avenue between Wall and Lincoln Street will have lane closures on Thursday, April 8, to fix a leak.
- The two northern curb lanes of Sprague Avenue between Madison and Jefferson Street will be closed on Wednesday, April 14.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

<u>I-90 – US 2 GARDEN SPRINGS TO BROADWAY AVENUE – RAMP METERS</u>

- The new ramp meters will be activated at the following interchanges along I-90 in a phased approach:
 - Tuesday, April 13 Walnut Street/Monroe Street eastbound on-ramp
 - Wednesday, April 14 Browne Street/Division Street eastbound on-ramp
 - Thursday, April 15 Hamilton Street eastbound on-ramp
 - Wednesday, April 21 Browne Street/Division Street westbound on-ramp

The ramp meters are activated when traffic flow requires them; they will not be used when traffic is light.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC BNSF 2ND RAILROAD REALIGNMENT

- Wellesley Avenue is closed between Market and Freya Street.
- The following streets are permanently closed:
 - o Bridgeport, Cleveland and Fairview Avenue between Ralph and Market Street
 - o Grace, Marietta, and Jackson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street
- Drivers have east/west access on Francis, Upriver, Carlisle, and Euclid Avenue.

This project will realign the BNSF railroad tracks in north Spokane for the future US 395 highway.
