CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

ARTERIAL GRIND AND OVERLAY – ECONOMIC RECOVERY PROJECT

- Garland/Empire Avenue is closed from Crestline to Market Street. **Paving is scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 16.**

This project will repave arterial streets and make drainage and sidewalk improvements.

This is a \$1 million project funded with local funds.

CENTENNIAL TRAIL – SUMMIT GAP – BOONE TO PETTET

- **This project is substantially complete!** Crews are working on landscaping and punch list items.

This project will complete an unfinished section of the Centennial Trail in the West Central Neighborhood.

This is a \$2.2 million project.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed.
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed.
- Post Street is closed at Spokane Falls Boulevard with local access only. Parking is limited on Post Street, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south of the bridge is closed.
- The bridge will open in 2022. [See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.](#)

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

RESIDENTIAL GRIND AND OVERLAY

- **This project is substantially complete!**

This project will repave residential streets. Minor storm sewer system repairs and upgrades may also be completed as part of the paving project.

This is a \$1 million project.

SCHOOL SAFETY PROJECTS

- **This project is substantially complete!**

This project includes sidewalk and crosswalk improvements at multiple Spokane Public Schools locations.

This is a \$1.2 million project funded with local funds.

SOUTH GORGE TRAIL PHASE 2

- Clarke Avenue is closed from Spruce to Elm Street.
- Crews are working along Clarke Avenue from Maple to the vicinity of Spruce Street.
- Crews are working to pave Wilson Avenue from Ash to Maple Street.

Please follow all traffic control signs and detours.

This project will construct a 10-foot wide pedestrian and bike trail, water main and pavement reconstruction of Clarke Ave, and stormwater mitigation at various locations.

This is a \$4 million project funded with local and state funds.

SPRAGUE AVENUE REBUILD PHASE 2B

- Sprague Avenue is closed between Grant and Division Street.

Business access is available via First Avenue and also the alley north of Sprague Avenue from Grant to Cowley Street. Arterial traffic is detoured to Second and Third Avenues.

This project will reconstruct Sprague Avenue from Division to Grant Street while enhancing pedestrian and cyclist safety and provide utility replacements/upgrades.

This is a \$3.8 million project funded with local and federal funds.

TRAFFIC CALMING (CYCLE 8)

- This project is substantially complete.

This project will construct traffic and pedestrian safety improvements throughout the City.

This is an \$800,000 project.

WELLESLEY/MAPLE INTERSECTION

- This project has single lane closures with one lane.

This project will improve traffic flow. The westbound left turn lane will be lengthened by approximately one block via island modifications between Maple Street and Walnut Street.

This is a \$500,000 project funded with local and state funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The south curb lane of First Avenue between Washington and Bernard Street; as well as the south curb lane of Sprague Avenue between Division and Bernard Street will be closed from 10/11/21-10/15/21 for Colvico work.
- The intersection of Hawthorne Road and Hwy 2 will be flagged when needed with an eastbound lane closure of Hawthorne in the area from 9/16/21 to 10/15/21 for Quanta work.
- Both curb lanes of Boone Avenue between Washington and Atlantic Street will be closed from 10/18/21 to 10/21/21 for Sefnco work.
- Both curbside lanes of Division Street between Cascade Way and Magnesium Road will be closed from 9/23/21 to 10/22/21 for Quanta work.
- Perry Street between Southeast Boulevard and 15th Avenue will be completely closed from 10/12/21-10/25/21 for Avista work.
- Upper Terrace Road between Rockwood Boulevard and Crest Road will be completely closed, as well as the curbside lanes of Rockwood at Upper Terrace intersection from 9/27/21-10/27/21 for Jewell Excavating work.
- The intersection of Addison Street and Dalke Avenue will be flagged when needed from 10/18/21 to 10/29/21 for Sefnco work.
- The westbound curb lane of Euclid Avenue between Altamont and Lee Street will be closed from 10/14/21-10/29/21 for Track Utilities work.
- The east curb lane of Stevens Street between 6th and 8th Avenue will be closed from 10/1/21-10/29/21 for Quanta work.
- Perry Street between 34th and 36th Avenue will be flagged from 10/1/21-10/29/21 for Quanta work.
- The westbound curb lane of Mission Avenue between Upriver Drive and Perry Street will be shifted over from 9/27/21-10/29/21 for Cameron Reilly work.

- Cook Street is closed between Empire and Rich Avenue from 7/19/21-10/29/21.
- There will be blasting near the intersection Strong Road and Indian Trail Road intersection from 5/24/21 to 11/1/21.
- There will be rock blasting near the intersection of Wieber Drive and Shawnee Avenue from 5/24/21 to 11/1/21.
- The south curb lane of Third Avenue between Ash and Cedar Street will be closed from 10/4/21-11/4/21 for Avista work.
- The intersection of Freya Street and 14th Avenue will be flagged from 10/11/21-11/11/21 for Avista work.
- Right northbound and southbound lanes of Division Street will be closed between Lincoln and Magnesium Road from 10/12/21-11/11/21 for Quanta work.
- Maple Street traffic between Dean Ave and Sharp Ave will be flagged and shifted from 10/12/21-11/11/21 for Quanta work.
- The two west lanes of Stevens Street from Main to Riverside Avenue will be closed from 9/14/21 to 11/18/21 for Palouse Power work.
- The intersection of Seventh Avenue and Cannon Street will be flagged from 10/18/21 to 11/18/21 for Sefnco work.
- The intersection of Marietta Avenue and Freya Street will be flagged, both curbside lanes of Greene Street between Carlisle and Marietta Avenue will be closed and traffic flagged, as well as the intersection of Greene Street and Market Street will be flagged when needed from 9/7/21 to 11/30/21 for Titan Electric work.
- Both curb lanes of Boone Avenue will be closed between Calispel and Atlantic Street; and Boone/Normandie intersection will be flagged from 11/15/21-12/15/21 for Sefnco work.
- New construction beginning at the intersection of Geiger Boulevard and Soda Road. Shoulder work on Geiger only.
- Partial lane closure at the intersection of Willamette Street and Glennaire Drive.
- New construction starting at the intersection of Julia Street and Pratt Avenue, there will be a partial lane closure on Pratt Avenue.
- Shoulder work on Perry Street and North Foothills Drive for the Northeast Middle School project. Lane closures will be in place.
- Austin Road from Five Mile to Strong Road is open to local traffic only. The contractor is prepping for asphalt.
- Street closure on Granite Street at Upriver Drive for the [Riverview Granite Street](#) project. This will eventually be a complete street vacation of Granite Street.
- Street closure on Upriver Drive between Mission Avenue and North Center Street for [Avista's Upriver Park](#). This will eventually be a complete street vacation of Upriver Drive.

SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION

RIVERFRONT PARK

- **West Havermale**: The StepWell art piece is slated for opening in 2022.
- **North Suspension Bridge**: Reconstruction of the bridge began in mid-May, and it will remain closed until winter/spring 2022. The eastbound lane of Broadway Avenue between Lincoln and Post Street, including the south sidewalk, is closed until early January. Snxw mene? island will also be closed to accommodate construction. The north bridge will receive a new deck, floor beams, lighting, and electrical components. The detour is across the Howard Street Promenade through Riverfront Park.

DOWNRIVER GOLF COURSE

- A full irrigation replacement at Downriver Golf Course is underway. Construction is scheduled to last through late spring/early summer of 2022, and the improved irrigation system is estimated to save approximately 7 million gallons of water a year. SPOKANE PUBLIC LIBRARY

DOWNTOWN LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION

- Lincoln Street is closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Main Avenue until March 2022.
- The sidewalks adjacent to the downtown library on Main Avenue, Monroe Street, and Spokane Falls Boulevard are closed.

SPOKANE TRANSIT AUTHORITY

CITY LINE CONSTRUCTION

- Wall Street between Riverside and Main Avenue is closed. Construction signage and detours are in place.
- Mission Avenue is reduced to a single lane in each direction between Magnolia and Lee Street.
- Napa Street south of Mission Avenue is limited to one northbound lane.
- Napa Street north of Mission Avenue will be closed to through traffic.
- Westbound Mission Avenue is restricted to a single lane from the Spokane River Bridge near Upriver Drive to Perry Street.
- Mission Avenue between Hamilton and Morton Street is limited to a single lane of traffic in each direction. The restrictions alternate between the outside (right) lanes and the inside (left) lanes to accommodate work in the area.
- Columbus Street is closed at Mission Avenue to all traffic during any outside (right) lane restrictions on Mission.
- Columbus Street will be restricted to right-hand turns onto Mission Avenue during any inside (left) lane restrictions on Mission Avenue.

- Riverside Avenue between Division and Browne Street will be limited to one line in each direction.
- Riverside Avenue between Browne and Bernard Street will be limited to one lane in each direction.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

ALLEY CREW

- Monday
 - E 00 – Rowan / Sanson Alley, between Division St. and Mayfair St.
 - E 1700 – Decatur / Francis Alley, between Pittsburg St. and Napa St.
- Tuesday & Wednesday
 - E 1700 – LaCrosse / Rockwell Alley, between Pittsburg St. and Napa St.
 - E 1700 – Rich / Rockwell Alley, between Pittsburg St. and Napa St.
 - N 4100 – Martin / Napa Alley, between LaCrosse Ave. and Rich Ave.
- Thursday
 - E 1400 to 1600 – Dalton / Fairview Alley, between Perry and Madelia St.

BRIDGE CREW

- Crews will be repairing a joint on the Freya Way Bridge. There will be northbound and southbound lane closures, drivers should expect delays.

CRACK SEALING

- Hatch Street – Hwy 195 to 57th Avenue (flaggers will be present)

GRIND AND OVERLAY

- Crews are working at multiple locations.

POTHOLE CREWS

- City crews continue to fill potholes. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

- All sweeping crews are finishing the arterials and starting residential sweeping.
 - Northwest: Rt. 1, Francis – Wellesley, Division – Monroe
 - South: Rt. 42, Regal – Custer, 48th Ave. – 29th Ave.

ADDITIONAL WORK

- Concrete crews will be working on various utility repairs throughout the City.
- Crews are working around the City on water and sewer repair cuts.

WATER DEPARTMENT

- Crews will be repairing a water main on Cowley Street. Cowley will have lane restrictions between 7th and 8th Avenue on Friday, Oct. 15, 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

I-90 – FREYA EASTBOUND ON-RAMP

- The Freya Street on-ramp to eastbound I-90 reopened to traffic. WSDOT is still seeking input on the [potential permanent closures of the on-ramp](#).

I-90 – GEIGER ROAD INTERCHANGE RECONSTRUCTION

- The third roundabout at the Geiger/Grove Road intersection will be fully operational by the end of the day Friday, Oct. 15.
- Minor work will continue into early 2022 including permanent striping and curb work.
- All detours will be removed once the roundabout is opened on Friday, Oct. 15.

The reconfigured interchange at Geiger Boulevard will provide for more efficient vehicle movement. Improvements include interchange ramp terminal intersection roundabouts.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER TO COLUMBIA

- Euclid Avenue is reduced to one lane in each direction between Market and Freya Street.

This project will complete the Wellesley Avenue interchange, including the mainline NSC bridge over Wellesley and two ramp bridges over BNSF spur line tracks.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPRAGUE TO SPOKANE RIVER – PHASE 1

- Work has started in the Spokane Community College parking lot at the north end near Ermina Avenue to begin excavation for bridge footings. Augusta Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street on the campus will be closed for safety concerns.

This project will construct the skyway portion of the North Spokane Corridor that traverses over Spokane Community College (Mission to Ermina Avenue).

ROSAMOND AVENUE OVERCROSSING OF I-90

- The Rosamond Avenue overcrossing of I-90 is closed. A detour utilizing the Lindeke Street is in place.

SR 290 – SPOKANE RIVER EAST TRENT BRIDGE

- Trent Avenue is closed between Hamilton Street and North Iron Court. Detours are in place.

This project will demolish the old Trent Avenue Bridge and construct a new bridge to take its place.
