Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

COCHRAN BASIN STORMWATER PIPE

Cleveland Avenue has intermittent lane closures from C Street to T.J. Meenach Drive.

This project will install a pipe to connect stormwater from the intersection of T.J. Meenach Drive and Northwest Boulevard to the Downriver Golf Course where it will connect to the pipe being installed as part of the <u>Cochran Basin Stormwater Pipe</u> through Downriver Golf Course project.

This is a \$3 million project funded with state and local funds.

CURE-IN-PLACE-PIPE (CIPP) SANITARY SEWER REHABILITATION

Work on this project has resumed.

This project includes the installation of 13,800 linear feet cure-in-place pipe. Also, side sewer reconnections and service connection repairs.

This is a \$1.4 million project.

CYCLE 9 SCHOOL SAFETY

- Crews are installing lights at the following locations:
 - Euclid Avenue and Cook Street
 - Perry Street and Dalton Avenue

This project includes sidewalk and crosswalk improvements in all three City of Spokane districts.

This is a \$2 million project funded with local funds.

CYCLE 9 TRAFFIC CALMING

• Work on this project is complete.

This project includes Street and sidewalk improvements focused on pedestrians and traffic calming.

This is a \$1 million project funded with local funds.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is closed.
- The intersection of Lincoln Street and Summit Boulevard is closed.
- Post Street is closed at Spokane Falls Boulevard with local access only. Parking is limited on Post, and the Riverfront Park parking lot on Post just south of the bridge is closed.
- See the detour routes for pedestrians and bicyclists.

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.
- Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6 million gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.

THOR-FREYA RECONSTRUCTION (HARTSON TO SPRAGUE)

 Drivers should expect lane closures throughout the month of March as the contractor finishes punchlist items.

This project will reconstruct the road, replace curb and stormwater facilities, upgrade ADA ramps, and replace water/sewer.

This is an \$8.9 million project funded with federal and local funds.

TJ MEENACH STREET, SIPHON, AND STORMWATER IMPROVEMENTS

• Starting Monday, March 13, TJ Meenach Drive will be closed between Pettet Drive and Northwest Boulevard. <u>Detours</u> will be in place.

This project will design and construct stormwater and sanitary sewer improvements in coordination with the TJ Meenach Drive street reconstruction project. <u>Click here</u> to learn more.

This is a \$7 million project.

WELLESLEY - MARKET INTERSECTION REVISIONS (NSC)

• Wellesley Avenue is closed between Haven and Market Street. <u>Detours</u> are in place.

This project will lower the Wellesley/Market intersection to properly connect with <u>WSDOT's North Spokane Corridor</u> improvements. The project will widen Wellesley Avenue between Haven and Market Street from four to five lanes to increase intersection capacity in anticipation of future traffic conditions. Additionally, the existing water mains in Wellesley Avenue and Market Street will be replaced and lowered.

This is a \$2.8 million project.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Southbound lane of Monroe Street closed between Knox and Shannon Avenue from 2/17/23 to 3/17/23 for Sefnco Communications work.
- The west curb lane of Lincoln Street will be closed between 3rd and 1st Avenue from 3/13/17 to 3/17/23 for North Sky Communications to replace a damaged manhole.
- The south curb lane of 2nd Avenue between Freya and Fiske Street will be closed from 2/20/23 to 3/20/23 for Sefnco Communications work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Strong Road between Austin Road and Elm Street will be closed from 2/20/23 to 3/20/23 for Sefnco Communications work.
- Sefnco Communications will be working at the following locations from 2/20/23 to 3/20/23:
 - Trent Avenue will be reduced to one lane in either direction with flaggers on-site between Hogan and Madelia Street.
 - Southbound curb lane of Cowley Street closed between Hartson and 4th Avenue.
- The eastbound lane of 37th Avenue between Grandy Street and Skyview Drive will be closed with flaggers on-site from 2/20/23 to 3/20/23 for Sefnco Communications work.
- Strong Road between Five Mile and Austin Road will have intermittent closures with flaggers on-site from 3/14/23 to 3/20/23 for TDS Metrocom fiber conduit installation.
- Monroe Street between Boone Avenue and Summit Parkway will have curb lane closures in either direction from 2/20/23 to 3/24/23 for Sefnco Communications work.
- The east curb lane of Division Street will be closed from Indiana to Augusta Avenue from 2/27/23 to 3/27/23 for Sefnco Communications utility work.

- Bernard Street between 31st and 34th Avenue will have lane closures with flaggers onsite from 2/21/23 to 3/31/23 for North Sky Communications utility work.
- Sefnco Communications will be doing aerial fiber work from 3/6/23 to 3/31/23 at the following locations:
 - Crestline Street will have northbound lane closures between Empire and Walton Avenue with flaggers on-site.
 - Eastbound lane closed on Garland Avenue between Crestline and Stone Street.
 - o Garland Avenue westbound curb lane closed between Stone and Regal Street.
 - Regal Street northbound curb lane closed between Garland and Rockwell Avenue.
- The intersection of Summit Boulevard and Boone Avenue will have flaggers on-site to accommodate aerial utility work from 3/1/23 to 4/1/23 for Sefnco Communications.
- Sefnco Communications will be working at the following locations from 3/1/23 to 4/1/23 for aerial utility work:
 - Northbound curb lane of Nevada Street closed at Vicksburg Avenue
 - Eastbound curb lane of Magnesium Road closed at Nevada Street
- The southbound curb lane of Freya Street between 44th and 47th Avenue will be closed between 3/6/23 to 4/6/23 for Sefnco Communications aerial utility work.
- The east curb lane of Maple Street will be closed between 5th and 8th Avenue with flaggers on-site from 3/6/23 to 4/7/23 for North Sky Communications fiber work.
- The Lincoln Street west turn lane at Main Avenue will be closed from 11/14/22 to 4/8/23 for Sefnco Communications work.
- The northbound curb lane of Nevada Street will be closed between Sitka Avenue and Cozza Drive from 3/10/23 to 4/10/23 for Sefnco Communications aerial fiber work.
- The north curb lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard will be closed between Stevens and Post Street from 3/13/23 to 4/13/23 for Sefnco Communications utility work.
- Sefnco Communications will be working in the following locations from 3/13/23 to 4/14/23 for aerial fiber work:
 - Southbound curb lane closed on Browne Street between 4th and 5th Avenue.
 - Eastbound curb lane closed on 5th Avenue between Browne and Pine Street with flaggers on-site.
- The northbound curb lane of Freya Street will be closed between 30th and 28th Avenue from 3/16/23 to 4/16/23 for Sefnco Communications aerial fiber work.
- Avista Utilities will be working at the following locations from 2/23/23 to 4/29/23 to repair utility poles:
 - The southbound curb lane of Southeast Boulevard will be closed between 27th and 29th Avenue with flaggers on-site.
 - The westbound curb lane of 29th Avenue will be closed between Thor and Fiske Street.
 - $\circ~$ The intersection of Regal Street and 44 $^{\rm th}$ Avenue will have lane closures with flaggers on-site.
 - The southbound curb lane of Regal Street will be closed between 37th and Thurston Avenue with flaggers on-site.

- 37th Avenue between Smith and Lee Street will have lane closures with flaggers on-site.
- The southbound traffic lane of Regal Street will be closed between 46th and 53rd
 Avenue with flaggers on-site.
- The east curb lane of Stevens Street will be closed between Main and 1st Avenue from 3/13/23 to 5/5/23 for Garco Construction utility work.

SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION

RIVERFRONT PARK

- **South Suspension Bridge**: The South Suspension Bridge in Riverfront Park is temporarily closed for inspection and repairs. We apologize for the inconvenience; please detour along the Howard Street Promenade/blue bridge. The length of temporary closure will be determined by the inspection and scope of repairs needed.
- West Havermale: The StepWell art piece is slated for opening in spring 2023.

SPOKANE TRANSIT AUTHORITY

CITY LINE CONSTRUCTION

- **Station 1:** Southbound Cannon Street traffic will be shifted between 3rd and 4th Avenue.
- **Station 2A:** Northbound Spruce Street traffic will be shifted between 3rd and 2nd Avenue. Parking will be temporally removed on the west side of Spruce Street.
- Station 2B: Eastbound 2nd Avenue traffic will be shifted between Spruce to Hemlock Street
- **Station 3:** Pacific Avenue parking temporarily closed and traffic lanes shifted between Spruce and Hemlock Street.
- **Station 5:** Pacific Avenue parking temporarily closed and traffic lanes shifted between Oak and Maple Street.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

POTHOLE CREWS

City crews continue to fill potholes as weather allows. If you see a pothole, report it by calling 3-1-1. Potholes can also be reported online through your MySpokane
 account. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

STREET SWEEPING

- Crews are working on arterial routes when weather allows.
- Crews are working in the residential leaf pushing routes as weather allows.

ADDITIONAL WORK

- Our concrete crew will be working on various utility repairs throughout the city.
- Bridge crews are working on various winter projects.

WATER DEPARTMENT

REGAL STREET, PALOUSE HIGHWAY TO 46TH AVENUE

 On Wednesday, March 22, northbound Regal Street between Palouse Highway and 46th Avenue will be closed to fix a leak. Detours will be in place.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

CHILDREN OF THE SUN TRAIL

• This project continues to expand on the current Children of the Sun Trail located along the North Spokane Corridor between Columbia and Carlisle Avenue.

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NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER TO COLUMBIA

• The single lane reductions have been removed and Euclid Avenue is now fully open.

This project will complete the Wellesley Avenue interchange, including the mainline NSC bridge over Wellesley and two ramp bridges over BNSF spur line tracks.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPRAGUE TO SPOKANE RIVER - PHASE 1

 Work has started in the Spokane Community College parking lot at the north end near Ermina Avenue to begin excavation for bridge footings. Augusta Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street on the campus will be closed for safety concerns.

This project will construct the skyway portion of the North Spokane Corridor that traverses over Spokane Community College (Mission to Ermina Avenue).

SR 290 – SPOKANE RIVER EAST TRENT BRIDGE

• Trent Avenue is closed between Hamilton Street and North Iron Court. Detours are in place.

This project will demolish the old Trent Avenue Bridge and construct a new bridge to take its place.
