*Projects highlighted in **RED** have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.*

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

29TH AVENUE GRIND & OVERLAY

- On Monday, June 10, crews will pave 29th Avenue between Ray and Ivory Street. Regal Street will be closed between 29th and 34th Avenue to facilitate this work. A detour utilizing Southeast Boulevard will be in place.
- 29th Avenue between Ray Street and Grand Boulevard is reduced to one lane in each direction.

This work is two separate projects, [Market/Monroe/29th Grind & Overlay](#) and [29th/Washington/Monroe/Lincoln Grind & Overlay](#) that will grind and overlay pavement and install ADA ramps.

COCHRAN CONTROL FACILITY

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

This is a \$7.3 million project.

CYCLE 10 TRAFFIC CALMING

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - Marietta Avenue, Perry to Madelia Street
 - Marietta Avenue and Perry Street
 - Jackson Avenue and Perry Street
 - Pittsburg Street, Rowan to Central Avenue
 - Crestline Street and Rowan Avenue
 - Pittsburg Street and Rowan Avenue
 - Pittsburg Street and Nebraska Avenue
 - Joseph Avenue and Pittsburg Street

This project aims to enhance the overall infrastructure, ensuring better pedestrian safety, traffic flow, and drainage in the area.

This is a \$3 million project.

DIVISION STREET PEDESTRIAN HYBRID BEACONS

- Division Street has lane closures in each direction between Crown and Cozza Avenue.

This project aims to enhance pedestrian safety and accessibility by installing crossing signals at three uncontrolled crosswalks on Division Street. These locations include Division/Longfellow, Division/Everett, and Division/Rhodes-Weile.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

HAVEN GRIND & OVERLAY

- Haven Street is reduced to one lane between Columbia and Rockwell Avenue.

This project will grind and overlay pavement and install ADA ramps as needed.

This is a \$1 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

MAPLE/ASH CHIP SEAL

- Maple and Ash Street has rotating single-lane closures between Rowan Avenue and Northwest Boulevard.

This project will chip seal on the Maple/Ash corridor from Northwest Boulevard to Rowan Avenue.

This is a \$1.8 million project.

MARSHALL ROAD & CHENEY SPOKANE ROAD WATER TRANSMISSION MAIN

- The following work is starting Tuesday, June 11:
 - Cheney Spokane Road will be closed between 44th Avenue and Cedar Road.
 - U.S. 195 will be reduced to 45 mph between Hatch Road and Qualchan Drive.
 - The intersection of U.S. 195 and Meadow Lane will have flaggers on weekday mornings from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m.
- Cheney-Spokane Road between the Hwy 195 interchange and Latah Bistro is reduced to one lane in each direction.
- Marshall Road south of Thorpe Road is closed; residents are recommended to go south to Spokane Cheney Road for access.

The Marshall Road Water Transmission work is composed of three projects. These projects are underway to enhance water and sewer infrastructure in the Cheney-Spokane Road and Marshall Road area, aiming to improve water transmission capacity and provide service to local parcels.

This is a \$9.9 million project.

MONROE STREET GRIND & OVERLAY

- Monroe Street between Kiernan and Francis Avenue is reduced to one lane in each direction.

This work is two separate projects, [Market/Monroe/29th Grind & Overlay](#) and [29th/Washington/Monroe/Lincoln Grind & Overlay](#) that will grind and overlay pavement and install ADA ramps.

POST STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

- The Post Street Bridge is open!

This project will replace the Post Street Bridge and associated utilities.

This is an \$18.5 million project.

RAY STREET WATER MAIN

- The following streets will be closed.
 - Hartson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street.
 - Ray Street between Harston and 11th Avenue.

This project will replace an aging water main along Ray Street, stretching from Hartson Avenue to 11th Avenue.

This is a \$1.4 million project.

RESIDENTIAL CHIP SEAL

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - Tekoa Street from 29th Avenue to Manito Boulevard
 - Division Street from 29th Avenue to Manito Boulevard
 - 30th Avenue between Division and Tekoa Street
 - 31st Avenue between 31st Avenue and Manito Boulevard
 - 32nd Avenue between Division and Tekoa Street

This project will chip seal residential streets in various locations.

This is a \$1 million project.

SOUTH GORGE TRAIL CONNECTION

- This project is substantially complete.

This project constructs a shared-use pathway under the Monroe Street Bridge connecting Main Avenue west of Monroe Street to the existing path attached to the north side of Spokane Falls Boulevard across from the Central Library.

This is a \$2 million project.

SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.
- Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6-million-gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.

STREET MAINTENANCE CURB RAMPS (2024)

- Crews will be installing curb ramps at the following locations.
 - Garland Avenue and I Street
 - Garland Avenue and H Street
 - Garland Avenue and G Street
 - Garland Avenue and F Street
 - Garland Avenue and E Street
 - Queen Avenue and Howard Street
 - Queen Avenue and Stevens Street
 - Queen Ave and Washington St.
 - Queen Ave and Normandie St.
 - Queen Ave and Atlantic St.
 - Cozza Drive and Colton Street
 - Cozza Drive and Lidgerwood Street
 - Cozza Drive and Calkins Drive
 - Cozza Drive and Wiscomb Street

This project will install ADA ramps at various locations citywide.

This is a \$1 million project.

THOR-FREYA 2ND/3RD INTERSECTIONS

- The following streets are closed.
 - Freya Street is reduced to one lane at 2nd Avenue.
 - 2nd Avenue between Havana and Freya Street.
 - Westbound I-90 Exit 283B Thor/Freya off-ramp.

This project involves full roadway reconstruction with concrete, curb and stormwater facilities replacement, ADA ramp upgrades, and water/sewer replacements.

This is a \$4.4 million project.

THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

WASHINGTON-STEVENS BRIDGE DECK AND JOINT REPAIR

- Southbound Washington Street is closed and detoured at North River Drive.
- Northbound Washington Street is reduced to one lane.

This project involves the replacement of expansion joints and a new deck overlay.

CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The south curb lane of Main Avenue will be closed between Division and Pine Street from 4/25/24 to 6/10/24 for Mastec to perform aerial fiber work.
- Avista Utilities will be replacing light poles at the following locations from 5/28/24 to 6/10/24.
 - The southeast-bound center lane of Sunset Boulevard will be closed between Basalt and Rustle Street.
 - The northwest-bound curb lane of Sunset Boulevard will be closed between Rustle and Basalt Street.
- Garco Construction will be working at the following locations from 5/20/24 to 6/10/24.
 - Second Avenue reduced to one lane between Howard and Lincoln Street.
 - The east curb lane of Lincoln Street closed between 3rd and 2nd Avenue.
- **Howard Street will be closed between Main Avenue and Spokane Falls Boulevard on 6/11/24 for crane work.**
- Avista Utilities will be doing pole replacement work in the following areas from 6/3/24 to 6/11/24.
 - Ash Street will have curb lane closures between Joseph and Everett Avenue.
 - The eastbound curb lane of Rowan Avenue will be closed between Oak and Maple Street.
- The eastbound curb lane of Main Avenue will be closed between Cedar and Monroe Street with flaggers on-site from 5/11/24 to 6/11/24 for Mastec to perform aerial utility work.
- Driscoll Boulevard between Longfellow Avenue and Bismark Place will have lane closures with flaggers on-site from 3/11/24 to 6/11/24 to support utility work by TDS Metrocom.
- The eastbound curb lane of 4th Avenue will be closed between Washington and Bernard Street from 3/11/24 to 6/11/24 for Mastec work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 3/26/24 to 6/12/24.
 - The southbound curb lane of Indian Trail Road will be closed between Francis and Elmhurst Avenue.
 - The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Fotheringham and A Street.

- North Sky Communications will be working in the following areas to support fiber work from 6/3/24 to 6/14/24.
 - The westbound curb lane of Euclid Avenue will be closed between Altamont and Lee Street.
 - The westbound curb lane of Garland Avenue will be closed between Cook and Crestline Street.
- North Sky Communications will be installing fiber in the following areas from 6/3/24 to 6/14/24.
 - The northbound curb lane of Freya Street will be closed between Fairview and Liberty Street.
 - The westbound curb lane of Euclid Avenue between Rebecca and Liberty Street.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following areas from 4/17/24 to 6/16/24 for fiber work.
 - The center lane of Division Street is closed between Cozza Drive and Lincoln Road.
 - The westbound curb lane of Lincoln Road between Standard and Division Street.
- Southbound Meadow Lane Road is closed between Turner Road and the Meadow Lane Road dead end from 5/17/24 to 6/17/24 for Mastec to perform aerial fiber work.
- The southbound curb lane of Southeast Boulevard will be closed between 13th and 14th Avenue from 5/16/24 to 6/17/24 for Mastec work.
- Rowan Avenue between Driscoll Boulevard and Fleming Street will have lane closures with flaggers on-site from 3/18/24 to 6/17/24 for TDS Telecom work.
- TDS Telecom will be working in the following areas from 1/8/24 to 6/17/24 to support cable installation.
 - Southbound Standard Street shoulder closed between Gettysburg Drive and Weile Avenue.
 - Northbound Cozza Drive shoulder closed between Calkins Drive and Dakota Street.
 - Northbound Standard Street shoulder closed between Cozza Drive and Greta Avenue.
- Mastec will be working in the following locations to support aerial utility installation from 3/1/24 to 6/20/24.
 - Division Street northbound and southbound curb lane closures between Wedgewood and Francis Avenue with flaggers on-site.
 - Lyons Avenue eastbound and westbound curb lane closures between Atlantic and Lidgerwood Street with flaggers on-site.
- Regal will be reduced to one lane with flagging from 31st to 30th Avenue from 6/3/24 to 6/21/24 for baker Construction to perform utility work.

- Boone Avenue will have curb lane closures between Atlantic and Calispel Street from 5/23/24 to 6/23/24 for Mastec fiber installation.
- The eastbound curb lane of Trent Avenue will be closed between Regal and Sycamore Street from 5/24/24 to 6/24/24 for Avista Utilities work.
- The east curb lane of Stevens Street between Main and Sprague Avenue is closed from 5/20/24 to 6/24/24 for Palouse Power work.
- Evergreen Excavating LLC will be working at the following locations from 2/26/24 to 6/26/24.
 - 3rd Avenue will have a two-lane closure between Madison and Wall Street.
 - Post Street will be closed between 2nd and 3rd Avenue.
- The westbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Cannon and Cedar Street from 5/27/24 to 6/27/24 for Mastec work.
- The northbound curb lane of Division Street is closed between Magnesium Road and Holland Avenue from 5/28/24 to 6/28/24 for NPL Construction work.
- Rowan Avenue between Hemlock and A Street will have flaggers on-site from 6/3/24 to 7/2/24 for TDS Metrocom residential fiber work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Smith and Regal Street from 6/3/24 to 7/4/24 for Mastec to perform aerial utility work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 4/8/24 to 7/7/24.
 - Assembly Street between Sanson and Queen Avenue will have a center lane closure.
 - Driscoll Boulevard between Sanson and Queen Place will have a center lane closure.
- The east curb lane of Ruby Street will be closed between Baldwin and Jackson Avenue from 6/10/24 to 7/10/24 for Mastec to perform fiber work.
- Market Street between Garnet and Hoffman Avenue will have northbound lane closures from 6/3/24 to 7/12/24 for Acme Concrete and Paving work.
- 16th Avenue between U.S. 195 and Nettleton Lane will be closed from 5/13/24 to 7/18/24 for Corridor Contractors LLC work.
- Mastec will be working in the following areas from 4/22/24 to 7/15/24.
 - Both curb lanes of Maple Street will be closed between 2nd and 3rd Avenue.
 - The east curb lane of Maple Street will be closed between 3rd and 4th Avenue.
 - The middle lane of 3rd Avenue will be closed between Maple Street and the BNSF railroad tracks.
- The two middle lanes of Division Street will be closed between Ermina and Augusta Avenue from 5/3/24 to 7/24/24 for Mastec to perform aerial fiber work.
- The eastbound center lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Market and Sycamore Street from 4/1/24 to 10/29/24.

SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION

CORBIN PARK

- The park will receive a new sport court, with two dedicated pickleball courts and one tennis court. Demolition of the existing court happened over fall, with new surfacing and amenities opening in the summer.

COEUR D'ALENE PARK

- A new irrigation system is being installed February – fall 2024. The park will remain open for use, with rotating sectional closures.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

CRACK SEALING

- Residential Crack Sealing
 - Augusta Avenue, Monroe to Howard Street et al

BRIDGE WORK

- Crews will be inspecting and repairing the Freya Way bridges. There will be lane restrictions with a moving work zone.

GRIND AND OVERLAY

- Crews are working on a grind and overlay project on Havana Street between Broadway and Sprague Avenue.

POTHOLE CREWS

- City crews continue to fill potholes as weather allows. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

ADDITIONAL WORK

- Weather permitting, crews will work on utility repairs throughout the city.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

CHILDREN OF THE SUN TRAIL

- This project continues to expand on the current Children of the Sun Trail located along the North Spokane Corridor between Columbia and Carlisle Avenue.
- The Garland structure crossing the North Spokane Corridor is closed through Friday, June 21, to complete the barrier, fencing, and lighting on the structure. There is no access to the bridge during this time. Those who bike, walk, or roll should use the recently completed sidewalks at Euclid Avenue to the south.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- South Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- Upriver Drive is closed between Ralph Street to under the Greene Street Bridge until Friday, June 28, for in-water and bridge work as part of the North Spokane Corridor River Crossing project. A detour is provided via Freya, Euclid, Crestline, and Perry Street.
- This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carlisle Avenue to the north of the river.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/SPOKANE R. TO COLUMBIA – NEW SEGMENT

- A full closure of Wellesley Avenue between Market and Freya Streets along with both directions of the North Spokane Corridor from Freya to Wellesley Avenue will last through Friday, June 28. The contractor will be finishing work not completed before the opening in Nov. 2023, including fixing drainage structures, adding permeon treatment to barrier and bridge, overhead bridge work on the structure and permanent signing and striping.

THOR STREET BRIDGE REPAIR

- Sunday, June 9, 7 a.m. – 4 p.m., Thor Street will be reduced to one lane between 2nd and 3rd Avenue. Bridge crews will be repairing the bridge joint.
