Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS 29TH AVENUE GRIND & OVERLAY

• 29th Avenue between Ray Street and Grand Boulevard is reduced to one lane in each direction.

This work is two separate projects, <u>Market/Monroe/29th Grind & Overlay</u> and <u>29th/Washington/Monroe/Lincoln Grind & Overlay</u> that will grind and overlay payment and install ADA ramps.

COCHRAN CONTROL FACILITY

Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

This is a \$7.3 million project.

CYCLE 10 TRAFFIC CALMING

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - Shawnee Avenue and Monroe Street
 - Strong Road and Cannon Street
 - o Rowan Avenue, Monroe to Post Street
 - Longfellow Avenue and Alberta Street

This project aims to enhance the overall infrastructure, ensuring better pedestrian safety, traffic flow, and drainage in the area.

This is a \$3 million project.

HAVEN GRIND & OVERLAY

Haven Street is reduced to one lane between Columbia and Rockwell Avenue.

This project will grind and overlay payment and install ADA ramps as needed.

This is a \$1 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

• Crestline Street is closed between 37th and 39th Avenue.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

MAPLE/ASH CHIP SEAL

 Maple and Ash Street has rotating single-lane closures between Rowan Avenue and Northwest Boulevard.

This project will chip seal on the Maple/Ash corridor from Northwest Boulevard to Rowan Avenue.

This is a \$1.8 million project.

MARSHALL ROAD & CHENEY-SPOKANE ROAD WATER TRANSMISSION MAIN

- Crews are working in the following areas.
 - Cheney-Spokane Road between the Hwy 195 interchange and Latah Bistro is reduced to one lane in each direction.
 - o Cheney-Spokane Road between Latah Bistro and Cedar Road is closed.
 - o U.S. 195 is reduced to 45 mph between Hatch Road and Qualchan Drive.
 - The intersection of U.S. 195 and Meadow Lane has flaggers on weekday mornings from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m.

The Marshall Road and Cheney-Spokane Road Water Transmission work is composed of three projects. These projects are underway to enhance water and sewer infrastructure in the Cheney-Spokane Road and Marshall Road area, aiming to improve water transmission capacity and provide service to local parcels.

This is a \$9.9 million project.

MONROE STREET GRIND & OVERLAY

Monroe Street between Francis and Wellesley Avenue will be closed on Friday, June 28.
 We expect to open Monroe Street to one lane in each direction between Kiernan and Francis Avenue by the weekend.

This work is two separate projects, <u>Market/Monroe/29th Grind & Overlay</u> and <u>29th/Washington/Monroe/Lincoln Grind & Overlay</u> that will grind and overlay payment and install ADA ramps.

RAY STREET WATER MAIN

- The following streets will be closed.
 - Hartson Avenue between Ralph and Greene Street.
 - o Ray Street between Harston and 11th Avenue.

This project will replace an aging water main along Ray Street, stretching from Hartson Avenue to 11th Avenue.

This is a \$1.4 million project.

SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated.
- Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6-million-gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.

STREET MAINTENANCE CURB RAMPS (2024)

- Crews will be installing curb ramps at the following locations.
 - Magnesium Road and Mayfair Street
 - Magnesium Road and Colton Street
 - Magnesium Road and Hill'n Dale Street
 - Magnesium Road and Antietam Drive
 - Magnesium Road and Dakota Street
 - Spokane Falls Boulevard and Cincinnati Street

This project will install ADA ramps at various locations citywide.

This is a \$1 million project.

THOR-FREYA 2ND/3RD INTERSECTIONS

- The following closures will be in place.
 - o 3rd Avenue is closed between Ray and Thor Street.
 - o Thor Street is reduced to one lane at 3rd Avenue.
 - The eastbound I-90 Exit 283B Thor/Freya off-ramp will be closed.

This project involves full roadway reconstruction with concrete, curb and stormwater facilities replacement, ADA ramp upgrades, and water/sewer replacements.

This is a \$4.4 million project.

THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

WASHINGTON-STEVENS BRIDGE DECK AND JOINT REPAIR

- Southbound Washington Street is closed and detoured at North River Drive.
- Northbound Washington Street is reduced to one lane.

This project involves the replacement of expansion joints and a new deck overlay.

CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Jefferson Hoopfest Shuttle The shuttle boards at the Jefferson Park & Ride lot located at 4th Avenue and Jefferson Street and serves the west side of the downtown tournament area. The shuttle operates every 15 minutes from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Saturday and 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

CHILDREN OF THE SUN TRAIL

• After the ribbon cutting and celebration on Friday, June 21, the contractor will finish work on the Garland Bridge. Other clean-up items remain. No impacts to vehicle traffic, however, minor impacts for those who use the trail and bike/walk/roll.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- South Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- Upriver Drive is closed between Ralph Street to under the Greene Street Bridge until Thursday, July 11, for in-water and bridge work as part of the North Spokane Corridor River Crossing project. A detour is provided via Freya, Euclid, Crestline, and Perry Street.
- This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/SPOKANE R. TO COLUMBIA - NEW SEGMENT

- Wellesley Avenue between Market and Freya Street along with the northbound onramp to the North Spokane Corridor at Wellesley Avenue is anticipated to reopen Friday, June 28, during the morning hours.
- The southbound lanes of the North Spokane Corridor between Freya and Wellesley
 Avenue along with the southbound on-ramp at Freya Street will reopen on Friday, June
 28, during the afternoon hours once Wellesley and the northbound on-ramp to the
 North Spokane Corridor have opened. Staging of vehicles to remove the closure will take
 additional time.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/SPOKANE R. TO COLUMBIA – PHASE 2

 The right lane of northbound Market Street between Garnet Avenue and Hoffman Avenue is closed as crews remove curbing and sidewalk in the area. This work is part of North Spokane Corridor work to clean up curbing along Market Street and clean up areas next to the North Spokane Corridor where previous city streets used to cross east/west. Lane closure on Market Street is anticipated to last several weeks.
