CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

COCHRAN CONTROL FACILITY

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

This is a \$7.3 million project.

CYCLE 11 TRAFFIC CALMING

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - Indian Trail Road and Holyoke Avenue will have shoulder work.
 - Lincoln Way and Willapa Avenue will have a lane shift with two-way traffic.
 - Lincoln Boulevard and Kip Lane will have a lane shift with two-way traffic.

This project aims to enhance the overall infrastructure, ensuring better pedestrian safety, traffic flow, and drainage in the area.

This is a \$2 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

- There are no impacts to the traveling public.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

MARSHALL ROAD & CHENEY-SPOKANE ROAD WATER TRANSMISSION MAIN

- No traffic impacts at this time.

The Marshall Road and Cheney-Spokane Road Water Transmission work is composed of three projects. These projects are underway to enhance water and sewer infrastructure in the Cheney-Spokane Road and Marshall Road area, aiming to improve water transmission capacity and provide service to local parcels.

This is a \$9.9 million project.

SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated. Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6-million-gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.

THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

WASHINGTON STEVENS CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS 2024

- Grind and overlay prep work on Stevens and Washington Streets continues between Spokane Falls Boulevard and 3rd Avenue. Stevens and Washington Streets have lane restrictions in place.

The Washington Stevens Corridor upgrades consist of three key projects aimed at enhancing the infrastructure and longevity of the roads and bridges in this area.

CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- TDS Metrocom will be installing underground cable and conduit in the following locations from 10/14/24 to 11/15/24.
 - The center lane of Alberta Street will be closed between Everett and Rowan Avenue.
 - A Street between Rowan and Everett Avenue will have lane closures with flaggers on-site.

- Shawnee Avenue will have lane restrictions between Fotheringham and Farmdale Street from 9/23/24 to 11/15/24 for Inland Infrastructure LLC to perform sidewalk and pathway infill.
- Sunset Boulevard between Cannon Street and 3rd Avenue will have lane closures with flaggers on-site from 9/16/24 to 11/16/24 to support aerial utility work by Mastec North America.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 10/18/24 to 11/18/24.
 - Southbound lane closure of Browne Street between 4th and 5th Avenue with flaggers on-site.
 - Eastbound lane closure of 5th Avenue between Browne and Pine Street with flaggers on-site.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 9/19/24 to 11/19/24 to install underground cable.
 - The southbound curb lane of Indian Trail Road will be closed between Francis and Elmhurst Avenue.
 - The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Fotheringham and A Street.
- The south curb lane of 3rd Avenue will be closed between Lincoln and Wall Street from 11/7/24 to 11/20/24 for Avista work.
- Southbound lane closure of Standard Street between Calkins and Lincoln Drive from 8/20/24 to 11/20/24 for TDS Metrocom work.
- The eastbound shoulder of Strong Road will be closed between Five Mile Road and Nettleton Lane from 11/11/24 to 11/22/24 for Diamond Asphalt and Paving work.
- Rowan Avenue between Hemlock and A Street will have flaggers on-site from 6/3/24 to 11/23/24 for TDS Metrocom residential fiber work.
- Northbound Bernard Street is closed between 32nd and 31st Avenue with flaggers on-site from 11/11/24 to 11/25/24 for North Sky Communications.
- Fatbeam LLC will be working at the following locations from 11/4/24 to 11/25/24.
 - The southbound curb lane of Market Street will be closed between Courtland to Cleveland Avenue.
 - The northbound curb lane of Greene/Market Street will be closed between Marietta and Bridgeport Avenue.
 - The westbound curb lane of Euclid Avenue will be closed between Ralph to Nelson Street.
- The eastbound curb lane of Rowan Avenue will be closed between Division and Mayfair Street from 10/25/24 to 11/25/24 for Mastec North America to install aerial utility work.

- Northbound lane closure of Assembly Street between Everett Avenue and Winston Drive from 9/25/24 to 11/25/24 for TDS Metrocom work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 9/23/24 to 11/25/24.
 - Eastbound lane closure of Rowan Avenue between Lidgerwood and Standard Street.
 - Eastbound lane closure of Rowan Avenue between Nevada and Magnolia Street.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 9/27/24 to 11/30/24 to support fiber installation.
 - Helena Street will have lane closures with flaggers on-site between Riverside and Springfield Avenue.
 - Trent Avenue will have lane closures with flaggers on-site between Martin Luther King Jr. Way and Napa Street.
- The eastbound curb lane of Holland Avenue will be closed between Dakota and Nevada Street from 8/26/24 to 11/30/24 for TDS Metrocom to install fiber.
- TDS Metrocom is installing underground cable in the area bounded by Royal Court, Wellesley Avenue, Driscoll Boulevard, and Longfellow Avenue from 7/28/24 to 11/30/24.
- The eastbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Winston Drive and G Street from 3/11/24 to 11/30/24 for TDS Metrocom work.
- Upriver Drive will be reduced to one lane between Frederick Avenue and Upriver Lane from 11/1/24 to 12/1/24 for Mastec North America fiber work.
- Fatbeam LLC will be working at the following locations with flaggers on-site from 11/4/24 to 12/2/24.
 - Northbound lane closures on Lincoln Street between Mallon and Boone Avenue.
 - Southbound lane closures on Lincoln Street between Sharp and Boone Avenue.
 - Eastbound lane closures on Boone Avenue between Madison and Howard Street.
- Mastec North America will be performing fiber work at the following locations from 11/4/24 to 12/4/24.
 - The center lane of Regal Street will be closed between 44th and 53rd Avenue with flaggers on-site.
 - The southeast lane of Palouse Highway will be closed between the Target parking lot and Thor Street with flaggers on-site.
- TDS Telecom will be installing fiber at the following areas from 7/1/24 to 12/6/24.
 - Both curb lanes of Ash Street closed between Buckeye and York Avenue
 - West curb lane closure on Ash Street between Cleveland and Buckeye Avenue
 - Both curb lanes of Maple Street between Jackson and Chelan Avenue
- Francis Avenue will have eastbound and westbound curb lane closures between Pittsburg and Nevada Street from 11/15/24 to 12/15/24 for Mastec North America Inc. work.

- The southbound curb lane of Nine Mile Road will be closed between Rifle Club Road and Lyons Avenue from 11/18/24 to 12/18/24 for Matec North America fiber work.
- The westbound curb lane of Mission Avenue will be closed between Normandie and Washington Street from 11/18/24 to 12/18/24 for Mastec North America fiber work.
- Avista will be working at the following locations with flaggers on-site from 11/14/24 to 12/23/24.
 - The eastbound curb lane of US 2 will be closed between Campus and Spotted Road.
 - The westbound curb lane of US 2 will be closed between Russell and Spotted Road.
 - The northbound shoulder of Spotted Road will be closed between Tech Park Drive and US 2.

SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION

COEUR D'ALENE PARK

- A new irrigation system is being installed February – fall 2024. The park will remain open for use, with rotating sectional closures.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

LEAF PICKUP

- Leaf pickup is underway! The City's leaf pickup service is intended to remove only the leaves that naturally fall into the streets. **Residents *should not* rake leaves into the street.**

POTHOLE CREWS

- City crews continue to fill potholes as weather allows. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

SNOW REMOVAL

- Residents are asked to park on the odd side of the street in residential areas for snow season, which runs from Nov. 15 to March 15.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

CHILDREN OF THE SUN TRAIL

- Work on the Garland Bridge has resumed as of Monday, Oct. 21. The bridge is now closed to pedestrian traffic with detours in place. Work is anticipated to **last through Friday, Nov. 15.**

[NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING](#)

- Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.

This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.
