# **CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS**

### COCHRAN CONTROL FACILITY

• Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

### This is a \$7.3 million project.

### **HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK**

• There are no impacts to the traveling public.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

### This is a \$9.8 million project.

### SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

 No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated. Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6-million-gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

### This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.

### THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

• Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

### WASHINGTON STEVENS CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS 2024

• Grind and overlay prep work on Stevens and Washington Streets continues between Spokane Falls Boulevard and 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. Stevens and Washington Streets have lane restrictions in place.

The Washington Stevens Corridor upgrades consist of three key projects aimed at enhancing the infrastructure and longevity of the roads and bridges in this area.

# **CITY OBSTRUCTIONS**

- The westbound curb lane of Francis Avenue will be closed between Howard and Wall Street from 12/19/24 to 1/19/25 for fiber installation.
- The east curb lane of Browne Street is closed between Riverside and 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue from 1/14/25 to 1/24/25 for Palouse Power LLC work.
- Upriver Drive between Carlisle Avenue and Ralph Street has narrowed lanes and a closed bike lane from 11/9/24 to 1/26/25 to support cane access by Max J Kuney Co.
- Assembly Street will have northbound and southbound lane closures between Olympic Avenue and Gustavus Street from 12/26/24 to 1/26/24 for fiber work by Mastec North America work.
- Magnesium Road will be reduced to one lane between Standard and Nevada Street with flaggers on-site from 12/27/24 to 1/27/25 for Mastec North America work.
- Lumen will be working at the following locations from 1/13/24 to 1/27/25.
  - The westbound curb lane of 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be closed between Mt. Vernon and Stone Street.
  - The southbound curb lane of Southeast Boulevard between 27<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 12/9/24 to 1/30/25.
  - Standard Street will have lane closures between Gettysburg Drive and Weile Avenue.
  - Cozza Drive will have lane closures between Calkins Drive and Dakota Street.
- The eastbound curb lane of Rowan Avenue will be closed between Division and Mayfair Street with flaggers at the Rowan Avenue and Mayfair Street intersection from 1/10/25 to 2/2/25 for aerial fiber work by Mastec North America.
- North Sky Communications will be working at the following locations 1/20/25 to 2/3/25.
  - The west curb lane of Stevens Street will be closed between Main and Riverside Avenue.
  - Two east curb lanes of Washington Street will be closed between Riverside and Main Avenue.
- The eastbound lane of 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Washington and McClellan Street for fiber work by Mastec North America from 1/10/25 to 2/10/25.

- TDS Metrcom will be working at the following locations from 1/15/25 to 2/14/25.
  - Ash Street will be reduced to one lane between Courtland and Euclid Avenue.
  - The northwest curb lane of Northwest Boulevard will be closed between Alberta Street and Euclid Avenue.
- The center lane of Sprague Avenue will be closed between Cowley and Sherman Street with flaggers at Grant Street from 1/17/25 to 2/17/25 for Mastec North America work.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/20/25 to 2/20/25.
  - The eastbound lane of Sharp Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Post and Howard Street.
  - The northbound curb lane of Lincoln Street/Post Place will be closed with flaggers on-site between Mallon and Spofford Avenue.
  - The center lane of Maxwell Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Lincoln and Wall Street.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/20/25 to 2/20/25.
  - Both curb lanes of 29<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Martin and Mt. Vernon Street.
  - The southbound curb lane of Southeast Boulevard will be closed with flaggers on-site between 31<sup>st</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/23/25 to 2/24/25.
  - Both curb lanes of Maxwell/Mission Avenue closed with flaggers on-site between Howard and Division Street.
  - Both curb lanes of Washington Street closed with flaggers on-site between Augusta and Sharp Avenue.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/16/25 to 2/26/25.
  - Northbound Market Street will be reduced to one lane between Garland and Heroy Avenue.
  - Southbound Haven Street will be reduced to one lane between Longfellow and Garland Avenue.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 1/13/25 to 2/28/25.
  - A Street will have lane restrictions with flaggers on-site between Hoffman and Longfellow Avenue.
  - Wellesley Avenue will have lane restrictions with flaggers on-site between A Street and Driscoll Boulevard.
- Post Street is closed between Riverside and Sprague Avenue from 1/6/25 to March 2026 for the Peyton Building remodel.

City crews continue to fill potholes as weather allows. If you see a pothole, report it by calling 3-1-1. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane</u> <u>account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

### SNOW REMOVAL

• Residents are asked to park on the odd side of the street in residential areas for snow season, which runs from Nov. 15 to March 15.

• The Garland Bridge reopened as of Friday, Oct. 15. Minor work remains on the trail.

### NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- Upriver Drive will have flaggers between Greene and Ralph Street from Monday, Jan. 13 to Friday, Jan. 24, from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- The northbound curb lane of Greene Street Bridge will be closed from Monday, Jan. 13 to Friday, Jan. 24.
- Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- The Spokane River is closed at the Greene Street Bridge.

This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.
