*Projects highlighted in **RED** have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.*

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

9TH AND PINE BOOSTER STATION

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project will replace the out-of-service booster station with a modern facility.

This is a \$5.3 million project.

COCHRAN CONTROL FACILITY

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

This is a \$7.3 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

- There are no impacts to the traveling public.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RESERVOIR

- No impacts to the traveling public are anticipated. Construction will be complete in 2024.

This project will construct a 3.6-million-gallon drinking water reservoir near the Spokane International Airport.

This is a \$13.3 million project funded with state and local funds.

THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

- Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 2/7/25 to 2/21/25.
 - The eastbound curb lane of 29th Avenue will be closed between Pittsburg and Stone Street.
 - The westbound curb lane of 29th Avenue will be closed between Stone and Martin Street.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/23/25 to 2/24/25.
 - Both curb lanes of Maxwell/Mission Avenue closed with flaggers on-site between Howard and Division Street.
 - Both curb lanes of Washington Street closed with flaggers on-site between Augusta and Sharp Avenue.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/16/25 to 2/26/25.
 - Northbound Market Street will be reduced to one lane between Garland and Heroy Avenue.
 - Southbound Haven Street will be reduced to one lane between Longfellow and Garland Avenue.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 1/13/25 to 2/28/25.
 - A Street will have lane restrictions with flaggers on-site between Hoffman and Longfellow Avenue.
 - Wellesley Avenue will have lane restrictions with flaggers on-site between A Street and Driscoll Boulevard.
- Northbound Howard Street will have a lane shift between 2nd Avenue and Railroad Alley from 1/27/25 to **2/28/25** for Palouse Power work.
- The eastbound curb lane of Rowan Avenue will be closed between Division and Mayfair Street with flaggers at the Rowan Avenue and Mayfair Street intersection from 1/10/25 to 3/2/25 for aerial fiber work by Mastec North America.
- Both curb lanes of Stevens Street will be closed between 6th and 9th Avenue from 2/6/25 to 3/6/25 for Mastec North America to support fiber installation.
- **Regal Street between 29th and 32nd Avenue will have lane restrictions with flaggers on-site from 2/24/25 to 3/7/25 for Fatbeam LLC fiber installation.**

- North Sky Communications will be working at the following locations from 2/10/25 to 3/10/25.
 - The westbound curb lane of Euclid Avenue will be closed between Haven and Regal Street.
 - The southbound curb lane of Freya Street will be closed between Liberty and Fredrick/Euclid Avenue.
 - The inside lane of the Wellesley Avenue and Freya Street roundabout will be closed.
 - Wellesley Avenue westbound shoulder work between Florida and Myrtle Street.
 - The northbound curb lane of Freya Street will be closed between Empire and Rockwell Avenue.
 - The northbound curb lane of Freya Street will be closed between Garland and Rich Avenue.
- The northbound curb lane of Assembly Street will be closed between Crown and Sanson Avenue with flaggers on-site from 2/17/25 to 3/14/25 for North Sky Communications work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 1/20/25 to 3/14/25.
 - The eastbound curb lane of Northwest Boulevard will be closed between Buckeye Avenue and Cannon Street.
 - Belt Street will have alternating lane closures between York Avenue and Northwest Boulevard.
 - Flaggers will be at the intersection of Belt Street and Northwest Boulevard.
- The southbound curb lane of Crestline Street will be closed between Houghton and Weile Avenue from 2/10/25 to 3/14/25 for Mastec North America fiber work.
- Both curb lanes of Lincoln Road will be closed between Division and Standard Street from 2/10/25 to 3/14/25 for Mastec North America work.
- The westbound curb lane of Frances Avenue will be closed between Howard and Wall Street from 2/17/25 to 3/17/25 for Mastec North America fiber work.
- The northbound curb lane of Grand Boulevard will be closed between 31st and 33rd Avenue from 2/17/25 to 3/17/25 for Mastec North America work.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/20/25 to 3/20/25.
 - The eastbound lane of Sharp Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Post and Howard Street.
 - The northbound curb lane of Lincoln Street/Post Place will be closed with flaggers on-site between Mallon and Spofford Avenue.
 - The center lane of Maxwell Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Lincoln and Wall Street.
- Assembly Street will have a northbound lane shift between Everett and Olympic Avenue from 2/28/25 to 3/28/25 for Mastec North America fiber installation.

- Post Street is closed between Riverside and Sprague Avenue from 1/6/25 to March 2026 for the Peyton Building remodel.

SPOKANE PARKS AND RECREATION

COEUR D'ALENE PARK

- A new irrigation system is being installed February – spring 2025. The park will remain open for use, with rotating sectional closures.

STREET DEPARTMENT PROJECTS

POTHOLE CREWS

- City crews continue to fill potholes as weather allows. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through [your MySpokane account](#). Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

SNOW REMOVAL

- Residents are asked to park on the odd side of the street in residential areas for snow season, which runs from Nov. 15 to March 15.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

CHILDREN OF THE SUN TRAIL

- The Garland Bridge reopened as of Friday, Oct. 15. Minor work remains on the trail.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- Upriver Drive between Greene and Ralph Street has a single lane closure with flaggers from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- The Spokane River is closed at the Greene Street Bridge.

This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.
