Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

#### **CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS**

# **9<sup>TH</sup> AND PINE BOOSTER STATION**

• 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue is closed to traffic between Cowley Street and Rockwood Boulevard. Access to the Providence employee parking lot and impacted driveways will be maintained.

This project will replace the out-of-service booster station with a modern facility.

This is a \$5.3 million project.

#### **COCHRAN BASIN CONTROL FACILITY**

• Work on this project has resumed. There are no traffic impacts.

This project will construct a stormwater flow control vault.

This is a \$7.3 million project.

#### **CYCLE 11 TRAFFIC CALMING**

- There is shoulder work at the following locations as crews install speed feedback signs.
  - o Lincoln Boulevard and Kip Lane
  - Lincoln Way and Willapa Avenue

This project aims to enhance the overall infrastructure, ensuring better pedestrian safety, traffic flow, and drainage in the area.

This is a \$2 million project.

#### FREYA TRANSMISSION MAIN – GARLAND TO WELLESLEY

• Freya Street is closed between Garland and Wellesley Street. The detour is Euclid Avenue to Wellesley via Market Street.

This project replaces an aging 30-inch steel water transmission main along Freya Street with a new 30-inch ductile iron main. Work also includes reconstructing the roadway, improving sidewalks, and installing stormwater management features.

This is a \$4.7 million project.

# **HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK**

There are no impacts to the traveling public.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

# PERRY STREET SEWER MAIN (19<sup>TH</sup> TO 18<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE)

• Perry Street is closed to traffic between 19<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue.

This project installs a new 8-inch sewer main and replaces an aging 8-inch cast iron water main along Perry Street, between 19th and 18th Avenues. Additional work includes replacing galvanized water service laterals with copper, reconstructing the roadway, and updating curbs, sidewalks, and driveways.

This is a \$396,000 million project.

#### SCOTT ELEMENTARY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

 Hartson Avenue is reduced to one lane with flaggers on-site between Freya and Havana Street.

This project improves pedestrian safety around Scott Elementary by adding sidewalks, curb extensions (bumpouts), and enhanced crosswalks. Traffic-calming measures will slow vehicles along key streets, creating safer routes for students walking to and from school.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

#### **SPOTTED ROAD BOOSTER STATION**

• There are no traffic impacts.

Construction of a new water booster station for the Plains Pressure Zone.

This is a \$2 million project.

### **2025 STREET MAINTENANCE CURB RAMPS**

• This project will start on Monday, May 5. There will be shoulder work at Columbia Avenue between Stone and Cook Street as crews install new ADA ramps.

The City is undertaking a citywide initiative to install new ADA-compliant wheelchair ramps at various locations. This effort will improve pedestrian safety and accessibility, particularly for individuals with mobility challenges.

This is a \$765,000 million project.

## **THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)**

Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

#### **NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS**

- Fatbeam LLC will be working at the following locations from 3/1/25 to 5/2/25.
  - The south curb lane of Spokane Falls Boulevard will be closed between Division and Bernard Street.
  - The east curb lane of Browne Street will be closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Riverside Avenue
  - Main Avenue will be reduced to one lane between Bernard and Browne Street.
- Assembly Street will have northbound and southbound curb lanes closed with flaggers onsite between Bismark Place and Broad Avenue from 4/21/25 to 5/2/25 for North Sky Communications work.
- Southbound Sherman Street will have a lane closure between 3<sup>rd</sup> and Hartson Avenue from 3/3/25 to 5/4/25 for Mastec North America work.
- North Sky Communications will be working at the following locations from 4/21/25 to 5/7/25.
  - The southbound curb lane of Geiger Boulevard will be closed between Pilot Drive and Dowdy Road.
  - Shoulder closures on Electric Avenue between Soda and Spotted Road.
- Geiger Boulevard will have a southbound lane closure between Rowand Road and Flightline Boulevard from 4/14/25 to 5/9/25 for Peck & Peck Excavating work.
- Division Street will have a northbound lane closure between Francis Avenue and Lincoln Road from 4/11/25 to 5/9/25 for TDS Metrocom LLC work.
- The westbound curb lane of Hawthorne Road will be closed between Trans Line and Northpointe Access Lane from 4/7/25 to 5/9/25 for Inland Infrastructure work.

- The west curb lane of Stevens Street will be closed between Railroad Alley and 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue from 4/9/25 to 5/9/25 for North Sky Communications work.
- The eastbound lane of Holland Avenue will be closed between U.S. 2 and Hoerner Drive from 4/17/25 to 5/17/25 for Mastec North America work.
- Southbound Driscoll Boulevard closed between Providence and Gordon Avenue from 2/17/25 to 5/17/25 for TDS Metrocom work.
- TDS Metrocom LLC will be working at the following locations from 4/23/25 to 5/20/25.
  - Wellesley Avenue between Assembly Street and Alameda Boulevard.
  - Broad Avenue between Assembly Street and Alameda Boulevard.
  - o Olympic Avenue between Assembly Street and Alameda Boulevard.
- North Sky Communications will be working in the following areas 4/21/25 to 5/20/25.
  - The westbound curb lane of Euclid Ave will be closed between Regal and Haven Street.
  - The southbound curb lane of Freya Street will be closed between Liberty and Frederick Avenue.
  - The inside lane of the Wellesley Avenue and Freya Street roundabout will be closed.
  - The westbound shoulder of Wellesley Avenue will be closed between Florida and Myrtle Street.
  - The northbound shoulder of Freya Street will be closed between Empire and Rockwell Avenue.
  - The northbound shoulder of Freya Street will be closed between Garland and Rich Avenue.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following areas from 4/21/25 to 5/21/25.
  - The westbound and eastbound curb lanes of Mission Avenue will be closed between Madelia and Crestline Street.
  - The northbound curb lane of Napa Street will be closed between Sinto and Mission Avenue.
- TDS Metrocom LLC will be working in the following areas from 3/25/25 to 5/23/25.
  - Westbound lane closure on Francis Avenue between Addison and Division Street.
  - Northbound lane closure on Division Street between Francis and Weile Avenue.
  - Southbound lane closure on Addison Street between Wiscomb Street and Francis Avenue.
  - o Eastbound lane closure on Lyons Avenue between Lidgerwood and Addison Street.
  - Westbound lane closure on Lincoln Road/Cascade Way between Standard Street and Calispel Lane.
- Both curb lanes of Wellsley Avenue will be closed between Oak and Walnut Street with flaggers on-site from 4/24/25 to 5/26/25 for Mastec North America work.
- TDS Metrocom LLC will be installing fiber in the area bounded by Wellesley Avenue,
  Driscoll Boulevard, Longfellow Avenue, and Alberta Street from 1/13/25 to 5/27/25.

- TDS Metrocom LLC work at the following locations from 3/31/25 to 5/28/25.
  - o Southbound lane closure of A Street between Longfellow and Lacrosse Avenue.
  - Northbound lane closure of Driscoll Boulevard between A Street and Heroy Avenue.
  - Northwest Boulevard will have lane closures between Gustavus Street and Lacrosse Avenue.
- TDS Metrocom LLC will be installing fiber in the area bounded by Rowan Avenue, Driscoll Boulevard, and D Street from 1/13/25 to 5/28/25.
- Westbound lane closure on Northwest Boulevard between C and H Street from 3/31/25 to 5/29/25 for TDS Metrocom LLC work.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/20/25 to 5/30/25.
  - The eastbound lane of Sharp Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Post and Howard Street.
  - The northbound curb lane of Lincoln Street/Post Place will be closed with flaggers on-site between Mallon and Spofford Avenue.
  - The center lane of Maxwell Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Lincoln and Wall Street.
- The eastbound lane of 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be closed between Regal and Achilles Street from 5/2/25 to 6/2/25 for Mastec North America Inc. work.
- TDS Metrocom LLC will be installing fiber in the areas of Oak Street, Maple Street, Ash Street, Walnut Street, Cedar Street, Adams Street, Jefferson Street, and Madison Street from Francis to Joseph Avenues 4/7/25 to 6/2/25.
- TDS Metrocom LLC will be installing fiber in the area of I Street, Garland Avenue, G Street, E Street, Glass Avenue, and Cora Avenue from 1/13/25 to 6/4/25.
- Post Street is closed between Riverside and Sprague Avenue from 1/6/25 to March 2026 for the Peyton Building remodel.

#### **SPECIAL EVENTS**

<u>Bloomsday</u> – Sunday, May 4
 Bloomsday is Sunday, May 4, the race day map can be found <u>here</u>. Drivers are asked to slow down and be aware of extra pedestrians in the downtown area all weekend.

#### **Bloomsday Check-In/Packet Pickup**

Bloomsday packet pick-up will be at the Spokane Convention Center, from 11:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Friday, May 2, and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, May 3, so watch for increased pedestrian traffic downtown on those days.

#### **Race Day**

Parking restrictions will be in place starting Sunday, May 4 at midnight. Streets near the start (downtown Spokane) and finish (Monroe Street Bridge) are closed beginning at 4:30 a.m. and reopen about 3 p.m. Other streets on the Bloomsday course begin closing at 7:30 a.m. and reopen after the final walkers pass. This could be as early as 1 p.m. for Riverside Ave. west of Monroe St., and as late as 3 p.m. for Broadway Ave. west of Monroe St.

Participants are encouraged to take Spokane Transit to the race. The bus pass can be purchased for \$2 at the STA booth at the Bloomsday Trade Show. There will be five express Bloomsday shuttles at Northtown Mall, Spokane Valley Mall, Ferris High School, Cheney/EWU, and West Planes Transit Center. # **BRIDGE WORK**

• The Maple Street Bridge will have lane restrictions Tuesday, May 6 – Friday, May 9, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Crews will be cleaning the bridge joints.

## **CRACK SEALING**

- Arterial Crack Sealing
  - Northwest Boulevard, Monroe to Maple Street

#### **GRIND AND OVERLAY WORK**

• Crews are working on a grind and overlay project on Havana Street between Hartson and 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. There will be lane restrictions and detours at times.

#### **POTHOLE CREWS**

• City crews continue to fill potholes as weather allows. If you see a pothole, report it by calling **3-1-1**. Potholes can also be reported online through <u>your MySpokane</u> <u>account</u>. Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

#### ADDITIONAL WORK

- Crews will be working on mud boils and utility cuts on 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Regal to Cook
  Street.
- Cleaning bridge structures throughout the City.

## WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

#### NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- The northbound curb lane of Greene Street between Augusta and Carlisle Avenue will have intermittent closures during the hours of 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. through Friday, May 9.
- Upriver Drive between Greene and Ralph Street will be one lane with flaggers from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. to accommodate overhead work.
- Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- The Spokane River is closed at the Greene Street Bridge.

This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.

#### **US 395 – HATCH ROAD TO HAMILTON PAVING**

- Work resumes in north Spokane on US 395 after it was suspended for winter. Temporary reduced speed limits of 45 mph are possible within the work zone.
- Starting Monday, May 5, contractor will begin crack sealing, guardrail repair and HMA testing in the northbound lanes near the Hatch Road interchange.
