Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

9TH AND PINE BOOSTER STATION

• 9th Avenue is closed to traffic between Cowley Street and Rockwood Boulevard. Access to the Providence employee parking lot and impacted driveways will be maintained.

This project will replace the out-of-service booster station with a modern facility.

This is a \$5.3 million project.

CYCLE 12 TRAFFIC CALMING

• This project is substantially complete.

Improvements include new sidewalks, bike lanes, curb extensions, traffic medians, and enhanced crosswalks.

This is a \$3 million project.

FRANCIS & ASSEMBLY WATER

- Phase 1 of this project is Monday, July 7, through Friday, Aug. 15. Here's what to expect:
 - A temporary traffic signal will be in place in all four directions at the intersection of Francis Ave. and Assembly St., rerouting and slowing traffic flows.
 - Assembly St. will be closed between Rowan Avenue and Francis Ave./Hwy 291. A
 detour utilizing Rowan Ave. and Driscoll Blvd. will be in place.
 - Access to the Dwight Merkel Complex will be available at Rowan Ave.
 - A noise variance is in place to allow work to be done between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

This is the first phase of a larger initiative to enhance water, sewer, stormwater, and traffic infrastructure in the Northwest Terrace area. Phase One involves installing a new water transmission main from the Low Water Pressure System to the NW Terrace Water Pressure System, improving domestic water reliability and supporting future growth.

This is a \$3.2 million project.

FREYA TRANSMISSION MAIN - GARLAND TO WELLESLEY

- Freya Street is closed between Garland and Wellesley Street. The detour is Euclid Avenue to Wellesley via Market Street.
- Paving is scheduled for Monday, July 7. The street will be closed during paving operations.

This project replaces an aging 30-inch steel water transmission main along Freya Street with a new 30-inch ductile iron main. Work also includes reconstructing the roadway, improving sidewalks, and installing stormwater management features.

This is a \$4.7 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

There are no impacts to the traveling public.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

LINCOLN STREET – SUMMIT TO SINTO PEDESTRIAN AND BIKE SAFETY

• Lincoln Street is closed between Boone and Sinto Avenue.

This project enhances bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure along Lincoln Street from Summit Parkway to Sinto Avenue. Improvements include buffered and protected bike lanes, widened sidewalks, a grind-and-overlay from Summit to Boone, and a new signal at Lincoln/Broadway.

This is a \$2.6 million project.

LOCAL ACCESS GRIND & OVERLAY

• Crews will start this project on Monday, July 7. Manolia Street will be closed between Pacific and Sprague Avenue.

Several streets will undergo grind and overlay (milling and resurfacing) in the upcoming construction season. These improvements target areas with deteriorated asphalt, enhancing ride quality and extending pavement life.

This is a \$1.5 million project.

MAXWELL AVENUE – PETTET TO WALNUT BIKE/PEDESTRIAN SAFETY UPGRADES

Crews are working near Maxwell Avenue and Pettet Drive.

This project enhances bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure along Maxwell Avenue from Pettet Drive to Walnut Street. Improvements include new sidewalks, buffered bike lanes, and crosswalk enhancements to better connect the West Central Neighborhood with A.M. Cannon Park, the West Central Community Center, and the Centennial Trail.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

PERRY STREET SEWER MAIN (19TH TO 18TH AVENUE)

• Perry Street is closed to traffic between 19th and 18th Avenue.

This project installs a new 8-inch sewer main and replaces an aging 8-inch cast iron water main along Perry Street, between 19th and 18th Avenues. Additional work includes replacing galvanized water service laterals with copper, reconstructing the roadway, and updating curbs, sidewalks, and driveways.

This is a \$396,000 project.

REHABILITATION OF CSO FACILITIES

• There are no impacts to the traveling public.

Rehabilitation of the following combined sewer overflow (CSO) tanks; CSO 10, CSO 34-2, and CSO 34-3.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

SCOTT ELEMENTARY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

• Hartson Avenue between Freya and Havana Street is open with flaggers on-site.

This project improves pedestrian safety around Scott Elementary by adding sidewalks, curb extensions (bumpouts), and enhanced crosswalks. Traffic-calming measures will slow vehicles along key streets, creating safer routes for students walking to and from school.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

SPOTTED ROAD BOOSTER STATION

• There are no traffic impacts.

Construction of a new water booster station for the Plains Pressure Zone.

This is a \$2 million project.

STEVENS ELEMENTARY WALK ROUTE

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - o Mission Avenue between Perry and Napa Street has lane reductions in place.
 - Sinto Avenue is closed between Madelia and Napa Street.
 - Napa Street between Mission and Sharp Avenue has lane reductions with flaggers on-site.

This project focuses on improving pedestrian safety around Stevens Elementary School by adding new crosswalks, sidewalks, and upgraded signals. Key features include a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) at Mission & Magnolia and a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) at Napa & Sinto, making walking routes safer for students.

This is a \$1.3 million project.

THORPE RESERVOIR (THORPE & TRAINOR RD)

• Work continues with no traffic impacts.

This project construct five MG ground level steel water reservoir.

This is a \$5.1 million project.

WASHINGTON-STEVENS GRIND & OVERLAY (3RD TO SPOKANE FALLS)

- Work on this project will resume Monday, July 7.
 - Crews will be working on Washington Street between Third Avenue and Spokane Falls Boulevard; at least one lane will remain open at all times.
 - Crews will be working on punchlist items on Stevens Street between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Third Avenue.

This project involves grinding and overlaying Washington St. and Stevens St. from Spokane Falls Blvd. to 3rd Ave.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The northbound lane of Flint Road will be closed between U.S. 2 and 12th Avenue and flagging at the intersection of Flint Road and U.S. 2 from 6/9/25 to 7/9/25 for Mastec North America work.
- The west curb lane of Maple Street will be closed between Cleveland and Fairview Avenue from 6/11/25 to 7/11/25 for TDS Metrocom work.
- The northbound curb lane of Alberta Street will be closed between Central and Decatur Avenue from 6/13/25 to 7/14/25 for TDS Metrocom work.
- Both curb lanes of Wellesley Avenue will be closed between Oak and Walnut Street with flaggers on-site from 6/16/25 to 7/16/25 for Mastec North America work.

 - o Flaggers at the intersection of Carlisle Avenue and Belt Street.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following areas from 3/25/25 to 7/23/25.
 - Westbound lane closure on Francis Avenue between Addison and Division Street.
 - Northbound lane closure on Division Street between Francis and Weile Avenue.
 - Southbound lane closure on Addison Street between Wiscomb Street and Francis Avenue.
 - o Eastbound lane closure on Lyons Avenue between Lidgerwood and Addison Street.
 - Westbound lane closure on Lincoln Road/Cascade Way between Standard Street and Calispel Lane.
- The eastbound lane of 27th Avenue will be closed between Southeast Boulevard and Mt. Vernon St. from 6/27/25 to 7/27/25 for Mastec North America work.
- Westbound lane closure on Northwest Boulevard between C and H Street from 3/31/25 to 7/29/25 for TDS Metrocom work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working at the following locations from 2/17/25 to 7/30/25.
 - The center lane of Alberta Street will be closed between Hoffman and Broad Avenue.
 - The center lane of Belt Street will be closed between Longfellow and Wellesley Avenue.
 - Both curb lanes of Wellesley Avenue will be closed between Belt and A Street with flaggers on-site.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 1/20/25 to 7/30/25.
 - The eastbound lane of Sharp Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Post and Howard Street.
 - The northbound curb lane of Lincoln Street/Post Place will be closed with flaggers on-site between Mallon and Spofford Avenue.
 - The center lane of Maxwell Avenue will be closed with flaggers on-site between Lincoln and Wall Street.
- NPL Construction Co. will be working at the following location from 6/30/25 to 7/31/25.
 - o Madelia Street will be closed between North Foothills Drive and Buckeye Avenue.
 - o Magnolia Street will be closed between North Foothills Drive and Fairview Avenue.
- The east curb lane of Stevens Street will be closed between Sprague and 4th Avenue from 6/26/25 to 8/1/25 for Palouse Power work.

- Both curb lanes of Monroe Street between Lacrosse and Longfellow Avenue will be closed from 7/2/25 to 8/2/25 for Mastec North America work.
- TDS Metrocom will be installing fiber in the areas of Oak Street, Maple Street, Ash Street, Walnut Street, Cedar Street, Adams Street, Jefferson Street, and Madison Street from Francis to Joseph Avenues from 4/7/25 to 8/2/25.

 - The westbound curb lane of Wellesley Avenue will be closed between Maple and Oak Street.
 - The west curb lane of Ash Street will be closed between Wabash and Princeton Avenue.
- LTS Managed Technical Services LLC will be working in the following areas 6/6/25 to 8/17/25.
 - Two southbound curb lanes of Division Street closed between Cozza Drive and Lyons Avenue.
 - Two northbound curb lanes of Division Street between Lyons and Weile Avenue.
 - o The eastbound curb lane of Lyons Avenue between Atlantic and Division Street.
- Post Street is closed between Riverside and Sprague Avenue from 1/6/25 to March 2026 for the Peyton Building remodel.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- The northbound curb lane of Greene Street between Augusta and Carlisle Avenue will remain closed 24/7 through August.
- Upriver Drive has reopened to traffic but will be flagged intermittently for work access and equipment movement. Travelers should anticipate delays between 6 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, through Friday, July 11.
- Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- The Spokane River is closed at the Greene Street Bridge.

This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR/SPOKANE RIVER TO COLUMBIA - PHASE 2

The contractor is awaiting permit approval to set the new sign bridge and electronic
message board over the North Spokane Corridor between the Wellesley and Freya
interchange. Tentative closure of the NSC is scheduled for Friday, July 11, through Sunday,
July 13. Alternative weekend for closure pending permit approval is Friday, July 18, to
Sunday, July 20.
