Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

9TH AND PINE BOOSTER STATION

- 9th Avenue is closed to traffic between Cowley Street and Rockwood Boulevard. Access to the Providence employee parking lot and impacted driveways will be maintained.

This project will replace the out-of-service booster station with a modern facility.

This is a \$5.3 million project.

FRANCIS & ASSEMBLY WATER

- Work is underway. Here is what to expect.
 - A temporary traffic signal is in place at the intersection of Francis Avenue and Assembly Street, rerouting and slowing traffic flows.
 - Assembly Street is closed between Rowan and Francis Avenues/Highway 291. A detour utilizing Rowan Avenue and Driscoll Boulevard is in place.
 - Access to the Dwight Merkel Complex is available at Rowan Avenue.
 - A noise variance is in place to allow work to be done between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

This is the first phase of a larger initiative to enhance water, sewer, stormwater, and traffic infrastructure in the Northwest Terrace area. Phase One involves installing a new water transmission main from the Low Water Pressure System to the NW Terrace Water Pressure System, improving domestic water reliability and supporting future growth.

This is a \$3.2 million project.

FREYA STREET WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT (21ST TO 13TH)

- Freya Street is closed between 13th and 21st Avenues. Motorists are detoured to Hartson Avenue to Ray Street, to 29th Avenue. Local access is being maintained.

This project replaces approximately 3,050 feet of 8-inch cast iron water main with a 12-inch ductile iron main. Work also includes roadway repairs (not full-width, just the half where the water main is being replaced), ADA-compliant curb ramps, and coordination with utilities to minimize service disruptions.

This is a \$3.7 million project.

FREYA TRANSMISSION MAIN – GARLAND TO WELLESLEY

- Paving is complete. Crews are working on landscaping.
- Freya Street is closed between Garland and Wellesley Avenues. The detour is Euclid Avenue to Wellesley Avenue via Market Street.

This project replaces an aging 30-inch steel water transmission main along Freya Street with a new 30-inch ductile iron main. Work also includes reconstructing the roadway, improving sidewalks, and installing stormwater management features.

This is a \$4.7 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

- There are no impacts to the traveling public.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

LINCOLN STREET – SUMMIT TO SINTO PEDESTRIAN AND BIKE SAFETY

- Lincoln Street is closed between Boone Avenue and the north side of Mallon Avenue. The Mallon intersection is open.

This project enhances bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure along Lincoln Street from Summit Parkway to Sinto Avenue. Improvements include buffered and protected bike lanes, widened sidewalks, a grind-and-overlay from Summit to Boone, and a new signal at Lincoln/Broadway.

This is a \$2.6 million project.

LOCAL ACCESS CHIP SEAL

- Crews are working at the following locations.
 - Wilding Drive from Standard Street to Lincoln Drive
 - Chestnut Street (various sections)
 - Augusta Avenue from Monroe to Howard Streets
 - Other segments as identified

Preparatory street maintenance work for chip seals at various locations.

This is an \$800,000 project.

LOCAL ACCESS GRIND & OVERLAY

- Crews are working on Sinto Avenue between Hamilton and Superior Streets.
- Crews are working on Queen Avenue between Crestline and Stone Streets.

Several streets will undergo grind and overlay (milling and resurfacing) in the upcoming construction season. These improvements target areas with deteriorated asphalt, enhancing ride quality and extending pavement life.

This is a \$1.5 million project.

MAPLE-WALNUT GRIND & OVERLAY - 5TH TO MAPLE STREET BRIDGE

- The curb lanes of Maple and Walnut Streets are closed between 2nd and 5th Avenues. Crews are installing ADA ramps, electrical, and storm upgrades.

This project rehabilitates Maple and Walnut Streets from 5th Avenue to the south approach of the Maple Street Bridge. Improvements include a grind and overlay of existing pavement, curb ramp upgrades to meet ADA standards, and a sidewalk widening near an overhead traffic sign pole on Maple Street.

This is a \$2 million project.

MAXWELL AVENUE – PETTET TO WALNUT BIKE/PEDESTRIAN SAFETY UPGRADES

- Elm Street is closed north and south of Maxwell Avenue. Maxwell Avenue is open.

This project enhances bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure along Maxwell Avenue from Pettet Drive to Walnut Street. Improvements include new sidewalks, buffered bike lanes, and crosswalk enhancements to better connect the West Central Neighborhood with A.M. Cannon Park, the West Central Community Center, and the Centennial Trail.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

PERRY STREET SEWER MAIN (19TH TO 18TH AVENUE)

- This project is complete.

This project installs a new 8-inch sewer main and replaces an aging 8-inch cast iron water main along Perry Street, between 19th and 18th Avenues. Additional work includes replacing galvanized water service laterals with copper, reconstructing the roadway, and updating curbs, sidewalks, and driveways.

This is a \$396,000 project.

REHABILITATION OF CSO FACILITIES

- There are no impacts to the traveling public. Crews are working at CSO 34-2 at Underhill Park.

Rehabilitation of the following combined sewer overflow (CSO) tanks; CSO 10, CSO 34-2, and CSO 34-3.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

SCOTT ELEMENTARY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

- This project is complete.

This project improves pedestrian safety around Scott Elementary by adding sidewalks, curb extensions (bumpouts), and enhanced crosswalks. Traffic-calming measures will slow vehicles along key streets, creating safer routes for students walking to and from school.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

SPOTTED ROAD BOOSTER STATION

- There are no traffic impacts.

Construction of a new water booster station for the Plains Pressure Zone.

This is a \$2 million project.

SPRAGUE & ALKI-BROADWAY - FREYA TO HAVANA GRIND AND OVERLAY

- Broadway Avenue/Alki Way from Havana Street to Freya Street is closed to traffic. Motorists are detoured at Sprague Avenue and Trent Avenue. Crews are working seven days a week, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.

This project rehabilitates portions of Sprague Avenue and Alki-Broadway Avenue with a 2-inch grind and overlay. It also includes ADA ramp upgrades and selected stormwater improvements, extending pavement life and enhancing road safety.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

STEVENS ELEMENTARY WALK ROUTE

- This project is substantially complete.

This project focuses on improving pedestrian safety around Stevens Elementary School by adding new crosswalks, sidewalks, and upgraded signals. Key features include a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) at Mission & Magnolia and a Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) at Napa & Sinto, making walking routes safer for students.

This is a \$1.3 million project.

WASHINGTON-STEVENS GRIND & OVERLAY (3RD TO SPOKANE FALLS)

- **Paving on Washington Street will happen OVERNIGHT Friday, Aug. 1.**
- Crews are working on Washington Street between 3rd Avenue and Spokane Falls Boulevard; at least one lane will remain open at all times.
- Crews are working on punchlist items on Stevens Street between Spokane Falls Boulevard and Third Avenue. There may be lane closures during work hours.

This project involves grinding and overlaying Washington St. and Stevens St. from Spokane Falls Blvd. to 3rd Ave.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

WELLESLEY AVENUE - MAPLE TO DIVISION CHIPSEAL

- Work is suspended to allow time for the chip seal to cure.

This pavement preservation project applies a chip seal along Wellesley Avenue from Maple Street to Division Street. Additional work includes crack sealing, minor pavement repairs, and limited ADA ramp installations to maintain and extend the roadway's service life.

This is a \$719,000 project.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Tower Falls sewer connection work was delayed. The intersection of W. Broadway Ave. and N. Lincoln St. will be fully 7/21/25 to 8/1/25.
- The east curb lane of Stevens Street will be closed between Sprague and 4th Avenue from 6/26/25 to 8/1/25 for Palouse Power work.
- LTS Managed Technical SRVS LLC will be performing fiber work requiring closures on traffic lanes in the following areas from 6/1/25 to 8/1/25.
 - Southbound lane closure on A Street between Lacrosse and Longfellow Avenue.
 - Northbound lane closure on G St between Garland and Princeton Avenue. Flagging at Garland Avenue and G Street.
 - Flagging during fiber crossing on Driscoll Boulevard between Rockwell and Lacrosse Avenue.
- Both curb lanes of Monroe Street between Lacrosse and Longfellow Avenue will be closed from 7/2/25 to 8/2/25 for Mastec North America work.
- TDS Metrocom will be installing fiber in the areas of Oak Street, Maple Street, Ash Street, Walnut Street, Cedar Street, Adams Street, Jefferson Street, and Madison Street from Francis to Joseph Avenues from 4/7/25 to 8/2/25.
- MJM Grand will be working at the following locations from 8/1/25 to 8/6/25.
 - Northbound Lincoln Street will be closed between Summit Parkway and Mallon Avenue.
 - Southbound Lincoln Street will have lane closures between Boone Avenue and Summit Parkway.
 - The intersection of Lincoln Street and Broadway Avenue will be closed.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following area from 6/9/25 to 8/7/25.
 - The westbound curb lane of Wellesley Avenue will be closed between Maple and Oak Street.
 - The west curb lane of Ash Street will be closed between Wabash and Princeton Avenue.
- Inch by Inch Excavating will be working in the following area from 7/21/25 to 8/11/25.
 - Complete Road Closure for Sewer Taps and Water Main Work, located on E Lyons Ave., between N Napa St. and N Crestline St.

- The west curb lane of Maple Street will be closed between Cleveland and Fairview Avenue from 6/11/25 to 8/11/25 for TDS Metrocom work.
- Northbound Lidgerwood Street will have a lane closure between Rowan and Sanson Avenue from 7/14/25 to 8/12/25 for Zero DB Communications work.
- Qwest Corporation will be installing fiber in the following areas from 7/31/25 to 8/13/25.
 - Regal Street between 44th and 46th Avenue will have alternating lane closures.
 - Eastbound 44th Avenue will have lane closures between Adirondack Lane and Fiske Street.
 - The right southbound turn lane on 44th Avenue between Adirondack Lane and Regal Street will be closed.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following locations from 7/14/25 to 8/14/25.
 - Eastbound Northwest Boulevard will have a lane closure between Alice Avenue and A Street.
 - Westbound Northwest Boulevard will have a lane closure between Alice Avenue and C Street.
- LTS Managed Technical Services LLC will be working in the following areas 6/6/25 to 8/17/25.
 - Two southbound curb lanes of Division Street closed between Cozza Drive and Lyons Avenue.
 - Two northbound curb lanes of Division Street between Lyons and Weile Avenue.
 - The eastbound curb lane of Lyons Avenue between Atlantic and Division Street.
- Southbound Geiger Boulevard will have lane restrictions between Garden Spring Road and Grove Road from 7/18/25 to 8/18/25 for Mastec North America work.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following locations from 6/18/25 to 8/18/25.
 - Northwest Boulevard will have an eastbound lane closure between Ash and Cedar Street.
 - Lane closure on Maple Street between Knox Avenue and Northwest Boulevard.
 - Lane closure on Ash Street between York and Mansfield Avenue.
 - Lane closure on northbound Belt Street between Montgomery and Carlisle Avenue.
 - Flaggers at the intersection of Carlisle Avenue and Belt Street.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following area from 7/21/25 to 8/19/25.
 - Flaggers for crossing streets when installing aerial fiber in alleys, between N Monroe St. and N Lincoln St., and N Lincoln St. and N Post St., from W Wabash Ave. to W Garland Ave.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following area from 7/21/25 to 8/19/25.
 - Flaggers and temporary road closures for crossing streets when installing aerial fiber in alleys, between N Madison St. and N Monroe St., N Monroe St. and N Lincoln St., and N Lincoln St. and N Post St. from W Central Ave. to W Wabash Ave.

- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following area from 7/21/25 to 8/19/25
 - Flaggers for crossing streets when installing aerial fiber in alleys, between N Ash St. and N Maple St., N Maple St. and N Walnut St., N Walnut St. and N Cedar St., and N Cedar St. and N Hawthorne St., from W Wabash Ave. to W Garland Ave.
- TDS Metrocom will be working in the following area from 7/21/25 to 8/19/25.
 - Flaggers for crossing streets when installing aerial fiber in alleys, between N Hawthorne St. and N Adams St., N Adams St. and N Jefferson St., from W Wellesley Ave. to W Garland Ave., and boring on N Princeton St.
- Mastec North America will be working in the following area from 7/21/25 to 8/21/25.
 - Right northbound lane closure to overlash fiber on S Cowley St. between E Hartson Ave. and E 4th Ave.
 - Right eastbound lane closure on E 4th/5th Ave. between S Cowley St. and S Sherman St.
- Mastec North America will be working in the following areas from 7/21/25 to 8/21/25.
 - Lane closure to overlash fiber on right lane eastbound E Holland Ave between U.S. Hwy 2 and N Hoerner Dr.
 - Flaggers at intersection of N Hoerner Dr. and E Holland Ave.
 - Right northbound lane closure on N Hoerner Dr. between N Colton St. and E Holland Ave.
 - Right westbound Lane closure on E Holland Ave. between N Dakota St. and N Colton St.
- Mastec North America will be working in the following area from 7/21/25 to 8/21/25.
 - Sidewalk, alley, and lane closure to tie in fiber optic on the easternmost lane of N Maple St between W Dean Ave and W Sinto Ave.
 - Flaggers at the intersection of N Maple St and W Boone Ave.
 - Alley closure behind W Gardner Ave between N Maple St and N Walnut St.
- Mastec North America will be performing fiber work in the following areas from 7/24/25 to 8/25/25.
 - The two easternmost lanes of Maple Street will be closed between Dean and Boone Avenue.
 - The two westernmost lanes of Ash Street will be closed between Sharp and Dean Avenue.
- North Sky Communications LLC will be working in the following areas from 7/7/25 to 8/29/25.
 - Alternating lane closures on Trent Avenue between Friske Street and Freya Way.
 - Alternating lane closures on Mission Avenue between Friske Street and Thor Court.
- Post Street is closed between Riverside and Sprague Avenue from 1/6/25 to March 2026 for the Peyton Building remodel.

WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT

LINCOLN STREET, 19TH TO 29TH AVENUE

Wastewater crews are rehabilitating swale plantings along Lincoln Street between 19th Avenue and 29th Avenue. Flaggers are on-site to direct vehicle traffic when necessary. Traffic delays can be expected when flagging is necessary. Alternate routes include High Drive and Bernard Street.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- On Friday, Aug. 1, 6 a.m. to 7 p.m., southbound Greene Street just south of the Spokane River will be reduced to a single lane. Contractor crews will be saw-cutting so they can begin installing new drainage pipes and manhole covers across the roadway.
- Starting on Monday, Aug. 4, there will be a full closure of southbound Greene Street between Illinois and Mission Avenues to install drainage pipes and manhole covers. The closure will last one week, with southbound Greene Street reopening on Monday, Aug. 11. A signed detour will be in place via Illinois Avenue, to southbound Perry Street, then east on Mission Avenue. Drivers will then rejoin Greene Street. Drivers who use Upriver Drive will follow it west until Perry Street, where they will follow the detour to Mission Avenue.
- Riverton Avenue between Ermina Avenue and Fiske Street is closed.
- The Spokane River is closed at the Greene Street Bridge.
- Upriver Drive will be reduced to one lane during the day with flaggers from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Carlisle Avenue between Greene and Ralph Streets is closed until Friday, Aug. 15.

This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carlisle Avenue to the north of the river.
