Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

9TH AND PINE BOOSTER STATION

• 9th Avenue is closed to traffic between Cowley Street and Rockwood Boulevard. Access to the Providence employee parking lot and impacted driveways will be maintained.

This project will replace the out-of-service booster station with a modern facility.

This is a \$5.3 million project.

FRANCIS & ASSEMBLY WATER

- Work is on hold; this project is experiencing delays.
- Work is underway. Here is what to expect.
 - 9 Mile Road has southbound curb lane restrictions from Royal Drive heading south.
 - Lyons Avenue, Woodside Avenue, and Rifle Club Road will have some closures during this work.
 - Access to the Dwight Merkel Complex is available at Rowan Avenue.
 - A noise variance is in place to allow work to be done between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

This is the first phase of a larger initiative to enhance water, sewer, stormwater, and traffic infrastructure in the Northwest Terrace area. Phase One involves installing a new water transmission main from the Low Water Pressure System to the NW Terrace Water Pressure System, improving domestic water reliability and supporting future growth.

This is a \$3.2 million project.

FREYA STREET WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT (21ST TO 13TH)

• Freya Street is closed between 21st and 13th Avenues. Motorists are detoured to Hartson Avenue to Ray Street, to 29th Avenue. Local access is being maintained.

This project replaces approximately 3,050 feet of 8-inch cast iron water main with a 12-inch ductile iron main. Work also includes roadway repairs (not full-width, just the half where the water main is being replaced), ADA-compliant curb ramps, and coordination with utilities to minimize service disruptions.

This is a \$3.7 million project.

HIGH SYSTEM WATER TANK

• There are no impacts to the traveling public.

This project will construct a 2-million-gallon elevated steel and concrete water reservoir on the Hamblen Elementary property just south of Hamblen Park.

This is a \$9.8 million project.

LINCOLN STREET - SUMMIT TO SINTO PEDESTRIAN AND BIKE SAFETY

- Lincoln Street is closed between Boone and Mallon Avenues. The intersection of Lincoln Street and Mallon Avenue is closed.
- Starting work south of Broadway Avenue on Tuesday, Sept. 2, closing the west curb lane.
 Traffic shift on the east side of Lincoln Street for two-way traffic between Summit and Broadway Avenues.

This project enhances bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure along Lincoln Street from Summit Parkway to Sinto Avenue. Improvements include buffered and protected bike lanes, widened sidewalks, a grind-and-overlay from Summit to Boone, and a new signal at Lincoln/Broadway.

This is a \$2.6 million project.

LOCAL ACCESS CHIP SEAL

- Crews are working at the following locations. Work will wrap up next week!
 - Wilding Drive from Standard Street to Lincoln Drive
 - Chestnut Street (various sections)
 - Augusta Avenue from Monroe to Howard Streets
 - o Other segments as identified

Preparatory street maintenance work for chip seals at various locations.

This is an \$800,000 project.

LOCAL ACCESS GRIND & OVERLAY

- Work is on hold; this project is experiencing delays.
- Crews are beginning work on Upton Avenue between Nettleton and A Streets.

Several streets will undergo grind and overlay (milling and resurfacing) in the upcoming construction season. These improvements target areas with deteriorated asphalt, enhancing ride quality and extending pavement life.

This is a \$1.5 million project.

MAPLE-WALNUT GRIND & OVERLAY - 5TH TO MAPLE STREET BRIDGE

- Work is on hold; this project is experiencing delays.
- The curb lanes of Maple and Walnut Streets are closed between 2nd and 5th Avenues.
 Crews are installing ADA ramps, electrical, and storm upgrades.

This project rehabilitates Maple and Walnut Streets from 5th Avenue to the south approach of the Maple Street Bridge. Improvements include a grind and overlay of existing pavement, curb ramp upgrades to meet ADA standards, and a sidewalk widening near an overhead traffic sign pole on Maple Street.

This is a \$2 million project.

MAXWELL AVENUE – PETTET TO WALNUT BIKE/PEDESTRIAN SAFETY UPGRADES

- Elm Street is closed north and south of Maxwell Avenue. Maxwell Avenue is open.
- Maxwell Avenue is closed from Elm to Walnut Streets. This includes the block between
 the Ash St. and Maple St. arterials. Motorists are detoured at Maple Street and Indiana
 Avenue to get back to Ash Street and detoured at Boone Avenue and Ash Street to get
 back to Maple Street.
- Southbound Ash Street is reduced to two lanes beginning at Spofford Avenue.
- Southbound Ash Street is reduced to two lanes beginning at Augusta Avenue and one lane beginning at about Spofford Avenue until Friday, Aug. 29, for City stormwater system work.

This project enhances bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure along Maxwell Avenue from Pettet Drive to Walnut Street. Improvements include new sidewalks, buffered bike lanes, and crosswalk enhancements to better connect the West Central Neighborhood with A.M. Cannon Park, the West Central Community Center, and the Centennial Trail.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

REHABILITATION OF CSO FACILITIES

- There are no impacts to the traveling public. Crews are working at CSO 34-2 at Underhill Park. The Underhill Park parking lot is closed for this work.
- Crews are working on CSO 34-3 on Ray Street between 20th and 21st Avenues. There are no impacts to the traveling public.

Rehabilitation of the following combined sewer overflow (CSO) tanks; CSO 10, CSO 34-2, and CSO 34-3.

This is a \$1.2 million project.

ROCKWOOD BOULEVARD GRIND AND OVERLAY (GRAND BLVD. TO COWLEY ST.)

- Work on this project will start Tuesday, Sept. 2.
 - o 10th Avenue and Sumner Avenue will be closed.
 - Rockwood Boulevard will have lane restrictions.
 - o 9th Avenue will temporarily become a two-way street.

This project provides a 2-inch grind and overlay along Rockwood Boulevard, from Grand Boulevard to Cowley Street, and redesigns the Rockwood/Cowley & 10th Avenue intersection. It also replaces outdated water mains, a crushed sewer main segment, and brick catch basins within the project limits.

This is a \$640,000 project.

SPOTTED ROAD BOOSTER STATION

There are no traffic impacts.

Construction of a new water booster station for the Plains Pressure Zone.

This is a \$2 million project.

SPRAGUE & ALKI-BROADWAY - FREYA TO HAVANA GRIND AND OVERLAY

- Work is on hold; this project is experiencing delays.
- Broadway Avenue/Alki Way from Havana to Freya Streets is closed to traffic. Motorists
 are detoured at Sprague Avenue and Trent Avenue. Crews are working seven days a week,
 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.

This project rehabilitates portions of Sprague Avenue and Alki-Broadway Avenue with a 2-inch grind and overlay. It also includes ADA ramp upgrades and selected stormwater improvements, extending pavement life and enhancing road safety.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

WASHINGTON-STEVENS GRIND & OVERLAY (3RD TO SPOKANE FALLS)

Mostly complete. May be some intermittent lane reductions.

This project involves grinding and overlaying Washington St. and Stevens St. from Spokane Falls Blvd. to 3rd Ave.

This is a \$1.9 million project.

WELLESLEY AVENUE - MAPLE TO DIVISION CHIPSEAL

 Wellesley Avenue will have lane closures in both directions between Division and Maple Streets for fog seal application, striping, and marking work. Motorists can expect lane closures and obstructions all week.

This pavement preservation project applies a chip seal along Wellesley Avenue from Maple Street to Division Street. Additional work includes crack sealing, minor pavement repairs, and limited ADA ramp installations to maintain and extend the roadway's service life.

This is a \$719,000 project.

- Lyons Avenue will be closed between Nevada and Crestline Streets from 7/21/25 to 9/8/25 for Inch by Inch Excavating work.
