*Projects highlighted in **RED** have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.*

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

3RD AVENUE AND WASHINGTON AND STEVENS STREETS CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS

- Construction begins Monday, May 4. Here is what to expect.
 - 3rd Avenue will be reduced to two lanes between Howard and Bernard Streets.
 - Washington Street will be reduced to two lanes between 5th and 2nd Avenues.

The proposed project will include curb-to-curb pavement grind and overlay, as well as replacement of ADA ramps where needed, and replace the aging water distribution main between Stevens and Washington Streets.

This is a \$1.1 million project.

9TH AND PINE BOOSTER STATION

- There are no street closures. However, construction vehicles use 9th Avenue to access the off-street construction site for the remainder of the construction.

This project will replace the out-of-service booster station with a modern facility.

This is a \$5.3 million project.

ARTERIAL PEDESTRIAN HYBRID BEACONS

- Construction begins Monday, May 4. Crews will be working in the following areas.
 - Market Street and Columbia Avenue – Market Street will be closed between Central and Joseph Avenues. The street will reopen on Monday, June 1.
 - Nevada Street and Cozza Drive – Cozza Drive will be closed between Cincinnati and Standard Streets. The street will reopen on Tuesday, May 5.
 - Whistalks Way and Randolph Road – Whistalks Way will be closed between Eliot Drive and River Ridge Boulevard. The street will reopen on Thursday, May 7.
 - Regal Street and Thurston Avenue – Regal Street will be closed between 39th and 42nd Avenues. The street will reopen on Wednesday, May 6.

This project enhances pedestrian safety by installing four Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons (PHBs) on busy arterials. It also includes sidewalk upgrades, bike lanes, and improved pedestrian facilities to encourage safer, more accessible travel.

This is a \$1.5 million project.

SPOTTED ROAD BOOSTER STATION

- There are no traffic impacts.

Construction of a new water booster station for the Plains Pressure Zone.

This is a \$2 million project.

SPRAGUE & ALKI-BROADWAY - FREYA TO HAVANA GRIND AND OVERLAY

- Sprague Avenue is reduced to one lane in each direction between Havana and Freya Streets.

This project rehabilitates portions of Sprague Avenue and Alki-Broadway Avenue. It also includes a water main replacement, ADA ramp upgrades, and selected stormwater improvements.

This is a \$3 million project.

US 195 MEADOWLANE J-TURN

- US 195 has northbound and southbound lane restrictions between Cheney Spokane Road and Hatch Road.

This project will reconstruct the intersection of US 195 and Meadowlane Road to include a J-turn, along with acceleration and deceleration lanes. These upgrades aim to enhance safety and reduce congestion during peak hours, while also preparing for future growth in the area.

This is a \$2.4 million project.

WELLESLEY - FREYA TO HAVANA RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT

- Wellesley Avenue is closed between Havana and Freya Streets.

Full reconstruction of Wellesley from Freya to Havana (35-ft., 3-lanes), including stormwater improvements, street trees, and replacing the water distribution main, and a shared use path on the south side of the street.

This is a \$4.5 million project.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- The intersection of Freya Street and Palouse Highway will be closed from 4/6/26 to 5/1/26 for the construction of the Moody Townhomes.
- Mastec North America will be working at the following locations from 4/2/26 to 5/2/26.
 - The northbound curb lane of U.S. 2 will be closed between Holland and Hoerner Avenues.
 - U.S. 2 will have a center lane closure between Westview and Hoerner Avenues.

 - Southbound lane closure on Washington Street between Boone and Cataldo Avenues.
 - Eastbound lane closure on Cataldo Avenue between Washington and Normandie Streets.
- The two westernmost lanes of Walnut Street will be closed between 7th and 5th Avenues from 4/27/26 to 5/8/26 for Halme Cascade work.
- Belt Street will have lane closures with flaggers between Sinto and Boone Avenues from 3/10/26 to 5/8/26 for TDS Metrocom work.

- TDS Metrocom LLC will be working at the following locations from 4/10/26 to 5/9/26.
 - Monroe Street will have northbound and southbound lane closures between Broadway Avenue and Summit Parkway.
 - West curb lane of Maple Street closed between Mallon and Gardner Avenues.
 - Westbound curb lane of Boone Avenue closed between Adams and Walnut Streets.
 - Westbound lane closure on Broadway Avenue between Adams and Walnut Streets.
- TDS Metrocom LLC will be working at the following locations from 2/9/26 to 5/9/26.
 - Ash Street between Gardner and Dean Avenues will have intermittent lane closures with flaggers on-site.
 - Maple Street between Boone and Dean Avenues will have intermittent lane closures with flaggers on-site.
- Ash Street will have intermittent lane closures with flaggers on-site between Augusta and Maxwell Avenue from 2/11/26 to 5/11/26 for TDS Metrocom work.
- Thor Street will have intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures between Hartson and 11th Avenues from 2/2/26 to 5/11/26 for Ziplly Fiber Pacific work.
- The south curb lane of 3rd Avenue will be closed between Regal and Ray Streets from 4/29/26 to 5/12/26 for Cascade Cable work.
- Ziplly Fiber Pacific will be working at the following locations from 4/14/26 to 5/13/26.
 - Thor Street between 8th and 9th will have a temporary closure with flaggers for an aerial fiber crossing.
 - Northbound and southbound lane closures on Thor Street between Hartson and 11th Avenues.
 - Freya Street between Hartson and 8th Avenues will have a temporary closure with flaggers for an aerial fiber crossing.
 - Hartson Avenue between Thor and Freya Streets will have a temporary closure with flaggers for an aerial fiber crossing.
- The northbound curb lane of Havana Street will be closed between Main and Broadway Avenues from 4/13/26 to 5/13/26 for Mastec North America work.
- 27th Avenue will have westbound lane closures between Mt. Vernon Street and Southeast Boulevard from 4/13/26 to 5/13/26 for Mastec North America work.
- The westbound curb lane of Sunset Highway will be closed between Windsor Drive and the U.S. 2 on-ramp from 4/13/26 to 5/13/26 for Mastec North America work.
- Market Street between Francis and Bismark Avenues will have northbound and southbound lane closures from 4/13/26 to 5/13/26 for NPL Construction work.

 - Division Street will have northbound and southbound lane closures between Weile Avenue and Cascade Way.

Bloomsday is Sunday, May 3, the race day map can be found [here](#). Drivers are asked to slow down and be aware of extra pedestrians in the downtown area all weekend.

Bloomsday Check-In/Package Pickup

Bloomsday check-in/package pick-up and tradeshow will be at the Spokane Convention Center, from 11:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Friday, May 1, and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, May 2, so watch for increased pedestrian traffic downtown on those days.

Race Day

Parking restrictions will be in place starting Sunday, May 3, at midnight. Streets near the start (downtown Spokane) and finish (Monroe Street Bridge) are closed beginning at 4:30 a.m. and reopen about 3 p.m. Other streets on the Bloomsday course begin closing at 7:30 a.m. and reopen after the final walkers pass. This could be as early as 1 p.m. for Riverside Ave. west of Monroe St., and as late as 3 p.m. for Broadway Ave. west of Monroe St. Access to Northern Quest Resort & Casino, Airway Heights and Fairchild Air Force Base via Government Way and/or Whistlers Way is closed from about 6:30 a.m. to about 1 p.m.

Participants are encouraged to take Spokane Transit to the race. A bus pass can be purchased for \$2 at the STA booth at the Bloomsday Tradeshow. There will be five express Bloomsday shuttles at Northtown Mall, Spokane Valley Mall, Ferris High School, Cheney/Red Barn, and West Plains Transit Center. Details [here](#).

For those not participating, travel through downtown will be available on Ash, Maple, Division/Browne, and Hamilton Streets, which remain open all day on Bloomsday.

- Crews are working on a grind and overlay project on Geiger Boulevard between Lawton and Sunset Boulevard. There will be lane closures and temporary closures when paving.

WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT

Perry Street, 11th to 17th Avenues

- The City's Wastewater Department is upgrading storm drains on Perry Street from 11th to 17th Avenues. **Northbound Perry Street is closed between 11th and 17th Avenues. Traffic is detoured at 18th Avenue to Sherman Street to 5th Avenue.** This work is expected to be completed by Friday, May 15.

WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (WSDOT)

NORTH SPOKANE CORRIDOR-US 395/NSC SPOKANE RIVER CROSSING

- The following streets are closed for work.
 - Ralph Street is closed between Fairview Avenue and Upriver Drive.
 - Carlisle Avenue is closed between Greene and Ralph Streets.
 - Upriver Drive is closed at Ralph Street.
- The Spokane River is closed at the Greene Street Bridge.

This project will construct the North Spokane Corridor bridge that will cross the Spokane River and connect the skyway portion near Spokane Community College to the south and at Carslie Avenue to the north of the river.

I-90 PAVEMENT PATCHING

- **Wednesday, May 6, WSDOT crews will be pavement patching on I-90. The westbound right lane of I-90 will be closed between MP 278.18 and 277.36; this area is the top of Sunset Hill.**
