



Traffic Signs: VEGETATION & TRAFFIC SAFETY

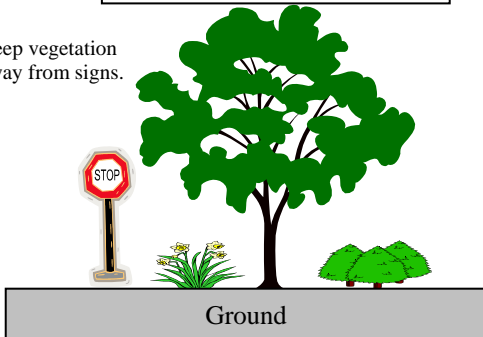
Keeping Our Streets Safe:

Overgrown vegetation impedes the safe flow of traffic when it blocks our view of traffic signs or the right of way. If vegetation is blocking the visibility of a nearby traffic sign or is growing into the right of way, it is your responsibility as the adjacent property owner or resident to trim the vegetation. Below are the City vegetation standards as they apply to traffic signs and right of ways.

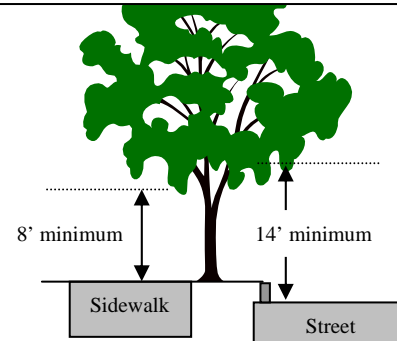


Vegetation Near Traffic Signs

Traffic Sign and Signal Visibility:

	Description of Existing Vegetation	Vegetation Requirements	Reference in City Codes
1.	Vegetation blocking clear view of traffic sign or creating safety concern.	Remove all branches/vegetation interfering with authorized traffic signs or creates other identified traffic or safety concerns.	12.02.912
2.	Tree branches and any vegetation overhanging street.	Remove all branches/vegetation existing from street level to a minimum height of 14 feet.	12.02.0202
3.	Tree branches and any vegetation overhanging sidewalk.	Remove all branches/vegetation existing from sidewalk level to a minimum height of 8 feet.	12.02.0202
