

Recycling needs be clean, dry & loose. No plastic bags in recycling or yard waste carts. All carts need to be out before 6 a.m. on collection day. Remove all carts after collection by 9 p.m. Leave 3 feet between carts and other obstacles. Do not put carts under garage eaves or basketball hoops.

Batteries, even if they are old and used, can spark and explode if damaged. VIINA

Batteries cause fires in garbage trucks and at transfer stations. It is costly to clean up after battery fires. These types of fires also are difficult to fight and put firefighters at risk.

- Store your used batteries in a plastic bag or container. Be sure to keep it out of reach of children and pets.
- City of Spokane residents can put batteries in a clear, plastic bag and place on the lid of their blue bin.
- Look up battery drop off locations online using the Spokane Waste Directory.
